Old school, farewell! farewell!

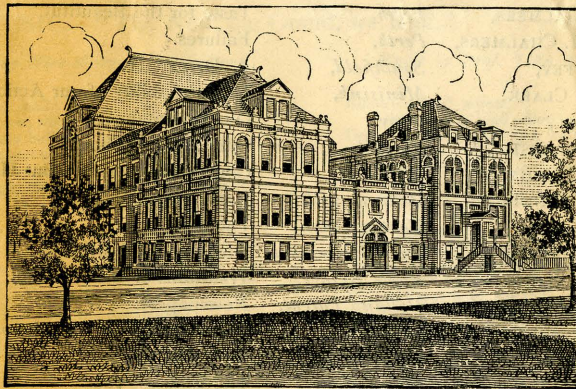
Hail! hail! hail!
