the responsibility of every Local, however, to act within the policies set forth and approved by constitutional conventions and administrative bodies, such as the General Electric Conference Board. The National Organization will not interfere in that local autonomy unless called upon for assistance or when a Local violates those rules which the majority in the Union have approved.

MALLOY KNEW when he accepted his office that the Local had many problems; he knew that Local 201 and every G. E. Local Union throughout the Chain faced a crucial test this year on contract negotiations... he said so in the Local 201 News of Friday, Nov. 13, 1959: "Negotiations will be crucial and important to each and every one of us. In line with our policy, we want to get the best possible contract for our membership with all possible improvements." Did Malloy mean what he said??

CERTAINLY EVIEN MALLOY KNOWS that weakening the majority of G. E. workers within the IUE-AFL-CIO does not contribute to the strength of our Union. Certainly Malloy knows

that 90,000 G. E. workers are members of IUE which has the support of the Labor Movement 15 million strong. His choice was the U. E. with less than 10,000 G. E. workers remaining in their ranks. His choice was not made for the purpose of helping the G. E. workers, but was made to help Malloy. Well, the union members in the River Works were well informed on the facts because when Malloy reported to work Tuesday morning, he found a very unhappy and disagreeable group of former co-workers.

The report we received from Lynn was to the effect that Malloy took a hasty exit from the plant... observers claim it was painful for Malloy because a promised job was waiting for him on the U. E. staff.

The drive for enactment of the FORAND BILL moved into high gear, picking up major support from within the medical profession as the House Ways and Means Committee neared a vote on the AFL-CIO backed measure to provide medical care for the nation's older citizens.

Dr. Basil MacLean, former president of the National Blue Cross Association, and Dr. E. M. Bluestone, professor of hospital administration at Columbia and NYU declared that the "sheer humanity" of the bill "far outweighs" the misguided and ill-advised opposition of the AMA and the insurance industry.

As support for the measure mounted, reports persisted that the Eisenhower Administration, spurred by political considerations involved in Vice Pres. Nixon's presidential bid, was considering an election-year-about-face on medical insurance legislation.

While your congressmen seem to favor this vital legislation to care for our aging citizens, they want to hear from the public whom they feel strongly desire this kind of a bill.
