ALBANY MEETS MASSACHUSETTS-LOWELL IN NECC WOMEN'S TOURNAMENT SEMIFINAL GAME

ALBANY, N.Y. -- The University at Albany women's basketball team faces Massachusetts-Lowell in the semi-final round of the New England Collegiate Conference tournament on Friday, March 1. Tip-off at the University of Bridgeport's Hubbell Gymnasium is 6:00 p.m. The Great Danes, as the sixth seed, upset Sacred Heart, the No. 3 seed, by a 74-67 score in the quarterfinals, while second seed Massachusetts-Lowell received a bye in the bracket's opening round.

Albany and Massachusetts-Lowell split the regular-season series. The River Hawks rallied for a 92-89 victory at home on December 9 in the first meeting. In the second contest, the Great Danes led wire-to-wire in posting a 92-73 triumph on January 21 at the Recreation and Convocation Center.

Massachusetts-Lowell (19-7) is led by junior guard **Diane DiRoma**, a first team all-conference selection. DiRoma leads her club in scoring (15.8 ppg) and assists (3.5 pg), and netted a career-high 33 points in UML's last meeting with Albany. **Sheila Knower** has a 14.5 scoring average, while **Debbie Henderson**, a 6-foot-2 center, adds 12.3 points and 10.8 rebounds per game.

Albany (13-13) stunned Sacred Heart, which had defeated the Great Danes twice during the regular schedule, in the NECC quarterfinals. **Samantha Ginsberg** leads UA in scoring (15.3 ppg) and assists (4.6 pg), while **Michele Davis**, who had 16 points and 11 rebounds in last Sunday's victory, averages 14.2 points. Senior center **Erica Witham** (Guilderland H.S.) adds 11.6 points and 6.6 rebounds per game, while freshman **Kelly Paolino** (Schalmont H.S.) and sophomore **Kerry Ochal** (Amsterdam H.S.) average 6.2 and 4.7 points, respectively, off the bench.

"You can never tell what gets a team going (in the post-season)," explained Albany coach Mari Warner, who has 232 career victories in 14 seasons. "It's a magical thing, and it has happened to us. We just want to see how long we can take this wonderful ride."

Fairfield, Conn. -- Michele Davis scored 16 points and Samantha Ginsberg had 15 and a key three-pointer as Albany upset Sacred Heart, 74-69, in the first round of the New England Collegiate Conference Tournament on Sunday afternoon.

Sacred Heart's Maureen Delaney hit a driving layup to knot the score at 41 early in the second half. Albany then took the lead for good with seven straight points. Katie Zeglis, who scored 12 points, started the burst with a baseline jumper and Ginsberg, who added four steals, capped it with a three-point basket.

Leading, 48-45, the Great Danes used a 17-5 run to take a 65-50 advantage with 6:49 remaining. Freshman Alison Bowe finished the run with a three-pointer and a short jumper in the lane.

The Pioneers responded with 10 straight points, and closed to within two, at 66-64, on Chrissie Perkins' 17-foot jumper from the left wing at the 2:30 mark. Ginsberg sank a three-pointer from the left wing to end the Pioneer threat and put UA ahead by five with 2:12 to play.

Third-seeded Sacred Heart won both contests with Albany during the regular season, including a 64-38 decision on February 12. Delaney, who had 24 points and a school-record six three-pointers in that meeting, was held to 12 points on 3 of 12 shooting today.

ALBANY, N.Y. -- The University at Albany men's basketball team has qualified for the New England Collegiate Conference men's basketball tournament. The Great Danes, as the sixth seed, will play a firstround game at LeMoyne, the No. 3 seed, on Tuesday, February 27 at 7:30 p.m. The NECC tournament champion receives an automatic berth in the NCAA Division II championship field.

During the regular season, LeMoyne (21-5, NECC 16-4) won two tightly-contested games with Albany. ALBANY QUALIFIES FOR NECC MEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT



Bridgeport, Conn. -- Jeff Bailey scored 34 points and hit five three-pointers as Bridgeport used a second-half rally to defeat Albany, 97-89, in a New England Collegiate Conference game on Sunday evening.

Albany guard Darrin Jahnel, who scored 13 points, pushed the ball up the floor, and passed to Tom McGoldrick, who misfired on an 18-foot leaner from the left wing at the buzzer.

McGoldrick finished with 11 points, while Andre Duncan scored 15 points.


Sacred Heart 64, Albany 38

ALBANY BASKETBALL COACH RICHARD "DOC" SAUERS WILL TAKE THE FLOOR FOR HIS 1,000TH GAME ON SATURDAY

ALBANY, N.Y. -- University at Albany head basketball coach **Richard "Doc" Sauers** will join an elite group of collegiate head coaches on Saturday, when his Great Danes travel to Sacred Heart for a New England Collegiate Conference game at 4:00 p.m. Sauers will become the 15th mentor in the history of college basketball to coach his 1,000th game, and will stand alongside such legendary coaching figures as North Carolina's Dean Smith, Missouri's Norm Stewart, DePaul's Ray Meyer and Kansas' F.C. "Phog" Allen.

Sauers, who ranks 10th in victories among the winningest all-division head coaches, has a 684-314 career record, and is in his 40th season. Last year, he moved past Hall-of-Fame and former UCLA coach John Wooden on the all-time win list. Sauers and Adolph Rupp, who coached 1,066 games at Kentucky, are the only cage mentors to have worked 40 or more seasons and never suffered a losing campaign. Rupp and Sauers each had one .500 team, as Kentucky went 13-13 in 1966-67 and Albany posted an 11-11 record in 1963-64.

Sauers, 65, has coached Albany at both the NAIA and NCAA Division III levels, and has his Great Danes at 11-10 overall in their first year as a Division II program. He and Jim Phelan, who recently recorded his 750th career win at Division I Mount St. Mary's College in Maryland, are the only active coaches with 40-plus seasons at the same school.

Sauers' son, Stephen, played for his father from 1986-90 as a guard, and is presently an assistant coach at Marist College, a Division I school located in Poughkeepsie, N.Y.
