Members of Local 301 voted to accept the alternate proposal offered by the G.E. Co. during the recent negotiations. The IUE-GE Conference Board left the choice of alternate proposals up to the discretion of each local union.

#### The proposals were:

1. A 3% wage increase effective Oct. 24, 1960, and a 4% increase on April 2, 1962...or,

2. A 3% wage increase effective Oct. 24, 1960 and a 3% increase on April 2, 1962 plus 1 extra holiday
