The Committee met in Commissioner Draper's office promptly at the hour appointed. Commissioner Draper, having by act of the Legislature, succeeded to all the duties of the late Superintendent of Public Instruction, took the chair, and there were present also Messrs. Penyer, Leyswell and Ward, and Pres. Milne by invitation.

The minutes of the previous meeting having been approved as read, the Secy. stated that this meeting had been called that the Committee might instruct him, ^{as Treasurer} to sign, seal and deliver to William W. Gibson, of Loxeytown, N.Y., executor of the will of the late Mary J. Hatfield, a release of his obligation to pay to the State Normal College the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.) being her legacy to the library of this institution. The Secy. stated that he had received a draft for three hundred and eighty-one dollars (\$381.-) in paymt. of this legacy, and had made a special deposit of this sum in the Union Trust Company. On motion of Mr. Penyer the ~~Secy.~~ was so instructed.

Mrs. Penyer, as Chairman of the Auditing Committee, presented the report accountant, Mr. John Stourigan's, report of the examination of the Treasurer's accounts up to July 31, 1903. On motion it was accepted and ordered placed on file.
