Whereupon it was resolved that said temporary employment be approved and that he be paid at the rate of \$1200 per annum, to continue until the appointment of a successor to Professor St John shall be made.

The annual report of the Executive Committee of the State Normal School to the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the Regents of the University was read, and approved and ordered to be transmitted.

Dr. J. S. Mosher nominated Sumner H. Babcock, who graduated from the school in 1877, as professor of Natural Science in place of J. S. St John, deceased. Whereupon it was unanimously resolved that Sumner H. Babcock

he is appointed at a salary of \$1500 per annum, and that he commence his term of service at the beginning of the second term on the next Wednesday of February 1883.
