Albany 47, Stony Brook 14

Stony Brook, N.Y. – Junior tailback **Brian Manigault** rushed for two touchdowns and Albany's special teams blocked three punts in the first half en route to a 47-14 Northeast Conference victory over Stony Brook on Saturday at Seawolves Field.

Albany (1-3, NEC 1-1) scored 17 points following blocked punts to post a 27-14 halftime advantage. **Ben Kelcey's** block led to his team's first score, a one-yard run by Manigault. **Marcus Rotondi** reached paydirt on a two-yard run and **Bryan Bagstad** booted a 22-yard field goal with seven seconds left in the second quarter following two more blocked kicks. Rotondi, who was making his second career start at quarterback, rushed for one touchdown and threw for another in the second stanza.

The Great Danes, who rushed for 329 net yards, which was the fourth-highest total in conference history, took control with a 91-yard drive to open the second half. Manigault, who carried 20 times for a career-high 98 yards, capped off the scoring march with a two-yard run. In the fourth quarter, linebacker **Tim Campe** reached paydirt on a 58-yard fumble return and freshman **Dustin Wilson** scored on a 70-yard scamper.

"We knew we had an edge in the kicking game and our special teams were super today," Albany coach **Bob Ford** said. "We were able to put last week's devastating loss behind us."

Stony Brook (2-2, NEC 1-2) was led by quarterback **Brian Stanley**, who completed 14-of-31 passes for 262 yards. Stanley, a fifth-year senior, hit **Lucas Niskanen** with an 80-yard TD strike in the second quarter.

"We were very explosive off the line on punt returns," senior running back **Ben Kelcey** said. "They seemed nervous with our adjustments up front, and the results were a tremendous boost for our team."

Albany outside linebacker **Ryan MacLean** finished with a team-high nine tackles to go with one interception and a blocked punt.

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ENSHRINES THREE INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

ALBANY, N.Y. -- The University at Albany will enshrine three former athletes into its Athletic Hall of Fame on Saturday, October 7 at the 17th annual HOF Brunch and Induction Ceremony. The event will be held at 10:30 a.m. in the Recreation and Convocation Center (RACC) Athletic Hall of Fame Room on campus. Albany's Northeast Conference football game with St. Francis, Pa. follows at 1:00 p.m.

The new inductees and their sports: Jack Jordan '72, basketball; Pat Ryder '90, football; and Jeffrey York '96, track & field.

With this year's class, there are 85 former athletes, coaches, and administrators who have been inducted into the University's Hall of Fame.

Jack Jordan (1968-71) -- Among the school's alltime scorers and rebounders, Jordan was a starter on the first Albany basketball team to qualify for the NCAA Tournament.

Jordan was the sixth player in UAlbany history to score 1,000 career points. He currently ranks 23rd on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,011 points, 10th in career rebounding (658), ninth in career scoring average at 14.9 points per game, and fifth in career rebounding average at 9.7 per contest.

A three-year letterman, Jordan used his jumping ability and timing to get to the defensive boards and quickness to gain the offensive glass.

In 1968-69, Jordan averaged 12.5 points and 8.8 rebounds, as the Great Danes posted an 18-6 record and reached the NCAA College Division Tournament East Regional in Syracuse, New York. His teams were a combined 48-19 during his career, and were known for their sticky man-to-man defense.

As a junior, Jordan led Albany to the Capital District Tournament championship with an all-tournament performance. He went on to earn All-Metroland recognition, and was the squad's top scorer (16.5 ppg) and rebounder (11.6 pg).

Jordan was a co-captain on the 1970-71 team, and the Great Danes completed the season with 10 consecutive wins to finish with a 17-5 record. During that season, he scored 22 points in an 85-70 victory over Siena, as head coach Richard "Doc" Sauers recorded his 250th career win. Jordan, a 6-foot, 175-pound forward, capped his career with a 31-point outing against Ithaca. He averaged 15.8 points and 8.8 rebounds in 22 games.

A native of Green Island, N.Y. (LaSalle Institute), Jordan also played on the UAlbany freshman team in 1967-68. His 24.7 scoring average nearly broke the frosh

single-season record.

Jordan, who has a B.S. in accounting, is the Director of Bureau of Compliance and Audit within the New York State Department of Health. He has worked for the State of New York for 28 years, including the departments of education and social services and the bureau of medical facility audits.

He lives in Clifton Park, N.Y. with his wife, Patti, and their four children, John, Michael, Tom and Anne. John graduated from Georgetown University, where he was the Big East Conference indoor mile run champion. Tom attended the University of Rhode Island.

Pat Ryder (1986-89) -- Ryder, a versatile athlete who could run and pass, is one of the top quarterbacks in the UAlbany football program's 28-year history.

Ryder, a 6-foot-3, 200-pound athlete, won four varsity letters and received the team's most valuable player award on three occasions. In 1989, he became just the second player to finish the season as both the squad's top passer and rusher. He ended his career with 14 school records.

As a passer, Ryder is second on the school's all-time lists in passing yards (3,153), completions (233), and attempts (514), and is tied for second with 25 touchdown passes. He threw for 1,054 yards and 10 TDs as a junior, and recorded a career-high 191 passing yards against St. Lawrence in that same season.

Ryder, who directed a wishbone offense in the late 1980s, was the most elusive running quarterback in UA annals. He is currently fourth on the all-time list with 2,245 rushing yards. Ryder rushed for a career-best 161 yards in 30-17 victory over Rensselaer on October 3, 1987, and ran for 158 yards on 23 carries against Springfield as a senior.


Ryder's combined running and passing talents place him second on the career total offense chart with 5,398 yards and 11th in career all-purpose yards. He amassed 1,613 total yards as sophomore, and followed with 1,506 in 1988 when he served as team captain.

Ryder was UAlbany's career scoring leader for nearly a decade until his standard was eclipsed last year. He scored 30 touchdowns and accounted for 186 points. His 30 rushing TDs is still an all-time mark.

Anative of Newburgh, N.Y. (Wallkill H.S.), Ryder has been a small business owner in his home area for the last six years. He owns a Subway franchise in Red Hook, N.Y., and a convenience store in Newburgh. Following graduation with a B.S. in economics and a minor in business administration, Ryder played semi-professional



Wagner (2-1, NEC 2-0) trailed 30-17 heading into the final period, but reached paydirt three times in the quarter to pull out the victory. 
JESSICA WALTON NAMED ECAC CROSS COUNTRY PERFORMER OF THE WEEK



UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ANNOUNCES MEN'S AND WOMEN'S BASKETBALL SCHEDULES

ALBANY, N.Y. – University at Albany Director of Athletics and Recreation Dr. Lee McElroy announced today the men's and women's basketball schedules for the 2000-2001 season. The Great Danes are competing as a NCAA Division I independent for the second straight year.

Big East Conference member Syracuse, who advanced to the 2000 NCAA Tournament's Midwest Regional, and NIT Tournament participant California highlight the men's away schedule. The Great Danes will also meet Northeast Conference champion Central Connecticut State in the Mohegan Sun Classic and possibly Utah State, who reached the NCAA's first round with a 28-6 record, and was unbeaten in Big West Conference play, in the Gossner Foods Classic in Logan, Utah.

The Great Danes have a 13-game home schedule at the Recreation and Convocation Center. Lafayette, the Patriot League champion, Harvard, Army, Colgate, Bucknell, Monmouth and Dartmouth are among those teams who will visit the UAlbany campus.

Scott Beeten, who was hired as Albany's head coach on August 1, has seven letterwinners returning off last year's 11-17 squad. **Will Brand**, a 6-foot-5 junior forward, is the top returning scorer (11.2 ppg) and rebounder (5.9 pg).

The UAlbany women's schedule features a challenging 13-game home slate, including Mississippi State, a 24-win club in the Southeastern Conference who was ranked 12th in the final Associated Press national poll. Dartmouth, the Ivy League champion, Harvard and Pennsylvania are among the other home opponents. The Great Danes will open the season with a two-game trip to Colorado and Denver, plus play in Lehigh University's Christmas Classic and Stetson University's Hatter Classic.

Head coach **Mari Warner** is in her 19th season at the helm, and will build her club around seniors **Liz Tucker**, a 5-foot-10 forward, and **Dawn DiMicco**, a 5-foot-5 guard. Tucker averaged 12.7 points and 7.4 rebounds, while DiMicco scored at a 6.4 clip. The Great Danes finished their inaugural Division I campaign with a 12-15 record.

There are three home men's and women's doubleheaders this season. All three dates fall on Saturday evenings with the women scheduled for 5:30 p.m. and the men to follow at 7:30 p.m. On January 27, the women meet Dartmouth and the men play Stony Brook. Both UAlbany teams face Army on February 3 and Bucknell on February 24.
