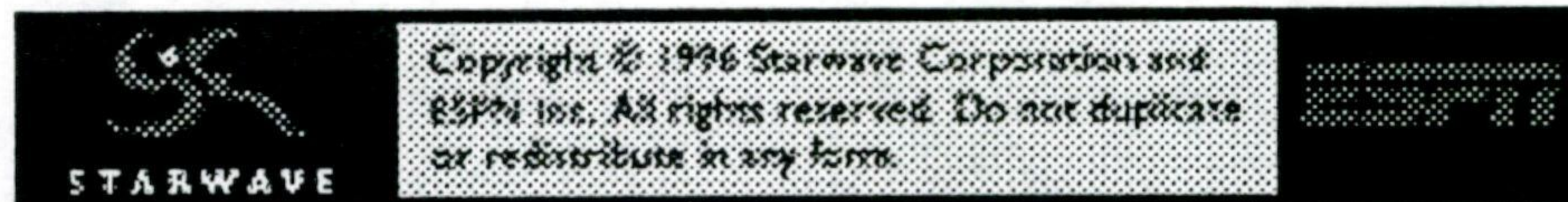

### Comments: WILLIAMS QUALIFIES FOR U.S. OLYMPIC LONG JUMP FINAL

Atlanta, Ga. -- Shana Williams, an academic advisor for athletics and assistant track coach at the University at Albany, won Friday's qualifying round in the women's long jump at the U.S. Olympic track and field trials. Williams and eleven other athletes, including Jackie Joyner-Kersey, will battle for a berth on the Olympic team in Sunday's final (WNYT-TV, 2-6 p.m.).

Williams, who took a leave of absence during the 1995-96 academic year from her positions at Albany to train for the Olympics in Eugene, Oregon, posted the third best jump (23-0) by an American in her only qualifying attempt. Kersey, who was second in the qualifying round with a mark of 22-9.25, holds the all-time U.S. record (23-8.25), while Carol Lewis jumped 23-1.

Williams, 24, won her first national title at the U.S. Indoor Championships in Atlanta in early March with a PR performance of 22-3.25. In May, she won the Prefontaine Classic in Eugene with an outdoor PR of 22-5. Williams has trained in Eugene under the guidance of Ela Krzesinski, a gold medalist in the long jump for Poland in the 1956 Olympic Games.

A native of Bridgeton, N.J., Williams was a seven-time all-American at Seton Hall University in the long jump, heptathlon and 1,600-meter relay events. She competed in the heptathlon at the 1993 World University Games, 1992 Olympic Trials and at two U.S. Olympic Festivals.

As Albany's assistant track coach under Roberto Vives in 1994-95, Williams tutored Kimberly Toone, who qualified for the NCAA Division II indoor championships in both the long jump (19-2) and 55-meter hurdles before her tragic death in an auto accident last March 6.
