

Dec. 22, 1888

A special meeting of the Executive Committee of the Normal School was held at the office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, in the care of the chairman.

Present: Superintendent Ruggles

Mr. Draper

Mr. Murray.

Mr. Draper made a verbal statement as to the demand made upon him as a member of the committee by James W. Eaton for the immediate removal of the material purchased from him for the new Normal School building. The secretary explained the terms on which the purchase of material was made from Mr. Eaton and the terms on which the vacant lots on Lancaster and Chestnut streets were used for its storage. After conference, it was concluded that no action in reference to the removal of the material was necessary to be taken at present; except that the secretary be directed to take steps to keep the streets in front of the lots

occupied by the material properly cleared.
 Without further business the committee adjourned.

January 15, 1884

The Executive Committee of the Normal School met at the office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction on the call of the chairman.

The minutes of the meetings held December 19 and 22, 1883 were read and approved.

The Secretary reported that he had made an arrangement with Mr. Shattuck the contractor for the mason-work to keep the side walks in the vicinity of the lots, on which the old material is stored, in proper order.

The President made a statement in reference to the remains of the alum-
