Dear Chapter President or Chapter Contact,

Once again I am writing every NOW chapter in New York to let members know what is going on in the state organization, and to encourage chapters to reestablish or renew their membership in NOW-New York State. Since our newsletter reaches only state NOW members, many may not have the latest information about our activities. Please share this letter with the members of your chapter.

We are in the process of establishing an office in Albany with staff (from SUNY-Albany) and a phone. The address will be: One Columbia Place, Albany, New York, 12207. It should be in operation by the end of February. In order that we may best inform people about your chapter who call us from your area, it would help if you could send us about ten copies of your brochure, if you have one. We will let you know the telephone number as soon as possible. We hope the office will help keep us all in closer communication, facilitate our lobbying activities in Albany, and help potential new members find their closest colleagues.

With the exception of special occasions, all of our State Council meetings in the future will be in Albany. Every other month, beginning in January, we will meet at the Northway Inn, 1517 Central Ave., Albany, NY, 12205. We hope this central and fixed location will encourage more delegates and general members to attend the meetings. The schedule for the State Council meetings the next three sessions is:

January 28-29 March 11-12 May 6-7

Please add to your calendar a particularly important event -- the Northeast Regional Conference. It will be held in Albany on April 7-9, 1978, at the Sheraton Inn Towne Motor Inn, 300 Broadway, Albany, NY, 12207. In addition to a variety of speakers, workshops, and entertainment, we will be electing members from our region to the National NOW Board. Please urge your members to attend. We need their input and their votes.

For the unaffiliated chapters that do not receive the state newsletter, I want to tell you briefly about the caravan we have planned for this spring. I plan to start driving around New York State in or around April to talk with people about NOW. I will be bringing as much literature as possible with me, and I would like to talk with as many groups and individuals as I can -- a chapter, a college or church audience, whatever. If you would like to have the caravan come your way (I expect to share any podium, incidentally, with local leaders in each area), please let me know at the printed address on the letterhead or by phone. Leave a message to return your call if you don't reach me directly.

Finally, we have three new state task forces that need people to chair them: Minority Women, Criminal Justice, and Ageism. If you know anyone in NOW who would like to get involved on a state-wide basis on these subjects, please let me know. The only advance requirement is membership (individual or chapter) in the state organization. Timidity does not disqualify anyone -- one learns what one needs to know on the job. Do help us attend to these important topics.

I hope that chapters will continue to join the state organization because urgent tasks such as the ERA and the extension of the deadline for ratification, abortion, battered women, rape, lesbian rights, and displaced homemakers require state-wide, nation-wide cooperation. We are the folks that must work together to get feminist things done.

Council Representation:

Recent amendments to the NOW-NYS By-laws with regard to membership and Council representation have caused a goodly number of you to ask for clarification of both your individual and your chapter status.

- A. Membership in NOW-NYS is counted on an individual basis. A National NOW member may pay State dues in one of two ways: either direct to NOW-NYS or through his or her chapter.
- B. Representation on the NOW-NYS Council is open to ALL chapters, convened and chartered, located in New York State which meet the following requirements:
 - i. Convened or chartered status;
 - ii. Located in New York State;
 - iii. Notification in writing to NOW-NYS of the names and addresses of a chapter's delegates (can be done at a Council meeting)

C. Other Information:

- i. Each chapter is entitled to 2 delegates, regardless of chapter size, and one alternate;
- ii. The delegates and alternates elected/ selected/chosen by the chapter <u>must</u> be members of NOW-NYS. (Dues may be paid at a Council meeting)
 - iii. All chapters who choose to collect NOW-NYS (which are 1/3 of National dues, or \$5.-\$2.) must forward those dues to the State.
 - iv. All National NOW members, either chapter or at-large members, whose dues are not paid may be billed by NOW-NYS for their dues.
 - v. NOW members may speak.
