There are two aspects of electronic music that will be presented tonight. In Music for Solo Performer 1965, Players with Circuits and Shelter 9999, the primary sound source is either produced onstage and modified by a performer or pre-recorded on tape and modified onstage. In Zoological Garden and albanymusic the tapes are completely constructed and played back in the hall with no onstage modification.

Music for Solo Performer 1965 was first performed at Brandeis University at a concert given by John Cage, Alvin Lucier and Christian Wolff, and most recently at the Fylkingen sponsored Congress of Technology and Art in Stockholm. The primary sound source are the performer's 10 cycle alpha rhythm brain waves, used to resonate percussion instruments and to operate gating devices which control pre-recorded brain waves on storage tapes.

In 1965, Mr. Rzewski was in West Berlin on a Ford Foundation Grant. Zoological Garden was written during a two month period in 1965, at the East German Studio for Electronic Music. It is a completely composed tape, involving no performers.

David Behrman is currently a member of the Sonic Arts Group which is planning a tour of Europe in April of 1967. Players with Circuits was first performed in June 1966 at the Lincoln Center Library.

albanymusic2 is the first tape composition finished in the Electronic Music Studio of the State University of New York at Albany, which was established by Mr. Chadabe in July, 1966, on a grant from the Research Foundation of the State University of New York. It is a completely composed tape, involving no performers. This is the first performance.

Takahiko limura is an interesting member of the Japanese underground film group whose films have been shown at the Cinenateque in New York, Harvard and Yale University, and throughout Japan. One of his famous films, Onan, won the Honorable Mention at the 1965 Brussels Film Festival.

Shelter 9999 was completed in October 1966 for a concert of new music at the Lincoln Center Library.
