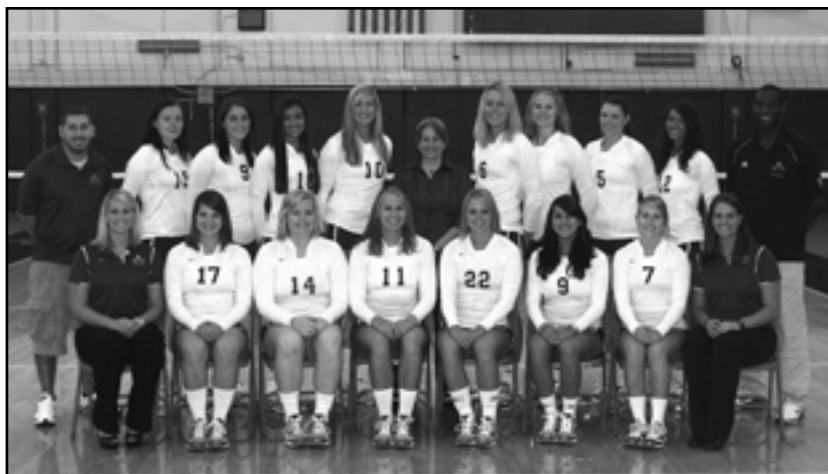

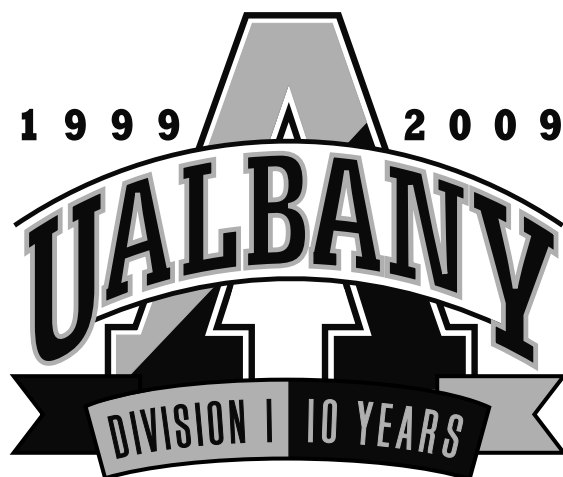

HEAD COACH MJ ENGSTROM



University at Albany Vice President and Director of Athletics Lee McElroy announced that MJ Engstrom was named head volleyball coach in the spring of 2009. Engstrom, who was appointed interim head women's volleyball coach on March 5, 2008, was previously a collegiate head coach at two other institutions. She was elevated to interim coach from her role as a UAlbany assistant.

Last season Engstrom led the Great Danes to their third consecutive America East Conference title and fourth in the last five seasons. The Great Danes played in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, taking on #2 Stanford. She mentored the league's player, setter and defensive specialist of the year, leading UAlbany to a 23-9 overall record. The Great Danes' 12-0 conference slate was the first undefeated record posted in the league since 2001. Senior Kamisha Kellam earned all-conference first-team honors as the league's player of the year, while Laurie Gonzalez earned the defensive specialist of the year and Brooke Stanley was named the conference's setter of the year.

Kellam was also named the America East Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, becoming the third straight Great Dane to earn the distinction. Stanley and Amanda Cowdrey joined Kellam on the all-tournament team, and all three were later awarded all-conference first team honors. Hillary White joined Gonzalez on the all-conference second team, while Gonzalez and Kalyn Mostert earned all-league rookie team accolades. Gonzalez was later chosen by USA Volleyball to play on the U.S. National Women's A2 Team.

Engstrom completed her third season as the top assistant in 2007. She helped guide UAlbany to its third conference championship in four seasons and produced the program's first NCAA Tournament victory. UAlbany finished 24-10 overall and reached the NCAA's second round for the first time in team history. Engstrom, who has served as recruiting coordinator for the last three seasons, has been instrumental in the Great Danes' success by bringing in one of the program's top classes one year ago.

Freshman Amanda Cowdrey was named the 2007 America East rookie

of the year and earned all-conference second-team accolades. She was also joined on the all-rookie squad by classmates Brooke Stanley and Tawny Dahmes.

Engstrom came to UAlbany after five seasons as the head coach of Nicholls State University in Louisiana. She led the Colonials to the 2003 Southland Conference Tournament championship and the first NCAA Tournament berth in program history. Engstrom also spent two years at the helm of the Villanova volleyball program, guiding the Wildcats to their first NCAA appearance in 1997. The tournament berth was the first at-large bid for a Big East Conference program.

Along with her head coaching experience, Engstrom served as an assistant coach at the University of Washington from 1998-99 and the University of North Dakota from 1990-93. She has also worked with the USA Men's and Women's National Volleyball teams and has run her own volleyball camp in conjunction with Coastal Virginia's volleyball club since 1997.

Engstrom, a native of St. Paul, Minn., is on the editorial board for the International Journal for Volleyball Research and is a member of the USA Volleyball Sports Medicine and Performance Commission. She was a student-athlete at the University of Minnesota and received a degree in psychology in 2000.

ASHLEE REED**

Ashlee Reed returns to the Great Danes' sideline in her second season as an assistant coach with the UAlbany program.

Reed joins the Great Danes' coaching staff after a four-year career with the UAlbany program. Reed, a three-time all-conference first-team member, graduated with B.S. in human biology and psychology from UAlbany in 2006. She earned the ECAC Merit Award as the school's top senior female student-athlete and was the America East Conference Woman of the Year. Reed, a two-year team captain, was a four-time academic honor roll member and helped lead the Great Danes to two consecutive America East Conference championship titles. Reed, a native of Round Rock, Texas, ranks in the top ten on several of UAlbany's career records charts, including kills (5th, 1,173), digs (6th, 1,101) and total blocks (tied for 4th, 282).

Following graduation, Reed worked as an assistant athletic trainer at UAlbany and also served as a medical assistant at Capital Region Orthopaedic Group. Reed also assisted in coaching at several UAlbany volleyball camps and participated in numerous community service activities during her collegiate career. She was a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and earned the President's Award for Leadership in 2005-06.

Kimi Freeburg begins her second season as an assistant with the UAlbany volleyball program.

Freeburg came to UAlbany after a four-year career at the University of Southern California, where she was a two-time co-captain. Freeburg, a native of New Castle, Ind., was a Pacific-10 Conference All-Freshman Team honorable mention in 2003, the same season the Trojans claimed the NCAA Division I National Championship Title. She also helped USC reach the NCAA Final Four in 2004.

Freeburg, a three-time Indiana All-State honoree, graduated in May with a B.S. in kinesiology from USC. She participated in a two-week summer tour of Turkey in 2006 with Athletes in Action and has worked at numerous volleyball camps, including the Purdue University summer camp and the Steve Pickering All-American Volleyball Camp.

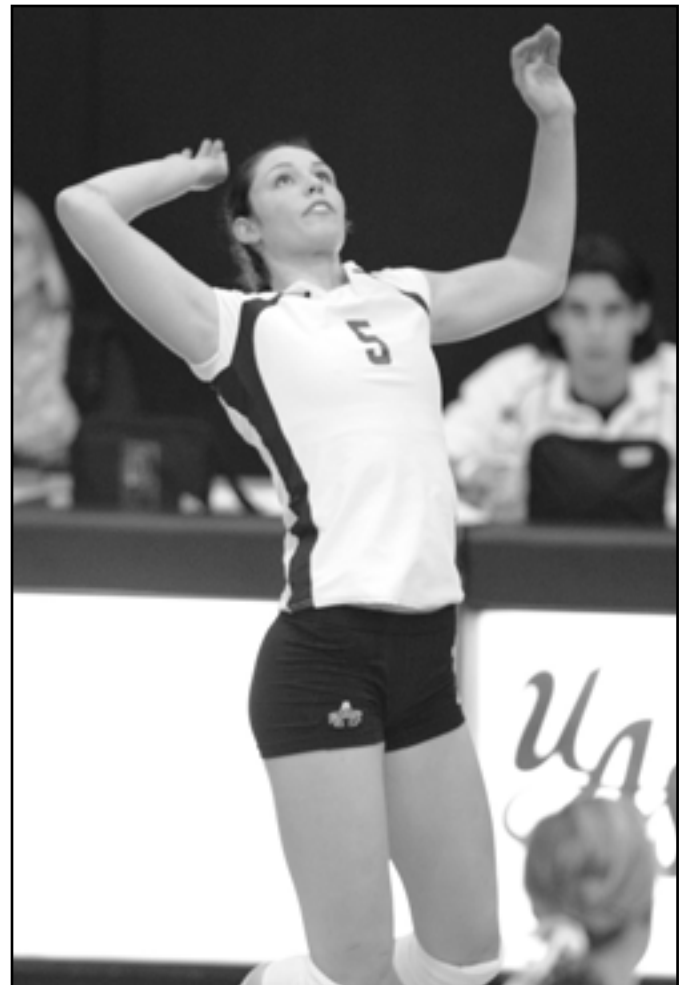

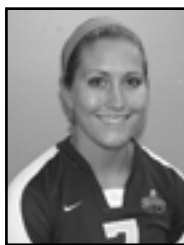

Student-Athlete Advisory Committee -- The purpose of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) is to serve as liaisons between the athletic administration and student-athletes. The members of SAAC act as the "voice" of the student-athletes and disseminate information given to them, by administrators, to their respective teams. SAAC is a vehicle for student-athletes to improve upon student-athlete welfare, as well as help coordinate community service, life skills and various other activities for the athletic department.

Compliance Guidelines for Boosters

For the benefit of the many alumni, fans and booster club members who are so active in supporting and assisting the the Great Danes throughout the year, UAlbany Athletic Compliance would like to remind everyone of a few definitions and rules that apply to all athletic representatives and boosters.

UAlbany is committed to observing the NCAA guidelines concerning representatives of athletic interests (also known as boosters) and institutional control. Our institutional responsibility to rules compliance includes responsibility for actions of all individuals and organizations engaged in activities promoting UAlbany's athletics interests.

Institutional Control -- It is the responsibility of UAlbany to control its intercollegiate athletics program in compliance with the rules and regulations of the NCAA.

Responsibility -- UAlbany's responsibility for the conduct of its program includes the responsibility for the actions of its staff members and for the actions of any other individual, booster or organization engaged in activities promoting the athletic interests of the institution.

Compliance -- UAlbany must monitor its program to assure compliance

and to identify and report to the NCAA such instances in which compliance has not been achieved. An institution found to have violated NCAA rules is subject to disciplinary and corrective actions as determined by the NCAA.

Athletic Representative/Booster -- You are considered to be a UAlbany athletic representative if you are a present or past member of a UAlbany booster club or agency that promotes the intercollegiate athletics program; have made financial contributions to the athletic department or to an athletic booster organization; are, or have been providing benefits (e.g., summer jobs, meals, etc.) to enrolled student-athletes, their family members or friends; are, or have been involved in any manner of promoting the UAlbany intercollegiate athletics program.

Prospective Student-Athlete -- A prospective student-athlete is a student who has started classes for the ninth grade or above, including students in prep schools and junior colleges as well as students who have officially withdrawn from a four-year institution and plan to transfer to another institution. In addition, a student who has not started classes for the ninth grade becomes a prospective student-athlete if the institution or a booster provides the individual or the individual's relatives or friends with any financial assistance or benefits that the institution does not provide to prospective students in general.

Lee McElroy, Vice President & Director of Athletics



Dr. Lee A. McElroy Jr. is in his tenth year as the University at Albany's Vice President and Director of Athletics. McElroy provides leadership for UAlbany's NCAA Division I 19-sport intercollegiate athletics program for men and women and is a member of the University's Executive Committee. He continues to lead the development of a master plan to upgrade the school's athletic and recreational complex.

In 2008-09, he was recognized as the Under Armour Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Northeast Region Athletic Director of the Year. He was also among ten current athletics directors named by the NCAA to a new program called the NCAA Champions Forum in an effort to bring minority football coaches closer to the mindset of athletic directors with regard to the hiring process.

During his tenure, UAlbany has won 37 conference championships, two IC4A track titles and made 15 NCAA appearances in men's basketball, men's lacrosse, softball, women's volleyball, baseball, women's field hockey and men's and women's track and field. In 2004-05, the Great Danes were awarded the Commissioner's Cup as the America East Conference's top athletic program.

McElroy, who served as president of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) in 2006-07, was a key figure when the University successfully completed the NCAA's second cycle of Division I athletics certification. He was honored with the 2004 General Robert R. Neyland Outstanding Athletic Director Award by the All-American Football Foundation.

McElroy, who played football at UCLA in the late 1960s, was previously American University's director of athletics for four years. American, a Division I school in Washington, D.C., competed in the Colonial Athletic Association. In that period, the AU athletic department upgraded to 19 sports, expanded corporate partners by 400 percent, and planned capital projects for a fitness facility, intramural field and soccer stadium. McElroy founded the Eagle Club, the department's fundraising arm, and developed a program rated as one of the top ten in the nation in its compliance with NCAA gender equity requirements.

Dr. McElroy served as president of the America East Conference Executive Committee in the 2003-04 academic year, and has gained national prominence for his roles with numerous professional organizations and NCAA committees. He served a three-year term on the NCAA Division I Management Council as one of four at-large representatives from I-AA or I-AAA conferences. McElroy previously worked on four prestigious NCAA Committees: Athletics Certification, Financial Aid, Degree Completion Program, and the NCAA Special Committee on Agents and Amateurism.

In 1998, McElroy was named to the NACDA Executive Committee for the University Division, and chair of the Sears Directors Cup Committee. The Sears Directors Cup is the only national award and academic scholarship program to recognize all NCAA and NAIA championship sports for women and men.

From 1989-96, McElroy was the director of athletics at California State University-Sacramento. He led the program's transition to Division I and engineered a move to the Big Sky and Big West conferences. He also implemented a strategic plan that developed a corporate partners plan, created an effective fundraising and marketing program, redesigned academic support services, improved athletic facilities, and provided for campus and community outreach programs.

McElroy also worked at the University of Houston from 1981 to 1988 as an assistant director of men's and women's sports and as an associate director of athletics, and for one year as the director of athletics at The University of the District of Columbia. Before joining the Houston staff, he taught in the public school systems of Santa Monica, California and Beaumont, Texas, and was a high school principal in Beaumont.

Along with his duties for the NCAA, McElroy has testified before congressional committees on issues in college athletics, such as gender equity, the welfare of the minority student-athlete, and the academic/athletic balance. McElroy serves on the boards of the National Consortium of Academics and Sports, Athletic Business magazine, and the National Minority Golf Association. He is also a fellow at the Institute of Ethics and Sportsmanship at the University of Rhode Island.

McElroy, who resides with his wife, Karen, in Slingerlands, earned his B.S. in political science and history from UCLA in 1970. He later received a M.Ed. from the University of Southern California, and an Ed.D. from the University of Houston.

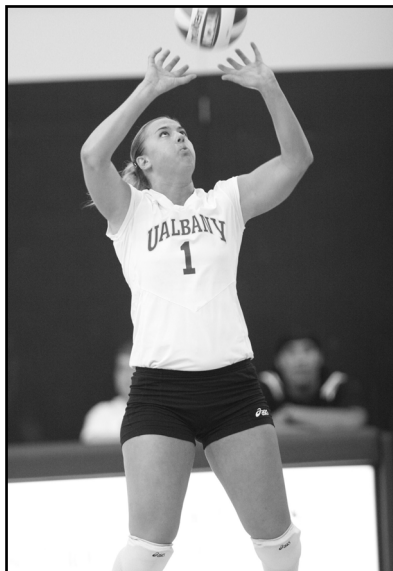
