

April 27. 1874

The committee met at the call of the Chairman  
Present, The Superintendent of Public Instruction  
Mr. Woolworth.

Mrs. Peuyou. & The President Dr. Alden.

The Hon. Neil Gilmour having been elected  
Superintendent of Public Instruction on the ✓  
first Tuesday of April inst. took his seat as chairman  
of the committee.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved  
The consideration of matters relating to the Model and  
Primary department was resumed.

The Treasurer stated that the expenses of the Primary  
department for the current year will exceed the receipts  
from tuition by about £240. The President  
stated that he does not regard the continuance of  
this department important for the purposes of the  
Normal School. Whereupon it was ordered  
that this department be discontinued after the ✓  
present term, and that the Secretary so inform  
the teacher Miss. Kirtland.

The Committee then adjourned.

June 1. 1874.

The committee met at the call of the Chairman  
Present The Chairman

Mr. Woolworth

Mrs. Peuyou,

and the President, Dr. Alden.

The Secretary stated that Mr. Townsend is detained  
from attendance on this meeting by illness.

The minutes of the last meeting were read ✓  
and approved. The consideration of matters  
connected with the model department was  
resumed, The Treasurer stated that the at-  
tendance in this department had so much de-  
minished that the receipts for tuition the cur-  
rent year would fall below the expenses.

The cause of this seems to be the improved

character of the Academies & public schools  
of the city, the establishment of the High  
School and that the instruction in it  
and in the public schools is without charge  
to the pupils. The appropriation for the  
support of the Normal School is insufficient  
to contribute to any considerable extent to the support of the Model Depart-  
ment. Under this condition of things the  
Superintendent, Mr. Allen and the assistant  
Miss. Hand, propose to receive as their  
compensation for one year the total sum  
received for tuition the same to be reduced  
from the present charge to the following  
scale, to wit: in the A. Clap, eighteen dollars,  
a term,  
B. Clap, fifteen dollars,  
C. Clap, twelve  $\frac{5}{100}$  dollars  
D. Clap. ten dollars.

The contingent expenses, including books  
stationery & advertising to be paid by the com-  
mittee.

After extended consideration of the subject  
the proposition above stated was agreed to,  
it being understood that the school is to con-  
tinue as heretofore under the control and  
direction of the Committee & President.

The President stated that the services of Miss Van Hickle may be dispensed with out serious inconvenience & that under the present condition of the finances of the school he deemed it prudent which was agreed to.

The committee then adjourned.
