An Act

to amend the executive law, in relation to the Adirondack Park Agency.

Purpose

In order to provide greater accountability to the public, this bill would allow a representative from each county within the Adirondack Park to sit in at all meetings of the Adirondack Park Agency.

Justification

Since its inception, much controversy has surrounded decisions and rulings which have been made by the Adirondack Park Agency. These decisions, often made in closed door meetings, frequently require implimentation on the part of county governments -- even though these governments have had no means of observing how such decisions and rulings were made, and for what reasons.

This legislation is designed to correct this problem by allowing each county within the Adirondack Park to send one non-voting observer to meetings of the Park Agency. It is hoped that such an observer program will help encourage better understanding and communication between the Agency and the people and local governments in the Adirondack area.

Section 1. The last undesignated paragraph of section eight hundred three of the executive law, as amended by chapter three hundred forty-eight of the laws of nineteen hundred seventy-three, is hereby amended to read as follows:

LBDC (P)

The commissioner of environmental conservation, the commissioner of commerce and the director of the office of planning services may, by official authority filed in their respective agencies, and with the Adirondack park agency, designate a deputy or other officer of his agency to exercise his powers and perform his duties, including the right to vote, on the agency. One representative from each county within the Adirondack park, selected by the legislative body of such county, shall sit as an observer at all meetings of the agency.

g 2. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall have become a law.
