
The name honored Dr. William J. Milne, who for a generation was the president of the college. In 1966 with the expansion of the college to a university center. The Milne High School retained its name as part of the School of Education of the State University of New York at Albany.





Entering a two-year phase out period, Milne is winding down a distinguished career of more than 130 years. Victim of the state financial crisis and changing currents in the University, the school received a retrenchment notice in May 1975. The faculty was re-

duced from about 30 to 20 and the enrollment from 450 to 160 students as no new ninth grade was admitted and many students entered other schools. About half the student body will graduate in 1976.










Rugby Emerges

New kick for old school




Above: The scrum kicks the game off.






Girls Volly and Serve






Senators, Bowlers, and Athletes

A Senior Reflects


