Canton, N.Y. -- Sophomore fullback Mike Browne scored on a one-yard run in third quarter, and Albany survived a late rally for a 14-8 non-conference victory over St. Lawrence at Weeks Field on Saturday afternoon. The Great Danes are off to a 3-0 start for the first time since 1982.

"I don't how we survived," said Albany coach Bob Ford. "We made so many mistakes, we feel fortunate to walk away with a win. The defense did a good job of keeping them out of the end zone. They hung in and battled despite all the adversity today."

Albany took a 7-0 lead in the second period, when freshman tailback Greg Garrett capped a seven-play drive on a six-yard TD run with 12:03 remaining. Garrett, who left the game with an injury in the third quarter, rushed 22 times for 150 yards.

The Great Danes, who were plagued by mistakes all day long, including two turnovers and 123 yards in penalties, appeared to take a two-touchdown lead just before halftime. However, quarterback Joe Savino's four-yard run was nullified by a holding call. Three plays later, a fake field goal attempt was thwarted when Savino's shovel pass was intercepted by Michael Estroff.

Albany grabbed a 14-0 advantage on its second possession in the second half, when Browne scored from one-yard away to complete a 62-yard march. A key play in the drive was a 22-yard pass from Savino to flanker Bob Thorne.

St. Lawrence (0-2) closed the gap to 14-8 with 2:05 left in the third stanza. Wingback Matt Fitch reached paydirt on a five-yard run, and Bill Spagnolo ran up the middle on a two-point conversion.

Mistakes continued to haunt the Great Danes in the fourth period, as a 90-yard TD run by Browne was wiped out by a clipping penalty, and a 15-yard unsportsmanlike conduct call kept SLU's final drive alive.

The Saints drove from their own 20 in the late stages, and possessed the football nearly eight minutes. But on fourth-and-goal from the Albany 4, quarterback Chris Kiley's pass in the corner of the end zone for Bob Falasco fell incomplete.

"When they line up in a trip-set, I knew it was a pass play," said Albany safety Ted Bearor. "He (the quarterback) threw the ball well, but there was not enough room for the receiver to catch the ball and stay in-bounds."

Kiley finished with 6 of 19 passing for 55 yards and one interception, while John Gent had 19 carries for 86 yards. Savino connected on 7 of 19 attempts in the air for 97 yards, and was picked off once.
