#### ALBANY WINS WOMEN'S ECAC DIVISION II TRACK CHAMPIONSHIP

New Haven, Conn. -- Janna Johnston (Shenendehowa H.S.) set a school-record in the pentathlon and Andrea Viger (Granville Central H.S.) won the 5,000-meter run to lead Albany to the ECAC Division II women's indoor track and field championship on Sunday at Southern Connecticut State University's Moore Field House.

Johnston scored 3,452 points in the five-event pentathlon competition, and also was third in the high jump. Viger, a junior, went 18:04.53 to finish first in the 5,000 by nearly two seconds over Kutztown's Megan Seefeldt. The Great Danes outpointed runner-up Kutztown, 128 to 95.5., in the team standings.

Xiomara Davila Diaz captured an ECAC title in the 55-meter hurdles in 8.02 seconds, and placed second in the 400-dash. Tara Bialy was also a winner in the 55-dash (7.21).

In the men's competition, Albany was fourth overall behind ECAC champion Kutztown. Andy Rickert (Guilderland) took second in the 5,000 (15:32.43), while Rob Naughter (Guilderland) went 2:31.59 in the 1,000 to finish third. Albany's 800-meter relay was first across the line in 1:33.27, while Tony Davidson and Brendan Howell picked up a pair of second-place finishes in the 400 and 3,000, respectively.

WILL BRAND NAMED NECC ROOKIE OF THE YEAR Cetnar and Brand Chosen to All-Conference Team

New Haven, Conn. -- University at Albany's Will Brand has been selected as the 1999 New England Collegiate Conference Rookie of the Year in men's basketball as voted by the NECC's head coaches. Brand and Todd Cetnar (Amsterdam H.S.) were chosen to the all-conference second-team.

Brand, a 6-foot-4 forward from Richmond Heights, Ohio, ranked seventh among the conference's scoring leaders at 15.0 points per game, and was eighth in rebounding (6.5 pg). His season total of 406 points was the most by an Albany freshman since Gary Holway in 1955-56.

Brand, who scored in double figures in 22 of 27 games played, was chosen NECC Rookie of the Week on four occasions.

Cetnar, a junior point guard, was fourth among NECC's top scorers at 16.1 points per game. He was also ranked in the conference's top 10 in free throw percentage (.833), assists (3.9 pg) and steals (1.7 pg). Cetnar's 418 points this season were the highest total by a Great Dane guard in 11 years.

#### **BUCHANAN AND PAOLINO EARN ALL-CONFERENCE ACCOLADES**

New Haven, Conn. -- Albany's Megan Buchanan has been chosen to the All-New England Collegiate Conference second-team in women's basketball. Kelly Paolino (Schalmont H.S.) was tabbed as an honorable mention selection by the conference's coaches.

Buchanan, a 5-foot-11 junior, led the Great Danes in scoring (15.0 ppg), and averaged 5.0 rebounds. She reached double figures 17 times this season, and netted a career-high 33, the second-best single-game total in Albany annals, against Bridgeport in January.
