UALBANY'S MARR CHOSEN AMERICA EAST LACROSSE COACH OF THE YEAR Freshman Goalkeeper Kevin Rae Named Conference's Rookie of the Year

Boston, Mass. – University at Albany's **Scott Marr** has been chosen as the America East Conference Coach of the Year in men's lacrosse as announced today by the conference office. Freshman goalkeeper **Kevin Rae** was selected the conference's Rookie of the Year in voting by the league's head coaches.

The Great Danes, who won the America East regular-season title, made huge strides this spring under Marr's direction. The Great Danes went from a 3-8 record one year ago to 8-6 this season, including a 5-0 mark in league play. Albany's defense is ranked 13th nationally at 8.29 goals per game, and is allowing five goals less per game than in 2001.

Rae, a native of Yorktown Heights, N.Y., is ranked seventh among the nation's leaders in save percentage (.616) and is 19th in goals against average (8.72). He has made 10 or more saves against ten opponents, including a season-high 19 on three occasions. His 180 saves is the highest UAlbany single-season total since 1996.

Senior defenseman **Chris Zaffiro** leads a group of four players who were named to the all-conference squad. Zaffiro, a first-team selection, was fourth on the team in ground balls (32) and marked the opposition's top attackman throughout the season.

Luke Daquino, **Jon Smith** and Rae were chosen to the America East second team. Daquino, a freshman, is fifth among the league's top scorers with 20 goals and 24 assists. He is tied for 19th nationally in assists at 1.71 per game. Smith, a junior midfielder, turned in his best season as a collegian with 14 goals and eight assists.

Daquino and Rae were among four Great Danes voted to the America East Conference All-Rookie Team. Freshman midfielder **Lee Busino** (Niskayuna) is UAlbany's top face-off man with a .527 percentage. **Brendan Russell**, a freshman attacker, is fourth on the team in scoring with 26 points (17 goals, 9 assists).

Albany (8-6) meets Quinnipiac (6-6) in the conference tournament's semifinal round on Wednesday, May 1 at 3:00 p.m. Admission is free at UAlbany's Varsity Field. The America East champion receives an automatic berth in the NCAA Division I Tournament field.

Boston, Mass. – University at Albany's **Kevin Rae** has been chosen as the America East Conference Player of the Week in men's lacrosse as announced today by the conference office. Freshman **Brendan Russell** was selected as the conference's Rookie of the Week.

Rae, a freshman goalkeeper, made 11 of his season-high 19 saves in the first half in leading UAlbany to a 9-4 victory over Hartford on April 27. 

TUCSON, Ariz. — For the third straight week, Clemson (27-2) has been ranked No. 1 in Collegiate Baseball newspaper's NCAA Division I baseball poll.

The Tigers have won 14 of their last 15 games and have outscored opponents by nearly a 3:1 ratio (284 runs to 109). Clemson is hitting .345 as a team with 56 homers in 29 games. The team has also swiped 45 bases and is averaging 9.7 runs per game.

As far as pitching, the Tigers have a 3.26 team ERA and a better than 2:1 strikeout to walk ratio (230 strikeouts, 87 walks). Clemson is also one of the top defensive teams in the nation with a .973 fielding percentage.

POLL NOTES: Several other teams are also on a roll. Florida Atlantic has the longest winning streak in the nation with 22 consecutive wins. It is the longest winning streak for Florida Atlantic since tying the NCAA record in 1999 with 34 straight wins. Mississippi has won 10 straight games, its longest winning streak since the 1964 season. Cal. St. Fullerton has won nine of its last 10 as has East Carolina which took two of three over highly regarded Houston over the past weekend.

The Collegiate Baseball Newspaper poll is the oldest college baseball poll. Its birth took place during the 1957 college baseball season.

LUKE DAQUINO NAMED AMERICA EAST LACROSSE ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Boston, Mass. – University at Albany's Luke Daquino has been chosen as the America East Conference Rookie of the Week in men's lacrosse as announced today by the conference office.

GALLAGHER DRISCOLL NAMED ASSISTANT MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH

Albany, N.Y. – University at Albany head men's basketball coach Will Brown announced today the hiring of Gallagher Driscoll as an assistant coach. Driscoll spent the last two years as an assistant at Loyola College in Maryland.

Driscoll previously worked at UAlbany on Scott Hicks' staff from 1997-2000, as the basketball program made the transition from Division II to the Division I level. The Great Danes reached the ECAC Division II tournament on two occasions, and posted an 11-17 record in the program's inaugural Division I campaign.

"I am confident in Gallagher's ability to teach, coach and interact with young people," said Brown, who was named as Albany's head coach on March 13. "I am familiar with him as a person, and he is familiar with the University as a former staff member. He also brings the experience of having worked at the Division I level."

Driscoll, 32, also coached at Le Moyne College in Syracuse, and the program qualified for the NCAA Division II Tournament in both 1996 and 1997. Prior to that appointment, he was the boys' junior varsity head coach and varsity assistant at West Genesee High School in Central New York for three years.

A 1992 graduate of The College of Saint Rose, Driscoll earned honorable mention All-America honors and was an All-New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC) point guard. A four-year starter and three-time captain, he led the Golden Knights to four consecutive 20-plus win seasons, and a '92 NCAA Tournament berth.

Driscoll, who received a B.S. in political science, graduated as St. Rose's all-time leader in assists (878) and steals (359). He attended Bishop Ludden High School in Syracuse, where he was a two-time all-state and All-Central New York selection, and led his club to the 1987 Class A state final.





Maida, a senior right-hander from Newburgh, N.Y., is one reason why the Great Danes are off to a 15-5 start, and are tied for second place in the conference standings with a 3-1 record. She has surrendered just two earned runs in her last 34.2 innings and registered three shutouts in that span.

Maida leads the conference in victories with a 9-1 record, and is second with a 0.78 earned run average. Albany plays a home doubleheader against Syracuse on Thursday, April 4 at 3:00 p.m.

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY BEGINS SPRING FOOTBALL PRACTICE ON APRIL 6

ALBANY, N.Y. -- University at Albany head football coach **Bob Ford** will have 39 returning lettermen, including 14 starters, available, when the Great Danes begin spring football practice this weekend. The first practice is slated for Saturday, April 6 at 9:30 a.m. on the Western Avenue practice fields. The 15-session schedule continues on Sunday, April 7 (9:30 a.m.) and runs through May 4.

Albany finished 7-3 in its third NCAA Division I-AA campaign in 2001. The Great Danes posted a 5-2 mark in Northeast Conference play, and tied for third place in the standings. Eight starters are back on a defense that ranked 17th in rushing (111.0 yards/game) and 22nd in scoring (19.5 points/game) among the I-AA national leaders. Six offensive starters return from a group that averaged 357.9 total yards, including 182.6 yards on the ground.

"We need to address our physical toughness, and will probably do more hitting this spring than in past years," said Ford, who has registered 177 career victories in 29 varsity seasons as UAlbany's head coach. "We should be a decent football team, but every team has questions to be answered. I am concerned about the wide receiver position, and there are several young players who need to step up and challenge."

Josh Bazan, the *Football Gazette* I-AA Mid-Major Linebacker of the Year, is one reason why UAlbany lowered its scoring defense by nine points per game in 2001. Bazan, at 6-foot and 210 pounds, led the Great Danes in tackles (103), hits for a loss (17) and fumbles defensed (7). **Samson Brown**, a three-time All-Northeast Conference free safety, totaled five interceptions and 10 pass break-ups last year.

Defensive end **John Bolt** (Watervliet), a second-team All-NEC pick, is among three regulars returning on the line. Bolt made 29 tackles and led the team with 5.0 sacks for minus-21 yards. **Josh MacAnn**, a converted outside linebacker, compiled 41 total hits and 3.0 sacks at the other end position. Roverback **Ryan MacLean**, a two-year starter, totaled 77 tackles, including 10 for losses.

Joining Brown in the secondary are cornerbacks **Fred Frese** (Scotia-Glenville), **Cliff Prince** and **Kurt Campbell**. Frese, a two-year regular in the secondary, was fifth on the team in tackles (46) and broke up eight passes.

Ryan Roeder is ready to assume full-time control at quarterback after sharing those duties the last two seasons. Roeder, who missed two games while recovering from off-season surgery, completed 68 of 128 passes for 1,019 yards and seven touchdowns. He led the team in total offense at 132.6 yards per game.

The Great Danes are still solid in the trenches, where five starters are back. **Alex Argulewicz**, at 6-foot-1 and 295 pounds, has made 21 consecutive starts at left guard. He was named to The Sports Network Division I-AA Mid-Major All-America first team. He will be joined on the line by second-team All-NEC left tackle **Geir Gudmundsen** (6-6, 285). Tight end **Greg Sigler** (6-4, 255) improved his pass-catching skills as a junior with 10 receptions for 80 yards and three touchdowns.

Albany's offense lost the services of split end and punt returner Chris Phillis, a three-time all-conference selection who hauled in 20 career scoring receptions, and tailback Brian Manigault, who rushed for 2,251 yards and 24 TDs.

Several players are ready to move into Manigault's tailback spot. **Dustin Wilson**, who led the NEC in kickoff returns with a 27.8 average, was fourth on the team in rushing with 188 yards. **Rohann Vidal**, a sophomore, and **Gary Jones**, a standout at Ravena-Coyemans-Selkirk H.S. and Hudson Valley Community College, will also be in the competition. Fullback **Jon George** (Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake) ran for 201 yards and four TDs as a sophomore.

Spring practice will help determine the future of several wide receivers. Phillis and Jay McFarlane, who combined for 75 catches, have graduated, and top returnee **Matt Crudo**, of LaSalle Institute, (10 receptions, 150 yards, 2 TDs) is an outfielder on the UAlbany baseball team.

All-Conference punter **Billy Pike** averaged 34.5 yards per kick, and placed 19 punts inside the opponents' 20-yards line. The departure of Bryan Bagstad, who is third on the all-time scoring list with 167 points, sets up a battle for the place-kicking duties.

Albany will open its 2002 schedule against defending national champion Montana on September 7. Fall practice begins when he newcomers report on August 17.

Albany, N.Y. – Freshman right-hander **Jeff Mazzola** recorded the school's first no-hitter since 1965 and teammate **Adam Kroft** (Shenendehowa) tossed a two-hit complete game as Albany swept a non-conference doubleheader against Canisius in the Great Danes' home opener Tuesday at Varsity Field. The Great Danes won the opener, 3-2, and followed with a 3-0 victory.

Albany (5-13), who snapped a six-game losing streak, capitalized on the pitching of Mazzola and Kroft as they allowed two hits and no walks over 14 innings. Mazzola, who earned his first win as a collegian, retired the first 16 batters he faced in the nightcap before **Scott Beebe** reached on a hit by pitch spoiling a perfect game bid. Jim Nass, a Schalmont High School graduate and native of Schenectady, threw the last Albany no-hitter against New Paltz 37 years ago.

The Great Danes plated single runs in the third, fifth and sixth innings. **Eddie Scott's** infield single scored **Pat Delaney** all the way from first base as a collision at first base sent the ball into the outfield. Delaney led off the fifth with a single and later crossed on a passed ball. The Great Danes added an insurance run in the sixth as **Nick Ragone** (Christian Brothers Academy) had a pinch-hit single, stole second and scored on an errant throw.

In the opener, Canisius (1-10) led 2-0, but Albany tied the game in the fourth frame. Estes, who added two stolen bases, began the rally with a RBI single and scored on a throwing error by third baseman **Danny Conrad**. **Joe Lamb's** infield hit brought in Scott with the eventual game-winner in the bottom of the sixth. Kroft secured his third win as he allowed one earned run and struck out eight hitters over seven innings to even his record at 3-3. The Great Danes next play a doubleheader at Le Moyne on Thursday.
