

Minutes of Meeting held Wednesday, March 28th, 1906, at 3.30 P. M.

The meeting came to order promptly in the office of the Commissioner of Education, Commissioner Draper in the chair, all members present, and also President Milne by invitation.

The minutes of the two previous meetings were approved as read.

Commissioner Draper stated that there was no pressing business on hand, but he wished the committee to be informed that our appropriation bill had passed both Houses and gone to the Governor for his signature. The latter had asked Assemblyman Mead to have the bill recalled so as to give him more time to consider the matter. There was no good reason to believe that he would ultimately withhold his approval.

Commissioner Draper then showed several rough sketches, submitted by the State Architect, to be examined and discussed by the committee. After the committee had looked them over, Mr. Cogswell moved that Commissioner Draper, Mr. Pruyn, and Mr. Van Rensselaer be appointed a committee of three on plans for the new building. The motion was carried.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
