The Executive Committee met at 8 P.M. in the office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

President Waterbury and Architect Wright were also present by invitation.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Committee on Sites reported that a formal proposal had been received from Mrs. Emily Wood Barnes to see for a site for the normal school a plot of ground fronting on the Park and on Lake Avenue (Perry Street), 200 feet on the former by 150 feet deep, making 12 lots 25×100 ft, at the rate of \$1250 per lot or \$15,000 in all.

The committee also reported that Mr. F. Langr offered a plot 132 feet on Central Avenue and 148 ft on Washington Avenue running through Perry Street to Street 190 ft

at its eastern side and 288 feet on the western, the whole forming what is known as Lang's garden; price \$32,000.

President Waterbury by request made a verbal report of the visit made by himself and the architect to school buildings in New York and Brooklyn.

A conference followed as to the merits of the various sites offered for the building, but without further action the committee adjourned to meet on Tuesday morning June 19th at 10 o'clock.
