The following communication from Prof. Plympton was read,

Albany March 14, 1850.

To the Executive Committee of the State
Normal School

Gentlemen,

Wishing to accept an appointment recently offered me from an other state, I desire hereby to tender my resignation of the Professorship of Mathematics in the State Normal School; this resignation to take effect at the close of the present term. I offer in explanation of this proposed change; first, the compensation I am to receive in my new position is somewhat higher than my present salary; second the duties I am to perform are such as my studies have specially prepared me for.

In this dissolving for the second time my connection with this Institution, it is proper that I should express my entire satisfaction with the management of the school as well as the relation I have had the honor to hold with its officers,

It was resolved that the resignation of Prof Plympton be accepted.

It was further resolved that Rooney G.

Kimball be appointed to the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Prof Plympton.

It was further resolved that one hundred dollars be added to the salary of Albert H. Rusted, and that Isaac W. Lake a graduate of the twenty third term of the School be appointed tutor at a salary of six hundred dollars.

The Principal stated that the roof of the School building is in a bad condition, leaking in many places. He was authorized to have it thoroughly examined, and to have it painted, provided it can be made tight in that way.
