It was ordered that Mr. Lake officiate as Superintendent of the Study room during the next year at a salary of One hundred dollars.

The Principal stated that owing to the illness of Miss Butler for several weeks on the first part of the term, he had been under the necessity of employing addition assistance in the instruction of the School and that for such

Instruction an expense of forty dollars had been incurred.

The Treasurer was directed to pay that sum.

The Treasurer was also directed to pay for the diplomas on parchment to the graduates.

It was resolved that in view of the large increase in some of the classes of the School that an additional tutor be employed, and the Principal was requested to recommend a graduate whom he may deem suitable for the situation.

The Secretary submitted a communication from Jacob Scraggs Esq., dated Hugynes Ohio, appealing from the action of the Faculty in declining to recommend his sister in law, Miss Jane B. Walwork, a member of the last Senior Class to the Executive Committee, for graduation. The communication was read, and laid on the table until the next meeting of the committee, at which the Secretary was directed to ask the attendance of Prof. Cochran the Principal the meeting to be called by the chairman.
