

The minutes of the last meetings were read and approved.

On motion of Mr. Draper it was resolved that a meeting of the executive committee be held on Thursday evening February 14, to consider the proper disposition to be made of the old building and the application to be made to the Legislature for an appropriation for furniture.

It was also resolved that the Architect be requested to furnish at said meeting a full and detailed estimate of the expenditures required for furnishing the building, and for any other purposes not provided for in the contracts already let, and also a full statement of the amount required to meet existing contracts.

The President reported that the Fairbanks Seal Company had presented to the Normal School two seals of a capacity of five hundred pounds each for the use of the school. Whereupon on the motion of Mr. Draper the resolution was di-

noted to make suitable acknowledgment of the timely and valuable gift.

The Committee then adjourned to meet at the same place on Thursday evening Feb. 14th at 7:30 P.M.
