BILLY PIKE NAMED COLLEGE SPORTING NEWS PUNTER OF THE WEEK

Skokie, III. – University at Albany's **Billy Pike** has been selected as the College Sporting News/I-AA.org Punter of the Week for his performance against Stony Brook on Sept. 28. He averaged 56.3 yards in three attempts against the Seawolves.

Pike, a senior, tied the fourth longest punt in school history with a 70-yarder for a touchback in the fourth quarter. He booted a 57-yard punt in the opening period. Pike has eight punts of 50 yards or more this season.

Pike ranks fourth this week among the NCAA Division I leaders in punting at 45.32 yards per attempt.

UALBANY FALLS IN I-AA MID-MAJOR NATIONAL FOOTBALL POLLS

Albany, N.Y. – Following last Saturday's 24-20 setback against Stony Brook, UAlbany fell abruptly in both The Sports Network and Football Gazette Division I-AA Mid-Major national football polls. The Great Danes were third in both rankings last week, but dipped to ninth in The Sports Network poll and is listed No. 11 by Football Gazette. Albany (2-2, NEC 2-1) hosts Northeast Conference-rival Wagner (3-1, NEC 1-0) on Hall of Fame Day at University Field on Saturday, Oct. 5. Kickoff is 1:00 p.m.

Stony Brook, NY – Freshman **Shon Brownlee** scored on a 97-yard kickoff return with 8:22 remaining as Stony Brook rallied for a 24-20 Northeast Conference victory over Albany before 6,331 fans on Saturday evening at brand-new Seawolves Stadium.

Albany (2-2, NEC 2-1) took a 20-17 lead midway through the final period on **Gary Jones**' 1-yard run. Brownlee then faked a reverse on the following kickoff and raced down the right sideline for the go-ahead touchdown.

Stony Brook (2-1, NEC 1-1) led 10-6 at halftime, but the Great Danes went in front on quarterback **Ryan Roeder**'s 9-yard option run with 8:09 left in the third quarter. The Seawolves, who beat Albany for the first time since 1995, regained the lead on the first play of the fourth quarter. Quarterback **Scott Bard**, who completed 19 of 29 passes for 201 yards hit **Jophiel Philips** with a five-yard touchdown pass.

"Stony Brook played well," Albany coach **Bob Ford** said. "We made the type of mistakes that get you beat. We broke down on the kickoff reverse. I don't know who is going to run the table, but every win is a must win on our schedule from now on."

In the first half, the Seawolves scored on their opening two possession to build a 10-3 lead. **Michael Soto** booted a 37-yard field goal to finish off the first sequence. Bard completed four consecutive passes to **Chris McGovern**, who hauled in nine receptions for a career-high 132 yards, to get into Albany territory.

After Albany's **Stan Zylinski** made the first of two field goals, Bard directed his team on a five-play scoring drive. He fired 24-yard strike to a diving Philips in the right endzone with 2:52 remaining in the period.

Roeder completed 17 of 25 attempts for 204 yards, while **Jason Miller** had a career game with 7 catches for 78 yards. However, the Great Danes had three turnovers, including two fumbles.

In the Fairfield contest, Dombrowski doled out 54 assists with a majority of them going to Bowens and Gibbs who recorded 29 and 16 kills, respectively. Rodriguez served nine aces while collecting 18 digs.

Bowens and Dombrowski were each rewarded for their outstanding play (Bowens 51 kills, .362 hitting percentage; Dombrowski 127 assists) by being named to the All-tournament team.

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ENSHRINES FIVE INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Albany, N.Y. -- The University at Albany will enshrine five former athletes into its Athletic Hall of Fame on Saturday, October 5 at the 19th annual HOF Dinner and Induction Ceremony. A reception for the Athletic Hall of Fame inductees begins at 5:00 p.m. with the dinner and ceremony to follow in the Recreation and Convocation Center (RACC) on campus. The event is preceded by UAlbany's Northeast Conference home football game with Wagner at 1:00 p.m.

The new inductees and their sports: **Tonya Dodge** '97, cross country/track; **Meredith Jackel** '97, field hockey; **Blake Kim** '92, lacrosse; **Cort Kim** '92, lacrosse; and **Rudy Vido** '78, football/wrestling/track.

With this year's class, there are 94 former athletes, coaches, and administrators who have been inducted into the University's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Tonya Dodge (1994-97) -- Dodge is the only woman in school history to earn All-America honors in cross country, indoor track and outdoor track. In 1996-97, she was named the University at Albany's Female Athlete of the Year.

As a senior, Dodge posted the best finish by an eastern runner at the 1996 NCAA Division II cross country championships and was 13th overall in 18:35.1. A first-team All-New England Collegiate Conference selection on two occasions, she captured four individual titles, including the NECC and Collegiate Track Conference championships, and set an East Stroudsburg course record (18:20).

Dodge, who finished her career with nine school records in track & field, received All-America recognition during the '97 indoor season with a fifth-place finish in the NCAA Division II one-mile run with a time of 4:54.72. She also captured the NECC 3,000 title and ECAC 5,000 crown.

A three-time NCAA outdoor championship participant, Dodge was sixth in the 1,500 and eighth in the 3,000 at the 1997 NCAA Division II meet. She also provisionally qualified in the 5,000 and 10,000. Dodge, who established school records in all four events, won the CTC 5,000 by shattering a 12-year-old standard, and broke another long-standing mark in winning the Albany Invitational's 10,000 in 36:55.94. She also registered a school-record 9:39.34 in the 3,000 at Penn Relays. For her efforts, she was named the NCAA East Region's top female outdoor track athlete.

Dodge, who received an ECAC Merit Medal as the school's top senior female student-athlete, has an undergraduate degree in psychology with a minor in criminal justice. Dodge, a native of Granville, N.Y. (Granville Central H.S.), is a doctoral student in psychology at the university. She is expected to complete her dissertation in May 2003. Dodge, who recently served as UAlbany's assistant cross country coach, continues to compete on the national level in the 3,000-meter steeplechase, and ran at the 2000 U.S. Olympic Trials in Sacramento, Calif.

Meredith Jackel (1995-97) -- A three-time All-American, Jackel was the first UAlbany field hockey player to be recogized at the national level. She also played in the National Field Hockey Coaches Association's 1997 North-

South Senior All-Star Game.

As a senior sweeper back, Jackel led Albany to the ECAC Division II championship and a school-record 17-2 campaign. The Great Danes, who defeated Bentley, 2-1, in the title contest, shut out 11 opponents and allowed 0.57 goals per game. Jackel, a 19-game starter on defense, was chosen to NFHCA All-America first team.

In 1996, Albany posted a 14-3 record and finished with a No. 3 ranking in the North Region. Jackel, who earned first-team All-America recognition, again spearheaded a defensive unit that blanked 11 of 17 opponents. She scored four goals and added four defensive saves.

Jackel, a three-time team MVP who transferred from Ball State University, was dominant in her first year with the UAlbany program. She started all 15 games as a defender and midfielder, when the Great Danes registered an 11-3-1 record in just their second varsity season. Albany's defense held 10 opponents off the scoreboard and limited the opposition to 0.66 goals per game.

A native of Mahopac, N.Y. (Mahopac H.S.), Jackel earned a B.A. in sociology with a dual minor in psychology and criminal justice. She works in the Chappaqua School District as a sixth grade special education teacher. Jackel has also been a two-year varsity assistant field hockey coach at Chappaqua High School. She received a M.A. in elementary education from Mercy College, and is presently pursuing another master's degree in reading.

Blake Kim (1989-92) -- A three-time Capital District College Lacrosse League All-Star, Kim is second on the school's all-time scoring list and the program's career leader in assists.

Kim was the Division III national leader in assists at 4.00 per game as a senior, when he helped the Great Danes reach the 1992 ECAC championship final and capture the Capital Cup with a school-record 10-3 campaign. He set UAlbany's single-season mark with 52 assists that spring. Kim, who had three goals and five assists in a 15-14 victory over Union for the Capital Cup title, was named to the CDCLL first team.

An All-CDCLL selection in 1990 and 1991, Kim totaled 34 goals and 30 assists for 64 points as a junior. He finished with 21 goals and 32 assists for 53 points in his sophomore season. He completed his college career as the school's second-leading scorer with 206 points, including 87 goals and 119 assists. Kim is first on the all-time assists chart.

A native of Schenectady, N.Y. (Guilderland H.S.), Kim graduated with a B.S. in biology. He then coached lacrosse and enrolled in art classes at Skidmore College, and eventually earned a M.A. in medical and scientific illustration from Johns Hopkins University. He is currently working as an art director for Addison-Wesley & Benjamin Cummings, a subdivision publishing firm of Pearson Education in San Francisco, Calif. He and his brother, Cort, continue to play for the Barbary Coast Lacrosse Club and were members of Team Korea at the 2002 World Championships in Perth, Australia.

Cort Kim (1989-92) -- An All-America attackman, Kim was a two-time Capital District College Lacrosse League All-Star. He completed his career as the school's all-time leader in total points and goals scored.

Kim, the 1992 Capital District Player of the Year, established the school's single-season scoring record with 89 points (45 goals, 44 assists) as a senior. He was named to the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association's Division III All-America squad in the honorable mention category. A first-team CDCLL selection, Kim led the Great Danes to the Capital Cup championship and a ECAC championship final appearance.

In 1990, Kim ranked ninth among the national scoring leaders with 66 points (33 goals, 33 assists). He was named to the Capital District All-Star squad. Kim totaled 20 goals and 26 assists in his first season as a collegian, and was voted the Capital District Freshman of the Year.

Kim is the UAlbany lacrosse program's all-time scoring leader with 218 points. He also ranks third in career goals (110) and second in assists (108).

A native of Schenectady, N.Y. (Guilderland H.S.), Kim earned a B.S. in biology. He was a UAlbany assistant lacrosse coach for one season, before working at Springfield College as an assistant for two years. At Springfield, Kim received a M.S. in physical therapy. He works as a physical therapist at the San Mateo County Health Center, and resides in San Francisco, Calif. Kim's father, Sung Bok, is a UAlbany professor and former Dean of Undergraduate Studies.

Rudy Vido (1970-74) -- An all-around, three-sport athlete, Vido excelled in football, wrestling and track & field. He competed on the national level as a heavyweight wrestler and in the shot put event, and later played football on the professional level.

Vido, a 6-foot-2, 248-pound defensive end, started on UAlbany's first varsity football teams. In 1973, he was named the program's outstanding defensive lineman with 105 tackles, seven sacks and one blocked punt. Vido, an All-Metroland choice, also played on the school's only undefeated football team in 1974. He totaled 80 tackles, six sacks and three fumble recoveries. Vido became the first UAlbany player to ink a professional contract, when he signed as a free agent with the New England Patriots. He went on to play for the Canadian Football League's Toronto Argonauts and was a four-time Empire State League defensive MVP as a semi-professional.

In track & field, Vido won four consecutive SUNY Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) shot put championships. He earned All-America recognition as a junior, and qualified for NCAA Division III nationals and the IC4A championships on three occasions. Vido still holds the school record with a toss of 54-feet, 4.25-inches in 1973.

As a wrestler, Vido was a two-time SUNY Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) heavyweight champion and won three varsity letters. He reached the NCAA Division III quarterfinal round in 1974, and claimed a New York State title. Vido was the state runner-up with a undefeated dual meet record as a junior. He was named the 1973-74 Athlete of the Year by the *Albany Student Press*.

A native of Albany, N.Y. (Albany H.S.), Vido earned a B.S. in sociology in 1978. He works as Project Manager for the Wildwood Institute's Neurobehavorial Resource Project. The Schenectady-based division assists individuals with brain injuries to live successfully in the community.

GARY JONES & BILLY PIKE HONORED WITH NEC WEEKLY FOOTBALL AWARDS Somerset, N.J. – University at Albany's Gary Jones (Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk H.S.) has been selected as the Northeast Conference Offensive Player of the Week in football, as announced today by the conference office. UAlbany's Billy Pike was chosen as the NEC Special Teams Player of the Week. Both players have won their respective awards

twice this season.

Jones, a junior tailback, rushed for 199 yards and three touchdowns, including two in the decisive fourth quarter, in a 38-17 victory over defending conference champion Sacred Heart. He broke a 17-17 tie with a 64-yard scoring sprint with 6:56 remaining, and added a 59-yard TD run, off an option pitch, with 3:18 left.

Jones, who is sixth among the NCAA Division I-AA rushing leaders at 119.3 yards per game, posted the NEC's ninth-best single-game rushing total and the eighth-best effort in school history. He also produced the best rushing day by an Albany runner since 1984, when Dave Soldini ran for 209 against Norwich.

Pike, a senior punter, averaged 45.6 yards on five punts and placed two inside Sacred Heart's five-yard line and another for a touchback. His 59-yarder in the third quarter tied the 11th longest in UA history. Pike, who ranks 10th among the I-AA punting leaders, has six punts of 50 yards or longer this season.

Albany, N.Y. – University at Albany's **Alexis Bowens** has been named the Baden America East Conference Player of the Week in women's volleyball, as the conference office announced today. UAlbany's **Eileen Nicole Rodriguez** and **Jill Dombrowski** were also tabbed as the conference's Rookie and Setter of the Week, respectively. ALBANY 38, SACRED HEART 17

Fairfield, Conn. – Gary Jones rushed for 199 yards and three touchdowns, including two in the fourth quarter, as Albany rallied for a 38-17 Northeast Conference victory over Sacred Heart on Saturday at Campus Field.

Sacred Heart (1-2, NEC 1-1), the defending conference champions, built a 17-7 halftime lead. The Pioneers, who posted a perfect 11-0 record last year, capitalized on two turnovers for a 10-0 advantage. Tim Redican booted a 38-yard field goal, before quarterback Joe Kroells fired a 66-yard scoring pass to Marlon Ward.

Albany (2-2, NEC 2-0) closed within 10-7 on Jones' two-yard run with 2:37 left in the second quarter. But Sacred Heart came right back on its next possession, when Kroells hit Andy Gonzalez with a seven-yard touchdown pass.

The Great Danes established their running game on the first series of the second half. An 11-play march resulted in Stan Zylinski's 22-yard field goal. Albany drew even at 17 apiece with 2:52 remaining in the third period. Following Miciah Yehudah's punt return to the Sacred Heart 36, quarterback Ryan Roeder scored four plays later on a 9-yard option run.

In the fourth quarter, Sacred Heart used a sixteen play drive to move to the Albany 24, but the series stalled when Kroells threw an incomplete pass on a fourth-and-six play. Albany then went to work on the ground. Jones scored on a 64-yard dash, when he rambled over the left side and split the secondary for a 24-17 lead. Jones, who recorded the highest single-game rushing total by a UAlbany player since 1984, took an option pitch 59 yards for his third touchdown with 3:18 to play.

The Great Danes, who racked up 431 total yards, including 320 rushing, completed their run of 31 unanswered points as reserve fullback Eddie Unverzagt reached the end zone on a one-yard run.

"We came out and played Albany football," said Jones, who had the eighth-best rushing day in school history. "Our offensive line owned their defensive line. We found a weakness in their defense and kept going to it."

Fullback Jon George rushed for a career-high 94 yards on 13 carries and caught two passes for 39 more. Roeder, a senior, completed 11 of 21 passes for 111 yards.

"They controlled the line of scrimmage," Sacred Heart coach Bill Lacey said. "Their offensive line did a phenomenal job. They controlled the game."





Albany, N.Y. – Quarterback **Ryan Roeder** ran for one touchdown and passed for another to lead Albany to a 21-12 victory over Central Connecticut State in the Northeast Conference opener for both teams on Saturday afternoon at University Field.

Albany (1-1, NEC 1-0) struck quickly when linebacker **Pat Shairs** forced Central Connecticut's **Chris Mastaj** to fumble the opening kickoff. **Jon Carvin** pounced on the loose ball at the CCSU 22. Tailback **Gary Jones**, who rushed for 154 yards on 18 carries, scored two plays later on a 17-yard scamper up the left sideline.

The Great Danes, who lost to defending Division I-AA national champion Montana in their season opener last week, were looking for a two-touchdown lead early in the second quarter. However, Jones fumbled at the five-yard line on a hit by **Brendan Harrigan**, and linebacker **Roland Ramsby** was off to the races on a 95-yard TD return. **Derek Pearson's** extra-point missed wide right.

A high snap over punter **Mike Kien's** head set up Albany's second scoring sequence just before halftime. Roeder, who passed for 95 yards on 9 of 17 attempts and rushed for 30 more, finished off the short 26-yard drive with a one-yard sneak over the left side for a 14-6 lead at the intermission.

In the third quarter, the Great Danes went 82 yards in six plays for a 21-6 advantage. Jones, a junior, carried four straight times for 40 yards, before Roeder fired a 29-yard TD strike to flanker **Matt Crudo** with 4:16 left in the period.

Central Connecticut State (0-3, 0-1) got back into the contest midway through the fourth quarter, when reserve quarterback **Charles Madison** found tight end **Mike Ewart** with a 10-yard scoring pass on a fourth-and-two play. Pearson again missed the extra point, and the Blue Devils trailed 21-12.

CCSU had one more scoring opportunity in the final minute, when Madison moved the team on a 65-yard drive to the Albany 22. But on fourth down, Madison bobbled the snap from center and Albany linebacker Josh Bazan recovered the fumble to the end the threat. Bazan totaled 10 tackles, including three for losses, with one sack and one fumble recovery.

"We did a lot of positive things, but our offense kept shooting itself in the foot, said Albany coach Bob Ford, whose team was flagged nine time for 46 yards in penalties. "Our defense played extremely well and the special teams were good, especially with coverage."

Madison completed 4 of 10 passes for 49 yards, and rushed eight times for 45 in relief of starter **Scott Dolch**. Senior tailback **Major Cole** finished with 152 rushing yards on 35 attempts.

"I was pleased with our defense," Central Connecticut State coach Paul Schudel commented. "There's two things you have to do in football and that's stay off the field on defense and keep the offense on the field. We have to be more productive. We're getting there but we are not there yet."

#1 Montana 45, Albany 7

Missoula, Mont. -- Senior quarterback **John Edwards** passed for a career-high 322 yards and three touchdowns to lead Montana, ranked No. 1 in Division I-AA, to a 45-7 victory over Albany on Saturday before a stadium-record crowd of 19,511 at Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

Montana (2-0) put together 80-plus yard scoring drives on its opening two possessions. **David Gober**, who rushed for 83 yards on 15 carries, completed a 15-yard march with a four-yard touchdown run over right guard. Edwards, who completed 27 of 35 passes, beat the blitz with a 18-yard strike to tight end **Conor Molloy** for a 14-0 lead.

Albany (0-1) was effective on offense throught the first half, but missed a field goal and had two potential touchdown passes dropped. The Great Danes moved inside the Montana 10 when tailback **Gary Jones** hauled in a 32-yard reception. Four plays later, **Salomon Belilty's** 22-yard field goal missed wide right.

The Grizzlies, who totaled 552 yards in offense, racked up 17 points in the final nine minutes of the first half for a 31-0 lead at the break. Edwards fired a 19-yard touchdown pass to Dane Oliver, before Levander Segars scored on a 66-yard punt return. Placekicker Chris Snyder ended the period with a school-record 57-yard field goal.

The Great Danes, who were playing west of the Mississippi River for the first time, reached the end zone in the third quarter, when free safety **Samson Brown** gather in a pass that bounced off Molloy's chest and raced 86 yards to paydirt with the interception.

Later in the quarter, Edwards, a Walter Payton Trophy candidate, threw his third touchdown of the afternoon, a 43-yard screen pass to running back **J.R. Waller**. Reserve quarterback **Brandon Neill** wrapped the scoring with a 10-yard scoring toss to freshman wideout **Jon Talmage**.

"Montana is an excellent football team and they played like the defending national champions," Albany coach **Bob Ford** said. "We did some positive things, but failed to capitalize on our opportunities. We should have had 17 points at halftime. Our defense was much better in the second half, and I thought **Billy Pike** really showed he can punt the football."

Albany quarterback **Ryan Roeder** completed 12 of 20 passes for 113 yards in three quarters of action, while flanker **Matt Crudo** caught four passes for 42 yards. All-America linebacker **Josh Bazan** and cornerback **Kurt Campbell** each had a team-high eight tackles for the Great Danes.

"Montana is good, but they are extremely efficient," commented Bazan, whose team played before the largest crowd in the UAlbany program's history. "Edwards didn't make any mental mistakes, plus made all his key reads and throws."
