W^r Forsyth, W^r Austin & W^r Jomread were
appointed the Standing Committee of Accounts for the
current year.

The Secretary reported that the Rev^d W. W.
Moore, in charge of the care & board of the Indian
Pupils of the Normal School, had left the city
& previous to doing so, had, in common, with a
number of other respectable citizens, recommended
James E. Fellen, as his substitute & successor.

The Secretary further reported, that, as it was vacated, he had desired Mr Felt, to take charge of such of the Indians, as might remain in town, until the further order of the Committee.

Whereupon, the Committee agreed that Mr Felt, be appointed; on the same conditions, as there agreed to with the Rev W. W. Moore, subject of course to the power of the Committee to terminate the same on due notice.

A Communication was received from Mr Felt, asking an increase of salary, which was ordered to be on the Fall.

The Secretary of State, reported progress as to the Statistics solicited from him at the last meeting.

Mr Townsend from the Committee of Arrangements, appointed for the last public Exercise, reported that the Committee had passed a vote of thanks to the Hon. W. C. C. & the Principal of the State Normal School, for their address, delivered & requested copies for publication, all of which was unanimously sanctioned.

The Secy reported that paying all the accounts properly chargeable, for the 1st half of the present school year, there appeared to be a balance in favour of the School of
