UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY WOMEN'S BASKETBALL SQUAD TRAVELS TO ITALY Summer Trip To Prepare Program For Division I Transition

ALBANY, N.Y. -- The University at Albany women's basketball program will voyage to Rome, Italy next week as part of a summer Italian training session to help prepare the squad for their upcoming season. In the seven-day trip, Albany will face two European teams including Santa Marinella on Tuesday, Aug. 10 and Caserta on Friday, Aug. 13. The Great Danes are traveling overseas for the first time since 1994, a year before they made the transition to Division II.

Albany moves its entire 19-sport intercollegiate athletics program for men and women to the NCAA Division I level, effective in 1999-2000. Head Coach **Mari Warner**, who is entering her 18th season at Albany, hopes the trip will be a positive experience and ready her program for the rigors of Division I competition.

"This trip will give us an early baptism to Division I basketball," says Warner. "We are hoping for some difficult games that will improve our team in the long run. In addition, we get an early look at our squad and see how much work we have ahead of us in the coming months."

This year's squad returns eight letterwinners. Senior **Megan Buchanan** (15.2 ppg, 5.2 rpg), a second-team all-conference choice last winter, junior **Liz Tucker** (10.3 ppg, 6.7 rpg) and senior **Melissa Schoonover** (7.5 ppg, 5.9 rpg) were all regulars in the lineup. The Great Danes earned an ECAC post-season tournament berth in their last Division II campaign.

The squad will fly out of New York's John F. Kennedy International Airport on Sunday and return to Albany on Aug. 15. The tour features planned trips to Tivoli Gardens, the Pantheon, the Colosseum, the Vatican Museum, the Sistine Chapel and the city of Pompeii.

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY HITS FOOTBALL PRACTICE FIELD ON MONDAY Great Danes Prepare For Their First NCAA Division I-AA Campaign

ALBANY, N.Y. -- The University at Albany football team prepares for its inaugural season at the NCAA Division I-AA level with the first practices on Monday, August 16. Double sessions are scheduled for 9:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Newcomers report to campus on Sat., Aug. 14, while upperclassmen arrive the following day.

Albany moves to Division I-AA and the Northeast Conference in 1999. The Great Danes ended their brief run in Division II with a second consecutive Eastern Football Conference championship, an EFC Atlantic Division title, and a 10-1 record. Bob Ford, a two-time Football Gazette Division II non-scholarship national coach of the year, has guided Albany from the club level in the early 1970s to this point in the program's history. Ford has eight starters on offense and three regulars on defense returning.

Albany's multiple-formation offense returns a veteran cast. Seniors Eric Williams and Michael Oliva complement each other in a two-quarterback system. Williams passed for 1,339 yards and 14 touchdowns, while Oliva, the EFC championship MVP, added 10 TD passes. Tailback Greg Garrett, who has 2,233 career yards and 20 rushing TDs, has his sights set on becoming the school's all-time ground gainer. Right tackle ■Jason Barra (6-5, 275) and left guard Billy Van Jura (6-1, 280) each earned All-America recognition. All-ECAC tight end Steve Checksfield had 22 receptions for 432 yards and seven scores.

The Great Danes ranked among the national leaders in scoring defense (13.5 ppg) last year, but the unit was hit hard by graduation. Mike Grever, the '98 Football Gazette Linebacker of the Year, provides a key figure to build their 4-3-4 scheme around. Grever was the first UA defender to record 120-plus tackles in backto-back seasons since 1982.





UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY OFFICIALLY RECLASSIFIED AS A DIVISION I-AA INSTITUTION BY THE NATIONAL COLLEGIATE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

ALBANY, N.Y. -- The elevation of the University at Albany's intercollegiate athletics program for men and women to Division I will become effective on Wednesday, September 1 after the NCAA Executive Committee approved the school's petition for change of division membership. University President Karen R. Hitchcock has been notified that the institution meets all provisions, and is now reclassified as Division I-AA.

Albany will compete as a Division I independent during the upgrade's early stages, and continues to seek conference affiliation for 18 of 19 sports. Football is playing at the I-AA level, and is a member of the Northeast Conference. The University made the transition to Division II and joined the New England Collegiate Conference in 1995. Albany competed in Division III prior to that move and at the college division level before the NCAA restructured in 1972.

"During this six-year process, there has been a tremendous commitment and dedication shown by the University's administration and athletic staff," said Interim Director of Athletics Gail Cummings-Danson. "Although we have arrived, there is still much to accomplish. Our immediate goals are conference affiliation and resource development."

On the University's first day as a Division I member, women's soccer opens its schedule at home against Massachusetts, while women's field hockey and men's soccer travels to Syracuse and Northeastern, respectively. The Albany football team begins its I-AA schedule at Central Connecticut State in the Northeast Conference opener for both squads on Saturday, September 4.

The University at Albany, founded in 1844 as the state's first school for the training of teachers and the oldest chartered public institution of higher education in New York, is today designated as a University Center of the State University of New York. The University is ranked 17th in research and scholarship among the nation's top public universities. Approximately 17,000 students are enrolled in eight degree-granting schools and colleges offering 220 academic programs from the bachelor's degree through the doctorate.
