UALBANY VOLLEYBALL SWEEPS BINGHAMTON IN BATTLE FOR AMERICA EAST LEAD

Albany, N.Y. – Shelby Goldman had 15 kills and 13 digs as UAlbany upended Binghamton, 3-0, in a battle for first place in the America East Conference standings on Monday evening at University Gymnasium. The Great Danes, who lost the first meeting between these teams one month ago, won by scores of 30-21, 30-17 and 30-27.

UAlbany (14-9, AE 7-2) reversed a 13-10 deficit in the first game with 13 of the next 16 points. Ashley DeNeal, a senior outside hitter, belted back-to-back kills to put her team ahead, 18-16. Goldman later added her fifth kill of the opening frame to become the school's all-time leader in that category. She passed UAlbany Hall-of-Famer Patty Munhall (1983-86) in that category, and now has 1,549 for her career.

The Great Danes, who have won seven of their last eight outings, also controlled the second game. UAlbany led 21-17, but then ripped off nine unanswered points to close out the scoring. Ashley Crenshaw, who had six kills and six block assists, started the streak by smacking Blair Buchanan's back set for a winner. DeNeal, who had seven kills and 12 digs, ended the run with a service ace.

Binghamton (12-15, AE 6-2) played a tighter third game behind the play of 6-foot-2 Jacki Kane, who had a team-high eight kills, and senior middle blocker Megan Hoag, who added six kills and 19 digs. But the Bearcats, who had a four-game win streak halted, were undone when they committed two costly errors with the score tied at 26 apiece.

"I thought we played with much more poise than the first time," said UAlbany coach Kelly Sheffield, who saw his team lose 30-24, 30-28 and 30-24 on Sept. 29. "From the beginning we were frantic and did not keep our composure. But tonight our defense was right where it was supposed to be and we made an adjustment with our blocking. I like how we are improving."

Kamisha Kellam, a 6-foot-1 sophomore, had 10 kills, her sixth time in double figures this season, with four blocks. Hillary White turned in her best all-around effort as a middle blocker with seven kills, 12 digs and six blocks.

TESKA KOCH NAMED AMERICA EAST FIELD HOCKEY ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Boston, Mass. – Freshman midfielder Teska Koch has been tabbed America East Conference Rookie of the Week for field hockey, as announced Monday by the conference office.

Koch scored two goals, including the game winner in overtime, to lead UAlbany to a 3-2 win over Vermont last Saturday. With the win, the Great Danes clinched a share of the America East regular-season title, the first for the program since joining the conference in 2001. Both of Koch's goals were unassisted. The first came two minutes into the second period while the second came 7:11 into the overtime period. A shot by Kristin Holder was blocked by Vermont goalkeeper Kristen Heavens, with the rebound bouncing back to Koch, who directed the ball into the cage.

Koch finished the regular season third on the team in scoring with nine goals and three assists for 21 points. UAlbany (12-6, AE 4-1) is seeded second for the conference postseason tournament, and will face Maine on Friday, Nov. 3 in the semifinal round.

JASON FRALICKER CHOSEN NEC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Somerset, N.J. – University at Albany's Jason Fralicker has been chosen Northeast Conference Special Teams Player of the Week in football, as announced Monday by the conference office. He earned the weekly award for the second time this season.

Fralicker, a junior place-kicker from North Tonawanda, N.Y., booted two field goals of 31 and 39 yards in last Saturday's 34-0 victory against Wagner. He made his first kick with 40 seconds left in the first half and added a 39-yarder with 4:49 remaining in the third quarter. Fralicker connected on all four of his point-after attempts, plus handled kickoffs with one touchback.

Fralicker established the program's Division I-AA record with his 10th field goal of the season, breaking a mark set by Bryan Bagstad in 2001. His current total is second on the all-time list, as Scott Reagan kicked 12 field goals in 1985. Fralicker leads the team in scoring with 54 points, having made 10-of-15 fields and 24-of-24 PATs.

HALL AND CEUS NAMED TO AMERICA EAST MEN'S SOCCER ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM

Boston, Mass. – UAlbany senior defenseman Stephan Hall and sophomore goaltender Steward Ceus were selected to the America East Conference men's soccer all-academic team on Monday, Oct. 30. To qualify for the squad, student-athletes must have a grade-point average of 3.00 or above entering the season. Athletically, they are required to be a nominee on the post-season awards ballot, which is determined by the league's head coaches.

Hall, who entered the season with a 3.98 GPA, is currently pursuing his master's degree in information technology and graduated from UAlbany in May 2006 with a degree in urban planning and minors in history and psychology. A two-time team captain, he was chosen as an *ESPN The Magazine* First Team Academic All-American after the 2005 season and was named to the America East Commissioner's Honor Roll and the UAlbany Athletic Director's Honor Roll. Hall finished second on the UAlbany squad in points, netting two goals and two assists.

Ceus, a biology major, appeared in 18 of the team's 19 matches this season, earning seven victories and putting together a 1.34 goals-against average. As of Oct. 22, he was fifth in the nation with 5.53 saves per game. Ceus received the Enterprise Freshman Male Outstanding Student-Athlete Award last season as a freshman.

UALBANY FOOTBALL MOVES UP IN DIVISION I-AA MID-MAJOR POLLS

Albany, N.Y. – Following last Saturday's 34-0 victory over Wagner, UAlbany moved up two spots in both NCAA Division I-AA mid-major football polls on Monday. The Great Danes are fifth in The Sports Network poll and are seventh in the Football Gazette rankings.

UAlbany (6-3, NEC 4-1) recorded back-to-back shutouts for the first time since 1998 by limited Wagner to 140 total yards, including 21 through the air. The defensive unit is eight in scoring defense (13.1 ppg) and ninth in total defense (246.8 ypg) among the I-AA national leaders. Meanwhile, the Great Danes have rushed for more than 250 yards in each of its last three games. Omar Johnson ran for two first-half touchdowns last week.

The Great Danes, who moved into a four-way tie for first place in the Northeast Conference standings, travel to Robert Morris on Saturday, Nov. 4. Kickoff is 1:00 p.m. ET. -agate-

UALBANY MEN'S SOCCER FALLS IN DOUBLE OVERTIME IN A-EAST QUARTERFINALS

Albany, N.Y. – Boston University sophomore forward **Peter Sigurdsson** scored the game-winning goal in double overtime as the Terriers defeated UAlbany, 1-0, in the quarterfinals of the America East Conference tournament on Sunday, Oct. 29 at Varsity Field.

The Great Danes outshot Boston U. 9-6 in regulation, with UAlbany all-rookie defenseman **Brian Gordon** registering three shots. Sigurdsson, a member of the second all-conference team, scored with 6:35 remaining in the second overtime period, putting home a rebound after a corner kick by sophomore midfielder **Neil Hlavaty**. Terriers goaltender **Zach Riffett** made five saves for his eighth victory of the season, while sophomore keeper **Steward Ceus** stopped three shots in the loss for the Great Danes.

It was the third consecutive postseason appearance for UAlbany (7-10-2). Boston University (10-4-4) advances to the tournament's semifinals, facing No. 1 seed Binghamton on Wednesday.

ROSADA EARNS AMERICA EAST WOMEN'S SOCCER ALL-ROOKIE TEAM HONORS

Boston, Mass. – UAlbany freshman midfielder **Jaclyn Rosada** was named to the America East Conference's all-rookie team, as announced by the conference on Saturday.

Rosada tied for the Great Danes' team lead with six goals and was also tied for second with two assists. Five of the goals came in a five-match stretch from Sept. 12-28, when UAlbany went 3-2 and scored 17 goals as a team. She also tallied the lone goal in the Great Danes' 1-0 victory over Delaware State on Sept. 1, breaking the program's 17-match losing streak.

The native of Ridgewood, N.J., was a four-year letterwinner and three-year starter at Ramapo High, where whe was also an All-New Jersey selection as a senior and a three-time all-league honoree.

The Great Danes, who went 5-13-1 overall and 2-6 in conference play, reached several milestones on the season, including their first America East victory since 2002 with a 3-1 win over Vermont on Sept. 28, and their highest win total since joining Division I in 1999.

Albany, N.Y. – Omar Johnson rushed for two first-half touchdowns and Trevor DuPont returned an interception 22 yards for another score, as UAlbany posted its third straight win in a 34-0 shutout of Wagner in Northeast Conference play on Saturday afternoon at rain-soaked University Field.

UAlbany (6-3, NEC 4-1) shook off an early interception to score on four of its next five possessions in building a 24-0 halftime lead. Johnson, a 6-foot, 215-pound junior, capped a short drive by pounding through the middle on a 3-yard touchdown run. Quarterback Daniel Bocanegra, who threw for 98 yards and ran for 50 more, kept the sequence alive with a 16-yard completion to Mike Wall on third down.

After a fumbled punt return by Rashad Barksdale, Wagner (4-5, NEC 0-5) set up at the UAlbany 23. But the series stalled out when quarterback Matt Abbey's fourth-down throw was knocked down by defensive tackle Michael Dungey. The Great Danes, who piled up 382 total yards, including 266 on the ground, went work from that point.

Senior tailback Marcus Allen, who had 11 carries for a team-leading 72 yards, cut off right guard on a 7-yard scoring run with 8:47 left in the second quarter. Linebacker Dan Barnes then recovered Jason Butler's fumble on a screen pass to jump start a drive that led to his team's third touchdown. Johnson, who added 65 rushing yards on 14 attempts, reached paydirt on a 4-yard blast over right guard for a 21-0 lead. Jason Fralicker completed the run of points with a 31-yard field goal with 40 seconds left before the intermission.

Fralicker added a 39-yarder with 4:49 left in the third period to set the school's Division I-AA record with his 10th field goal this season. DuPont's fourth-quarter interception runback capped the scoring, as the UAlbany defense registered back-to-back shutouts for the first time since 1998. The Seahawks, who committed four turnovers, managed just 140 total yards, including 21 through the air.

"Our defensive line has been awesome," said UAlbany coach Bob Ford, whose team held their opponent to less than 165 yards for the second straight week. "We use seven kids in there, try to rotate and keep them fresh. We ran the ball well again. I was impressed with our attitude."

The Great Danes, who won for the sixth straight time in this series, moved into a four-way tie for first place in the conference standings. Freshman Justin Gannon was one of four players with more than 40 rushing yards. Butler, a junior tailback who converted from defensive back this season, led all runners with 98 yards on 22 carries. Wagner, after opening with four wins to start the season, suffered its fifth consecutive defeat.

"This feels good because we are back where we should be (in the standings)," said UAlbany's Jacob Anderson, a 6-foot-6, 300-pound senior who made his first start at right guard after moving over from tackle due to injuries on the line. "It was interesting playing at guard. I had to block more straight ahead, but I knew my assignment. You feel like you are out an island sometimes at tackle."

UALBANY VOLLEYBALL HOLDS ON FOR 3-2 WIN OVER NEW HAMPSHIRE

Albany, N.Y. – Sophomore middle blocker **Kamisha Kellam**'s block off an attack from New Hampshire's **Emmy Blouin** provided the game-winning point in leading UAlbany to a 3-2 comeback win over the Wildcats on Saturday evening in University Gymnasium. The Great Danes won the first two games by scores of 30-24 and 30-24 before New Hampshire won the next two by scores of 30-25 and 30-25. UAlbany claimed the fifth and deciding game, 15-13.

New Hampshire got ahead 10-5 in the final game before two straight handling errors cut the lead to 10-7. UAlbany recorded five straight points to reverse a 12-8 deficit. Junior defensive specialist **Bev Hazell** converted a service ace to put her team ahead. Hazell's next serve went long to tie the score at 13-all, but senior outside hitter **Shelby Goldman** smashed a kill on the left side to put the Great Danes back up by one, 14-13. Blouin attacked on the next rally, with Kellam coming up with a solo block to end the match.

Goldman, who is now just four kills away from the school's all-time record, notched 18 kills and 14 digs for her fourth straight double-double. Junior middle blocker **Ashley Crenshaw** posted 17 kills and four block assists while senior outside hitter **Ashley DeNeal** led the team defensively with 21 digs to go along with 15 kills. Senior libero **Kristin Fiorillo** had 16 digs and five service aces while Hazell recorded a match-high six service aces.

Blouin and senior outside hitter **Sarah Rehn** led four players in double-digits for New Hampshire (8-15, AE 3-5), recording 16 kills each. Freshmen middle blockers **Kirsten Bates** and **Lindsay Fogarty** each added 11 kills. Blouin and Bates posted double-doubles with 14 and 17 digs apiece. Freshman defensive specialist **Alyse Lahti** led the team defensively with 27 digs.

UAlbany (13-9, AE 6-2), won its third five-game conference match at home this season. The Great Danes will continue America East play on Monday, hosting Binghamton at 7 p.m. The match will be televised on Time Warner Cable (TW3).

UALBANY CROSS COUNTRY TEAMS TAKE SEVENTH AT A-EAST MEET

Orono, Maine – Junior **Ricardo Estremera** led the UAlbany men's cross country team, while sophomores **Jessica Ortman** and **Jenna Ortman** registered top-10 finishes on the women's side, as both Great Danes' squads finished seventh out of nine teams at the America East Cross Country Championships on Saturday, Oct. 28, hosted by the University of Maine.

Estremera came in seventh in a time of 24:58.70, his fourth top-10 finish in five races this season. Three other UAlbany runners earned top-50 finishes. Junior **Joe Choiniere** clocked in at 26:19.20, good for 36th place, while junior **Ryan Gaedje** and sophomore **Brian Yurkewecz** were 43rd and 44th, respectively. The men's race was won by New Hampshire, which had seven harriers in the top 30. Maine's **Kirby Davis** earned top individual honors, posting a meet-best 24:32.40.

Jessica Ortman paced the Great Danes' women, covering the course in 17:36.60 and coming in sixth place. Jenna Ortman finished eighth in a time of 17:47.90. Junior **Danielle Trimpop** also placed in the top 50, registering a time of 19:09.50, 40th-best in the race. Boston University, which had seven runners in the top 20, won the team race. It was the third consecutive title, and fifteenth America East championship overall, for the Terriers. New Hampshire's **Catherine Parker**, who won the UAlbany Invitational on Oct. 14, finished first in a time of 16:50.30.

The men's all-conference team, which is made up of the top 10 finishers in the event, included Estremera, while both Ortmans were a part of the women's squad.

The Great Danes will compete at the NCAA Regional meet in Bronx, N.Y., on Saturday, Nov. 1.

FIELD HOCKEY CLINCHES SHARE OF A-EAST TITLE WITH 3-2 OVERTIME VICTORY

Burlington, Vt. – Freshman midfielder **Teska Koch** scored two goals, including the overtime gamewinner, as the UAlbany field hockey team earned a 3-2 victory over America East Conference-rival Vermont in a game on Saturday afternoon at Moulton Winder Field. The win gives the Great Danes a share of the conference's regular-season championship, the first for the field hockey program since joining the league in 2001.

Vermont got on the board at 24:29, when junior forward **Kelly McClintock** tallied her 10th goal of the season, assisted by sophomore forward **Maegan Luce**. UAlbany then tied the game less than three minutes into the second half when Koch scored, unassisted. The Catamounts made it a 2-1 contest at 56:30, as Luce scored off a pass from junior forward **Danielle Collins**, but UAlbany sophomore defender **Michelle Polizois** put home a penalty corner at 62:04, assisted by sophomore midfielder **Arlette Westdorp** and sophomore defender **Meg Rinier**.

The overtime period did not last long, as Koch scored an unassisted goal 2:11 in to give the Great Danes the victory. Sophomore goaltender **Ashley Ross** earned her 11th victory of the season for UAlbany, while freshman **Kristen Heavens** made ten saves in the defeat for Vermont (10-7, AE 3-2)

Boston University will host the America East Conference postseason tournament. UAlbany (12-6, AE 4-1) will face Maine in the semifinals on Friday, Nov. 3, at approximately 2:30 p.m.

YAN GBOLO & BRIAN GORDON EARN AMERICA EAST SOCCER POST-SEASON HONORS

Boston, Mass. – University at Albany's **Yan Gbolo** has been selected to the All-America East Conference second team in men's soccer for the second consecutive year, as announced by the conference office on Thursday, Oct. 26. Freshman defenseman **Brian Gordon** was named to the league's all-rookie team.

Gbolo, a senior striker, leads the Great Danes with four goals and two assists, and is tied for the conference lead with three game-winning goals, all coming in consecutive America East matches from Sept. 23-30. He was named the America East Player of the Week and was chosen to *Soccer America*'s Division I Team of the Week on Oct. 1. Gbolo has scored 17 goals in his four years at UAlbany, second-most since the program moved to Division I in 1999.

Gordon was part of a UAlbany defense that allowed fewer than two goals in 12 matches this season. The Erskine, Scotland, native has started 17 of the team's 18 contests and is tied for second on the team with two goals, including the game-winner with less than three minutes remaining in the Great Danes' 2-1 victory over Maine on Oct. 11.

New Hampshire freshman **Chris Banks**, who led the conference with 12 goals, was named the league's Striker of the Year and Rookie of the Year, while teammate **Brian Levey** repeated as Goalkeeper of the Year. The Wildcats' coaching staff, led by **Rob Thompson**, earned Coaching Staff of the Year honors. **Michael Palacio** of Stony Brook and **Zach Kirby** of Boston University were named Midfielder and Defender of the Year, respectively.

UAlbany, which finished its America East regular-season schedule with a 5-3 record and was 7-9-2 overall, is seeded fourth for the upcoming conference postseason tournament and will face Boston University in the quarterfinal round on Saturday, Oct. 28 at 12 noon.

UALBANY CROSS COUNTRY SEEKS FIRST AMERICA EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

Albany, N.Y. – The University at Albany men's and women's cross country teams will compete at the America East Conference Championships on Saturday, Oct. 28. 



Albany, N.Y. – Quarterback Daniel Bocanegra rushed for two touchdowns and Mike Wall returned the second-half kickoff for another score in leading UAlbany to a 48-0 Northeast Conference victory over St. Francis, Pa. on Saturday afternoon at University Field before a Homecoming crowd of 5,964.

UAlbany (5-3, NEC 3-1) reached the end zone on its opening two possessions. A short punt into a gusty wind set up the first scoring sequence, as the Great Danes had to drive just 40 yards for a 7-0 lead. 

UALBANY FOOTBALL DEFEATS SACRED HEART, 24-13, IN NEC ACTION

Fairfield, Conn. - Marcus Allen rushed for a career-high 149 yards and two touchdowns and Omar Johnson had a career-best 135 yards in leading UAlbany to a 24-13 Northeast Conference victory over Sacred Heart on Saturday afternoon at Campus Field.

UAlbany (4-2, NEC 2-1) took a 21-7 lead in third quarter, when Allen raced around right end with an option pitch on his way to a 65-yard touchdown scamper. The Great Danes, who ended a two-game skid, stayed on the ground during the 5-play, 93-yard drive.

Sacred Heart (2-5, NEC 1-2) came right back on its next posession by marching 71 yards, all through the air, to paydirt. **Tyler Arciaga**, who completed 23 of 38 passes for 206 yards and two touchdowns, threw a 39-yard scoring strike to **Stephen Tedesco** with 3:58 left in the third quarter. However, UAlbany's **Mark Sheehan** blocked the extra-point attempt.

In the fourth quarter, the Great Danes used a rushing attack that piled up exactly 300 net yards and an opportunistic defense to record its first win since beating back-to-back top-25 teams in September. Johnson, a 6-foot, 215-pound junior, had five of his 27 rushing attempts in a 10-play sequence that led to **Jason Fralicker's** career-long 39-yard field goal and a 24-13 lead. Safety **Dave Nicomini** sealed the outcome when he picked off Arciaga at the UAlbany 22-yard line with 2:35 remaining.

"We dominated the offensive and defensive lines of scrimmage and played much smarter overall," said UAlbany head coach Bob Ford, whose team had two 100-yard rushers for the first time since Sept. 13, 2003 against Central Connecticut State. "We did a great job of running the football, especially when you consider two starters were out with injuries."

UAlbany broke a 7-7 tie in the second quarter by grinding out an 81-yard drive. Johnson did the bulk of the work with seven carries for 61 yards in the series. Allen, who went over 1,000 yards for his career, later burst through left side on an 11-yard touchdown run with 6:04 left in the second quarter. The Great Danes stayed ahead at the break when cornerback **Ryan Chrobak** wiped out a Pioneers' threat by forcing Arciaga to cough up the ball on a sack.

The Great Danes grabbed an early 7-0 advantage when quarterback **Daniel Bocanegra** lofted a 31-yard TD pass to **David McCarty** following a Pioneer fumble. McCarty came up with a tipped ball off the hands of his teammate **Mike Wall**. Arciaga directed his team on a 10-play march that tied the contest in the second period. He beat the blitz with a screen pass to **Jason Payne**, who broke several tackles to complete the 30-yard scoring play.

"It all starts up front and our line took it to them for four straight quarters," explained Johnson, whose squad rolled up a season-best 445 total yards, including 145 passing. "We played this game like it was our last one. We've got a loss (in the conference), but we are still in it."

Bocanegra passed for 145 yards and ran for 24 more, but fumbled twice. Stony Brook (2-4, NEC 2-0) came right back with an 80-yard touchdown march. Dudash, who connected on 16-of-22 through the air, hit **Mike Consentino** with a 43-yard pass to key the drive. Halfback **Steve Austin** later took a direct snap and threw a 3-yard TD pass to **Saladin Davis** for a 24-21 advantage with 9:09 left in the third quarter.

The Seawolves, who were coached by former UAlbany fullback and assistant Chuck Priore, then put the game away with solid special teams play. **Dwayne Eley's** 43-yard punt return led to **Luke Gaddis'** 42-yard field goal, his second on the day. A partially blocked punt set up Dudash's 41-yard touchdown strike to a wide-open **Lynell Suggs**.

"We did everything we possibly could wrong. At times it's hard to believe this is the same team that beat Lehigh and Delaware. Stony Brook played very hard. They hurt us with the run game, capitalized on our turnovers and mistakes, and made big plays on special teams," said UAlbany head coach Bob Ford, who was going up against a former player for the first time.

The Seawolves, who posted an impressive 19-point win against unbeaten Monmouth one week ago, used a big-play defense to take a 17-14 halftime lead. Giddings returned a pair of second-quarter fumbles for touchdowns, including a 7-yard runback with 10:52 remaining in the period.

UAlbany drew even with a short drive set up by **Chris Simpson's** 31-yard kickoff return. **Omar Johnson** capped the sequence with a 5-yard blast through the middle. But **Colin Simmons** coughed up the ball on his team's next possession, and Giddings picked up the loose ball en route to a 34-yard touchdown return.

The Great Danes tied the contest at 14 apiece with an 80-yard march on their next offensive series. **Mike Wall's** diving 39-yard reception keyed the scoring drive. Johnson reached paydirt again on a 6-yard run. However, Stony Brook jumped back in front when Gaddis booted a 41-yard field goal on the last play of the first half.

"It was a cluster of things that resulted in this loss. It is very frustrating. We turned the ball over for two touchdowns and the defense played on its heels," said senior **Colin Disch**, who led his team with eight tackles. "We have to be more focused and emphasize all 60 minutes (to turn this around)."

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ANNOUNCES 2007 MEN'S LACROSSE SCHEDULE

Albany, N.Y. – University at Albany Vice President and Director of Athletics Lee McElroy announced today the school's men's lacrosse schedule for the 2007 season. The Great Danes, who made their fifth consecutive appearance in the America East Conference championship final last year, will play five games against conference opponents. The non-league schedule features former national champions Syracuse and Johns Hopkins and last year's NCAA runner-up Massachusetts.

UAlbany starts its eighth season at the NCAA Division I level on Saturday, Feb. 24 against Johns Hopkins, the 2005 NCAA champion. The Great Danes will meet four other programs who were ranked in the USILA's national top-20 poll at the end of last year. UAlbany faces Syracuse (No. 7), Massachusetts (No. 10), UMBC (No. 11) and Johns Hopkins (No. 6), a group of teams who all participated in the 2006 NCAA Tournament. Delaware (No. 15), Colgate and Dartmouth are on the home slate at John Fallon Field. UAlbany also tangles with non-league opponents Yale, Drexel and crosstown-rival Siena. America East Conference competition begins with Hartford on Saturday, March 24 at 1:00 p.m.

Syracuse will host the Great Danes for the fourth consecutive season on Friday, April 20 at the Carrier Dome. The two teams have played a pair of 14-13 thrillers the last two years. The America East postseason tournament, slated for May 3-5, will be held at the highest seed's home facility.

Head coach Scott Marr, a U.S. Team assistant at the 2006 World Championships, led UAlbany to an 8-7 record one year ago. The Great Danes, who ranked third nationally at 11.73 goals per game, return a potent attack. Frank Resetarits, the nation's leading scorer, totaled 45 goals and 19 assists, while Merrick Thomson (Albany Academy) added 31 goals and 11 assists. Brett Queener, a first-team All-America East goalkeeper, posted a .577 save percentage as a junior. All-Conference midfielder Jordan Levine (14 goals, 13 assists) was eighth among the Division I leaders in ground balls with a 5.87 average.



UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ENSHRINES THREE INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Albany, N.Y. – Three former athletes will be enshrined into the University at Albany Athletic Hall of Fame on Friday, October 20 at the 23rd annual HOF Dinner and Induction Ceremony. A reception for the Athletic Hall of Fame inductees begins at 6:00 p.m., with the dinner and ceremony to follow in the Recreation and Convocation Center (RACC) on campus.

The induction ceremony is part of Homecoming and Family Weekend, which also includes Saturday's football game at University Field with Northeast Conference-rival St. Francis, Pa. at 4:00 p.m. A women's field hockey contest with America East Conference opponent Boston University begins at 1:00 p.m.

The new inductees and their sports: **Dawn Di Micco** '00, lacrosse & basketball; **Scott Price** '69, basketball; and **Steve Shoen** '81, football.

With this year's class, there are 111 former athletes, coaches, and administrators who have been inducted into the University at Albany's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Dawn Di Micco (1996-2001) -- One of the top women's lacrosse players in UAlbany history, Di Micco was a two-time All-American on the NCAA Division II level before competing on the program's first two Division I squads. She finished her career as the school's all-time scorer with 182 points, plus was first in assists (61) and ground balls (447) and second in goals (121).

In 1998, Di Micco led the Great Danes to the ECAC Division II championship game and a school-record 11-4 win-loss mark. She was first on the team in scoring with 41 goals and 17 assists for 58 points as a midfielder and was named to the Brine/IWLCA and USWLA All-America squads. During that campaign, Di Micco tied the school's single-game record with seven goals against Shippensburg. She also earned All-America recognition as a freshman, when she had 32 goals and four assists in leading UAlbany to an 8-4 record.

Di Micco battled back from a severe knee injury to play on the school's first Division I teams. She totaled 23 goals and 24 assists as the Great Danes put together an 8-6 mark in her junior season. In 2001, Di Micco led the nation in ground balls at 5.73 per game, plus scored 25 goals and 16 assists with 35 caused turnovers. She posted season-highs in goals (5) and assists (4) against Le Moyne, a point total that was one off the single-game record. Di Micco was voted the UAlbany Female Athlete of the Year for the 2000-01 academic year.

A student-athlete who combined to earn eight varsity letters in two sports, Di Micco played in 106 games and made 63 starts as a member of the UAlbany women's basketball team. She started all 27 games as a senior co-captain and averaged 6.7 points, 2.8 rebounds and 2.1 assists from her guard position.

A native of South Salem, N.Y., Di Micco earned a B.S. in social welfare and psychology in May 2000. She went on to receive a master's degree in social work from UAlbany in 2002. She is currently directing the Army Family Team Building program at Fort Drum in Watertown, N.Y. Her husband, Jeffrey Lucowitz, is a U.S. Army Captain who is serving a tour of duty in Afghanistan as a support operations officer.

Scott Price (1966-69) -- One of the top scorers and rebounders in the history of the men's basketball program, Price helped the Great Danes reach the NCAA Tournament at the College Division level in the late 1960s. He teamed with Rich Margison, who was inducted into the UAlbany Athletic Hall of Fame in 1986, to form was one of the most feared and respected duos in the eastern college ranks.

As a senior co-captain, Price led the Great Danes to the 1969 NCAA College Division East Regional and an 18-6 record. He averaged 11.4 points and 8.1 rebounds per game as a 6-foot-2, 210-pound center. He was named MVP of the Capital City Tournament when he scored 19 points and made two free throws with 20 seconds remaining in a 59-58 victory against crosstown-rival Siena. Price was chosen to the *Knickerbocker News* Capital District Big College All-Star Team for the second consecutive year.

Price averaged 15.9 points and 11.4 rebounds per contest in his junior season. He was voted team MVP after leading the Great Danes to an 18-4 record. A consistent performer, he scored in double figures in 20 of 22 games, including a season-high 25 points against Pratt. He also put together an impressive 17-point, 23-rebound performance versus Plattsburgh on Dec. 6, 1967.

After transfering from Butler University, Price contributed 15.9 points and 11.9 rebounds per game in the 1966-67 season. He was named team MVP for a squad that went 15-7 overall. He scored 24 points and made the winning free throw with two seconds left in a 76-75 win over Siena at the Washington Avenue Armory to avenge an early-season loss against the same school.

Price, who played 68 games as a collegian, finished his career with 973 points and 707 rebounds, a total that currently ranks eighth on the all-time list. He averaged a double-double with 14.3 points and 10.4 rebounds while playing for the legendary Richard "Doc" Sauers. During his three years with the program, the Great Danes were a combined 51-17 overall.

Anative of Clifton Springs, N.Y., Price earned his undergraduate degree from UAlbany in mathematics. He has worked in sales for nearly 30 years with the Rochester Lumber Company, a family-owned home builder. Price and his wife, Judy, have two daughters, Amy and Kami. Following graduation, he played AAU Basketball with the Roseland Raiders for several years.

Steve Shoen (1976-80) -- An All-America defensive lineman in the late 1970s, Shoen was a member of the UAlbany football squad that reached the NCAA Division III playoffs.

Shoen, who played at both defensive tackle and end, led the Great Danes to the 1977 national semifinals and a 9-2 record. UAlbany also recorded an impressive 42-39 road win over Maine, a Division II program at the time. Meanwhile, Shoen and his defensive teammates allowed 92.1 rushing yards and 19.5 points per game. Shoen racked up 142 tackles, 14 sacks, three fumble recoveries and one interception in earning All-ECAC honorable mention recognition. He was selected the *Albany Times Union* Capital Region College Player of the Year. Shoen was twice named to the ECAC's weekly honor roll. He had two sacks, one fumble recovery and one interception in a 13-3 victory against Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT) and totaled 18 tackles in an 18-15 triumph over Cortland.

A6-foot-2, 235-pound defender, Shoen missed the 1978 season for family reasons and the 1979 campaign was shortened due to injuries. However, he came back to serve as co-captain of the 1980 team. In that season, Shoen was chosen to the Associated Press College Division All-America squad in the honorable mention category and as a CoSIDA Division III first-team All-American. Shoen, who was also voted All-ECAC Upstate New York, was twice picked to the ECAC weekly honor roll. He was named the ECAC defensive player of the week when the Great Danes edged Fordham, 17-14.

Shoen received a B.A. in psychology from UAlbany in 1981. He was later accepted into the U.S. Naval Academy's Officer's Training School in Newport, R.I., and graduated with special training in underwater demolition. From 1983-2003, Shoen earned several distinguished awards as Regimental Athletic Coordinator and Special Operations Officer. A veteran of the Persian Gulf War, Shoen was the Commanding Officer of the USS Avenger. He retired from the United States Navy with the rank of Commander and currently works as a Senior Civilian Superintendent.

He currently resides in Marlboro, N.J., with his son Stephen Jr., 20, a sophomore at Rutgers University and a member of the neavyweight crew team, and his daughter Sarah, 17, a senior at Colts Neck High School.
