

*N*o sum which may be due to Mr. Kellogg for his services in the school the present time, to deduct therefrom such part of the expense which has been incurred in obtaining a successor as he shall deem just proper.

Mr. Austin submitted the following resolution which was unanimously adopted.

Resolved that the Secretary be directed to communicate to the Professors and teachers of the school, the resolution of this Committee that they will not except at their own option, accept the resignation of any Professor or teacher, without a previous notice of two months, which notice shall expire with the close of a term.

The Principal was requested to prepare the draft of the Annual Report to the Legislature.

The Secretary was added to the Committee on text books, in place of the late Secretary, and the Committee adjourned.

The closing exercises of the 25th. Term of school were held on the 29th day of January. An appropriate Address was delivered by Rev. E. P. Rogers D. D. of Albany.

The Principal reported that within a few weeks several articles of clothing belonging to the pupils, had been taken from the dressing rooms. He stated that the ladies dressing room had been kept locked, but that on the day on which the articles were taken from it, it was accidentally left open for a short time at that time is little doubt that during this time it was entered from the street and the articles taken.
