#### UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ANNOUNCES 1998-99 BASKETBALL SCHEDULES

Albany, N.Y. -- The University at Albany men's and women's basketball programs announced their schedules today as the final season at the NCAA Division II level approaches. The Great Danes, who begin practice on October 17, step up to Division I status in 1999-2000.

The Albany men will play three Division I opponents and an 18-game New England Collegiate Conference slate. The Great Danes open at Duquesne University, a member of the Atlantic 10 Conference, on Saturday, November 14, and also travel to Toledo (Nov. 21) and Arkansas-Little Rock (Nov. 23). Albany's opener with Duquesne will be the first meeting with a Division I program since 1981-82, when Utica College was still competing in that classification.

Head coach **Scott Hicks**, who guided the Great Danes to a 19-8 record and a secondplace NECC finish in his first season with the program one year ago, has two starters returning. **Todd Cetnar**, a 6-foot guard from Amsterdam, N.Y., averaged 9.5 points and 3.7 assists as a sophomore. **Matthew Haggarty**, a 6-foot-3 junior swingman, scored at an 8.1 clip.

The Albany women also have Division I teams on their 26-game schedule. The Great Danes will appear in the St. John's Classic on November 20-21, and meet the host school in the opening round. Houston and Georgia Southern complete the tournament field. In addition, Albany appears in the Capital Key Classic on December 29-30, and is at Nebraska-Kearney's Regency Inn Thanksgiving Classic on Nov. 27-28.

Albany posted a 14-13 record, and tied for fourth in the NECC's regular-season standings last year. **Mari Warner**, who has 265 career victories in 16 years as head coach, will work with a veteran cast as four starters are back. **Kelly Paolino**, a senior point guard from Schenectady, N.Y., led the team in scoring (12.1 ppg) and assists (4.0 pg). **Dawn DiMicco** (9.7 ppg), **Liz Tucker** (8.0 ppg, 5.3 rpg) and **Melissa Schoonover** (8.0 ppg, 6.1 rpg) are the other regulars among eight returning letterwinners.

Albany, N.Y. -- Sophomore striker Bryan Grabon scored the go-ahead goal midway through the second half, and Albany went on to post its fourth straight win with a 3-1 New England Collegiate Conference victory over Stony Brook on Wednesday at Varsity Field.

Grabon dribbled to his right and fired a shot to the left of charging goalkeeper Brian McOmber at the 67:44 mark. His fourth goal of the season gave Albany (5-4, NECC 2-2) a 2-1 advantage. Charlie Justino added an insurance goal in the final nine minutes.

Stony Brook (3-7, NECC 1-3) trailed 1-0 after UA's Devin Falk scored at 37:34, but the Seawolves tied the match one minute and 20 seconds later on Angelo Vassilaras' rebound.

Albany (1-7, NECC 1-3) took a 1-0 lead at the 34:02 mark, when Taryn Miller's direct kick hit the crossbar, and Jessica Ruglis (Schoharie Central H.S.) netted the loose ball in front. Mendicino, a freshman midfielder, sent a 25-yard blast to the left of goalkeeper Megan Kilbride for her second goal of the season and a two-goal cushion.

New Haven (5-3, NECC 2-1), ranked fourth in this week's NCAA Northeast Region Division II poll, closed the gap on Trina Lerum's header at 77:43. Albany goalkeeper Michelle Talviste, who had nine saves, tipped a 30-yard shot by Lerum over the crossbar five minutes later to preserve the upset.

# UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY NAMES JANEL HOLLAR ASSISTANT WOMEN'S BASKETBALL COACH, AND ANNOUNCES THREE OTHER ATHLETICS HIRINGS

Albany, N.Y. -- Janel Hollar has has been selected as assistant women's basketball coach at the University at Albany as Director of Athletics Dr. Milton E. Richards announced today. The athletic department also named Jennifer Petersen graduate assistant track and field coach, Jennifer Chiera graduate assistant for tickets and promotions, and Al Shibley public address announcer for football and basketball.

Hollar, 22, was a third-team All-Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference point guard at Siena College, where she led the Saints to a 20-8 record and the MAAC regular-season title in 1997-98. A two-time team captain, she ranked 14<sup>th</sup> nationally among the NCAA Division I assists leaders with a 6.61 average as a senior. A native of Lima, Ohio, Hollar earned her undergraduate degree in English last May.

Petersen, 23, coached with the Johnstown (N.Y.) High School girls' and boys' track program last spring. She was a member of two Big Ten Conference championship teams and won four varsity letters at the University of Michigan. Petersen placed sixth in the pentathlon at the 1995 Big 10 indoor meet and seventh in the heptathlon at the 1995 conference outdoor championships. She attended Fonda-Fultonville High School, and was a scholastic All-America pentathlete, and a state champion in the high jump and pentathlon. Petersen, who hails from Johnstown, has a B.S. in physical education with a minor in health.

Chiera, 24, joins Cori Rowe's promotions and tickets staff after serving as assistant freshman basketball coach at her alma mater Columbia High School in East Greenbush, New York. She was a captain and earned two varsity letters in basketball at the University of New Haven, and received a B.S. in criminal justice in 1995. She also has an associate's degree in the same discipline from Hudson Valley Community College, where she played on a national championship basketball team.

Shibley will serve as the public address announcer for all Albany football and men's and women's basketball games. He presently is the Vice President of Communications for the New York State Special Olympics, and was previously the sports information director at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. Shibley, who earned his B.A. in mass communication from Emerson College in 1973, has 25 years experience as a freelance performer in radio, television and other entertainment venues.

Hamden, Conn. -- University at Albany's Ilissa Strolovitz won the Flight B singles consolation, while Shanna Mogan reached the Flight B final at the Quinnipiac Open.

Strolovitz, a freshman, defeated Stony Brook's Delquin Gong in an 8-5 proset in the consolation finals. She advanced to the title match with an 8-4 triumph over Iona's Megan Clarke in the semifinal round.

Mogan lost to Linda Hemmes, of Fairleigh Dickinson, 6-1 and 6-1, in the Flight B championship, and made the final with 6-4, 6-1 semifinal win against Connecticut's Dori Keusch.

In Flight B doubles, Julie Bliss (Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake) and Samantha Kramer dropped an 8-3 decision to Quinnipiac's Stephanie Petrycki and Michelle Nagle in the championship match. C.W. Post 24, Albany 16

Albany, N.Y. -- Junior fullback John Carneglia rushed for 119 yards, and quarterback Pat Rock passed for two touchdowns to lead C.W. Post to a 24-16 Eastern Football Conference victory over Albany on Saturday evening at University Field. The Great Danes saw their Division II-leading winning streak halted at 14 straight, and suffered their first-ever loss in conference play.

Albany (3-1, EFC 1-1) took a 10-0 lead in the first quarter. Starting quarterback Eric Williams scored on a 2-yard run to finish off his team's first possession, before Deron Regev booted a 38-yard field goal to end a 50-yard drive.

C.W. Post (2-1, EFC 2-0), which avenged a 44-7 loss to Albany on its home field last September, took advantage of a shanked punt by Steve Checksfield to jump start its first scoring march. Rock hit tight end Derrick Darwood with a 13-yard touchdown pass to complete an 11-play drive with 8:00 left in the second quarter.

The Pioneers had good field position again on its next possession, and needed just four plays to take a 14-10 lead. Rock, off play-action, rolled to his right, and found Darwood all alone in the UA secondary for a 30-yard score.

C.W. Post turned one of three Albany turnovers into a touchdown early in the third period. A bad pitch by Williams was recovered by linebacker Rich Renny, and four plays later wide receiver Eddie Hardaway reached paydirt on a 3-yard inside reverse for a 21-10 advantage.

Albany closed within 21-16 with 2:20 left in the third stanza, when reserve quarterback Michael Oliva tossed a 7-yard shovel pass to tailback Greg Garrett for a touchdown. The two-point pass play failed.

Tony Balcan kicked a 34-yard field goal to cap a 67-yard drive the next time the Pioneers touched the ball. Albany's offense sputtered on its final two possessions with both ending in miscues. Oliva's poor pitch on a option play was scooped up by Renny, and free safety Eric Williams intercepted Oliva to kill UA's last drive.

Rock completed 8 of 12 passes for 163 yards and two touchdowns, while Darwood had four receptions for 62. The C.W. Post defense came up with four sacks, and held the Great Danes to 63 net rushing yards.

Albany picked off three passes, and returned each one for a touchdown during a seven-minute stretch in the second quarter. Cornerback Troy Rhett intercepted Blue Devil quarterback Keith Toolan, and raced down the right sideline 35 yards to the end zone for a 29-3 advantage. Matt Caliandro, a senior defensive end, came up with a Toolan swing pass in the CCSU backfield, and went the remaining eight yards to paydirt. Finally, Grever's 25-yard interception return vaulted his club into a commanding 42-3 lead with 3:38 left in the stanza.

Albany, which has won 12 straight dating back to a season-opening 33-26 loss at Central Connecticut last year, limited the Blue Devils to 18 net yards rushing and caused five turnovers. Toolan connected on just 16-of-46 passes for 189 yards, and was sacked twice.

In the fourth quarter, CCSU's Evan Walsh tossed a 13-yard scoring pass to tailback Mark Strasser, while Albany freshman Marcus Rotondi reached the goal line on a 74-yard option run.

Albany, coming off a school-record 11-1 campaign, and the Eastern Football Conference championship in 1997, is in its final NCAA Division II season, and moves to the I-AA level next fall. The Great Danes tallied their most points in an opener since 1973.
