Proposed were requisitions from manufac-
turers of school furniture for school
desks. It was resolved that all the
desks should be of cherry, and that
the building committee should de-
termine the number of double desks
and the number of single desks that
may be required.

The proposals for No. 1 desks of cherry
were as follows:

1. From W. A. Chrull & Co (Union Sch. Furn. Co.)

For the Automatic desk and desk, Double
desk & seat & stationary top \$ 2.00 \$ 5.00

Do. do. separate seat & stationary top 5.75

Do. do. Double desk, writing surface top 5.75

Do. do. Double desk, separate seat, folding top 6.50

N.B. For single desks \$1.00 less in each case.

After full discussion and an examination of the samples, on the recommendation of President Waterbury and in motion of Dr. Ward the following resolution was adopted, Mr. Draper

voting in the negative:

Resolved. That the Building Committee be authorized to prepare and submit a contract to be made with A. H. Andrews & Co. for such a number of the National Study School desks, double and single, to be made of cherry and in the best manner, as they may find necessary for the several rooms, at the prices named in their estimates submitted.

The architect was directed to have the proposals for furnishing open chairs for the assembly room handed in and ready for consideration on Saturday next.

The Committee then adjourned to meet at the office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction Saturday June 13th at 2 o'clock.
