The supply bill also appropriated the sum of seven thousand dollars for the current year.

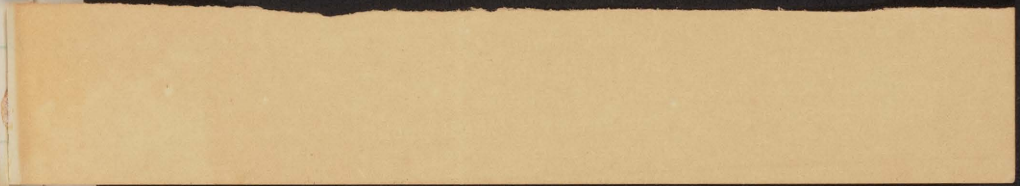

on motion the resignation was accepted and the following resolution unanimously adopted.

Resolved, That the Executive Committee receive with regret the resignation of Miss Ellen Bishop; that they certify to the great value of her services from September eleventh 1848 to May twenty-seventh 1887, as assistant in the Model School, and from September 1882, as teacher of elocution; and they extend to her their cordial wishes for her success and happiness; and that the secretary of the Committee send to Miss Bishop a copy of this minute.

Mrs. Margaret Sullivan Mooney, a graduate of the school in 1861 was appointed on the nomination of the President to perform the duties of the position for the last month of the present term at a remuneration of seventy dollars.

On the nomination of the President, Mrs. Margaret Sullivan Mooney was appointed teacher of elocution at a annual salary of seven hundred dollars; with the understanding

that if satisfactory in her services, that her salary shall be made eight hundred dollars the second year, and nine hundred dollars each year thereafter.

✓ The president reported that Miss Anna E. Peice had been appointed secretary and substitute teacher; but that the necessities of the school had made it necessary to employ Miss Peice in addition to her proper duties, in teaching full hours for half the term. On motion it was resolved, that for this extra service she be paid one hundred dollars at the close of the present term.

✓ On motion of Mr. Murray it was resolved that the President be authorized to expend what was necessary in re-  
 ✓ pairing the building including the change of the present teachers' room to the story below, and the getting up of the present teachers' room for an additional class room; the expense to be incurred by the President not to exceed two hundred & fifty dollars.



The secretary reported to the Committee that under authority conferred by a resolution adopted by the Committee he had issued a duplicate diploma to Andrew J. Stevens of Cheney territory who was graduated from the school in 1846, and who had lost his original diploma.
