In addition, the first-place institution in final season-ending tournament standings receives two points multiplied by the total number of teams participating in the tournament. The second-place institution receives two less points, the third place institution four less points and so on down to the last place institution which receives two points.

Award: The recipient of the Walter Peterson President's Cup will be presented with a rotating trophy, as well as a permanent trophy or wall banner.



WALTER PETERSON PRESIDENT'S CUP

Walter Peterson President's Cup: To recognize the member institution whose teams compile the strongest overall record during the academic year in all conference sponsored sports or sports where a season-ending tournament is conducted.

Method of Awarding Points: The final point standings for the Walter Peterson President's Cup would be based on each respective member institutions finish in the conference standings during regular-season competition in six sports and season-ending tournament competition in eight sports, which are as follows:

* Points for both regular-season and season-ending tournament will be included in the point calculation.

In all team sports, the first place institution in the regular-season standings receives four points multiplied by the total number of teams involved in conference play. The second-place institution receives four less points; the third-place institution receives eight less points and so on down to the last place institution which receives four points. In addition, the first-place institution in final season-ending tournament standings receives two points multiplied by the total number of teams participating in the tournament. The second-place institution receives two less points, the third place institution four less points and so on down to the last place institution which receives two points.

Award: The recipient of the Walter Peterson President's Cup will be presented with a rotating trophy, as well as a permanent trophy or wall banner.
