The Committee met at the call of the Chairman.
Present the Chairman,
Mr. Woolworth,

The minutes of the Mr. Pease,
last meeting were read & approved. Mr. Dean.

The Secretary read letters received from Mr. Northern of Mop. & Mr. White of Olin declining the offer of Principalship of the School.
After extended consultation on the subject in which the names of Rev. Dr. King Principal of the First Congregational Church and Mr. W. P. Stone of Portland, Maine, were prominently before the Committee, the whole subject of obtaining a Principal was recommitted to Mr. Garrison & the Secretary with power. As the school is to open on the 25th, and with small prospect of a Principal being obtained before that time, the Secretary was deputed to officiate as Principal ad interim.

The committee then adjourned.

March 5, 1867.

The committee met at the call of the Chairman. Present, the Chairman,

The minutes of the last Mr. Woolworth,
meeting were read & approved. Mr. Dean.

A written communication from Mr. French, Superintendent of the Experiment ^{and Primary} Department, & Professor of the Theory & Practice of Teaching concerning his position in the school was read.

After extended consultation on the subject, on motion of Mr. Dean the resignation was accepted, and Mr. Dean and Mr. Woolworth were appointed a committee with power to fill the vacancy.

The Secretary was authorized to procure

such assistance as he might deem necessary
for the more efficient instruction of the Primary
Department.

The Committee then adjourned.

April 14 1869.

The committee met at the call of the chairman.

The minutes of the last meeting were read
and approved.

The Secretary stated that the Chairman
had said to him that he would not be able
to attend the meeting by reason of absence
from the city, but that he had expressed
to him fully his views in regard to the
matters requiring action and directed
the committee not to delay the considera-
tion of them.

The Secretary also stated that under the author-
ity given to him Mr. Dean at the last meeting
of the Committee in the matter of filling the
vacancy of Superintendent of the Experimental
Department, they had tendered the place
to Mr. Chauncy W. Allen, a graduate of the
4th term of the School, and for several years
Principal of one of the Public Schools of this
city, and that Mr. Allen had accepted the
offer and entered on the duties of the position.

The Secretary further stated that in discharg-
ing the duties of Principal which he had done
since the opening of the present term he found
a necessity for additional assistance in the Ex-
perimental department, caused by the fact
that numbers of the Sub-Clap had been
detained for duty in that school where
they were subordinates. Whereupon he was
