## UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ANNOUNCES HEAD BASKETBALL COACH MARI WARNER'S CONTRACT WILL NOT BE RENEWED

ALBANY, N.Y. – University at Albany Director of Athletics and Recreation Lee McElroy announced today that the contract of head women's basketball coach Mari Warner will not be renewed for the 2002-03 season.

Warner, the school's all-time leader in coaching victories, recently completed her 20th season. She compiled a 299-213 career record. However, the Great Danes have registered four straight losing records, including a 21-60 mark since moving to the Division I level in 1999-2000. Albany finished its inaugural America East Conference campaign with a 4-23 record, and ended the season with 16 consecutive losses in conference play.

Warner, 43, was one of the nation's youngest head coaches when she was appointed to the position in 1982-83. Under her direction, UAlbany posted winning records in 12 of 13 seasons as a Division III program. Her clubs reached the NCAA tournament twice. In Division II, Warner's best team was the 1996-97 squad that finished 19-9 overall and advanced to the New England Collegiate Conference championship.

McElroy indicated that a national search for a new coach would commence shortly. "A screening committee will be organized that will be comprised of student-athletes, coaches and administrators," he said.

#### MEN'S LACROSSE

Hamden, Conn. – Chris Driscoll scored a career-high five goals, including the gamewinner in the second overtime, to lift Albany past Quinnipiac, 13-12, in the Great Danes' America East Conference opener on Saturday afternoon at Braves Field.

Quinnipiac (3-5, AE 0-2) took a 12-11 lead in the fourth quarter as senior midfielder Jim Lollo scored his second goal of the game. Albany (3-5, AE 1-0) drew even at 12 apiece with 4:19 remaining in regulation on Pete Giattino's goal.

Neither team scored in the first four-minute extra period. Driscoll, a junior attackman, ended UAlbany's string of three straight losses, when he found the back of net with 1:16 to play in the second sudden-death overtime.

The Braves, who suffered a one-goal defeat for the fourth time this season, reversed a 6-5 halftime deficit with a four-goal third period. Sophomore Andy Pelletier had two of his three goals in that span. Quinnipiac built an 11-9 advantage early in the final stanza.

UAlbany's Luke Daquino, a freshman attacker, totaled one goal and a careerbest four assists, while goalkeeper Kevin Rae matched a season-high with 19 saves. Quinnipiac's Mike Baglio had three goals, including his 22nd of the season. -agate-

Stony Brook, N.Y. – Right fielder **Liz Wieboldt** singled twice, doubled, and scored three runs as Albany split an America East Conference doubleheader with Stony Brook on Saturday afternoon at University Field. UAlbany (13-5, AE 3-1) won the nightcap, 6-5, but dropped the first game, 4-1.

The Great Danes built a 6-0 lead in the second contest. **Stacy Kowal** lined a two-run double to center field, as her team scoring three times in the third inning. In the fourth, shortstop **Valerie Terry** (South Glens Falls) had a RBI double and **Lynnette Bohannon** added a sacrifice fly.

Stony Brook (8-11, AE 1-3) closed to within, 6-5, with a three-run rally in the sixth. **Cass Broadwater** scored a pair of runners with a double into the left-field gap. Albany reliever **Amy Hawk** came on to register her first save of the season. She forced **Stephanie DiBiase** to end the sixth with a ground out, and then struck out **Jane Stein** for the final out in the seventh with the tying run aboard.

In the opener, Stony Brook's **Stephanie Poetzsch** scattered four hits en route to the complete-game victory. Poetzsch improved to 7-6 on the mound by recording eight strikeouts and one walk. **Kristen Brust** delivered her third home run of the season, a three-run blast over the center-field fence in the first inning. Albany's Wieboldt broke up the shutout, when she singled and scored in the sixth.

#### TRACK & FIELD

Raleigh, N.C. – Freshman **Kristof Molnar** anchored the men's 4x800-meter relay to an eighth-place finish with an IC4A-qualifying time at the 2002 Adidas Raleigh Relays on Saturday afternoon at North Carolina State's Paul H. Derr Track. More than 3,000 athletes from 110 schools competed in the two-day meet.

UAlbany posted a time of 7:43.02 to qualify for the IC4A championships at Princeton University on May 16-19. Molnar ran the anchor leg in one minute and 52 seconds, and was joined on the relay by **Noel Campbell**, **Ike Cherry** and **Szabolcs Molnar**.

Adam Rice was third in his section of the 3,000-meter steeplechase with an IC4A-qualifying mark of 9:14.83. UAlbany's 4x100 relay also beat the IC4A standard, and placed 17th overall. The squad of Kenrick McBean, Alix Rodriques, Dustin Wilson and Jesse Bennett sprinted 41.91 seconds. In addition, Rob Harrison (Shaker) finished 11th in the triple jump with a leap of 46-feet, 3.25-inches.

### **ALBANY SPORTS 3-3-3**

In the women's competition, **Meghan Howell** ran a personal-best 4:46.83 in the 1,500-meter run to take 35th place. **Nicole Susser** (Colonie Central) was 41st in a field of 127 runners in 4:49.21. The 4x100 relay was clocked in 48.82, and narrowly missed the ECAC-qualifying standard. The sprint medley relay ran 4:08.01, and was nearly one second off the existing school record.

Stony Brook, N.Y. – Sarah Maida tossed a complete game five-hit shutout and Lynnette Bohannon had the game-winning double in the ninth inning of the nightcap, as Albany swept a doubleheader against Stony Brook in the America East Conference opener for both schools on Friday afternoon at University Field. The Great Danes won the first game, 3-2, and followed with a 2-0 extra-inning victory.

Albany (12-4, AE 2-0), winners of five straight, scored twice in the ninth of the second game to break a scoreless deadlock. Valerie Terry (South Glens Falls) led off the frame with a walk. Liz Wieboldt's sacrifice bunt advanced the runner. Bohannon then struck with a double down the left field line putting Albany on the scoreboard. Megan Kraft (South Glens Falls) added a RBI single over the shortstop for insurance. Stony Brook (7-10, AE 0-2) had an opportunity to tie the contest with runners on second and third and two outs. However, Maida, who earned her tenth career shutout, fanned Cass Broadwater to end the game.

Terry went 3-for-3 in the opener with two doubles and two runs scored and Amy Hawk pitched three innings of scoreless relief to earn her first win of the season.

The Great Danes reversed a 2-1 deficit with two runs in the sixth inning. Terry led off the frame with her second double of the contest. She scored three batters later when Jess Kostenblatt's squeeze attempt resulted in a throwing error to the plate by pitcher Stephanie Poetzsch. Wieboldt then crossed the plate with the eventual game-winning run as Craft hit a groundout to Poetzsch. Both teams play a conference doubleheader on Saturday at noon. -agate-

Schenectady, N.Y. -- Junior midfielder **Emily Lilyea** scored four times, including the final two goals of the game, as St. Bonaventure held off Albany for a 15-13 non-conference decision on Friday afternoon at Union College's Frank Bailey Field.

Albany (1-5) rallied from a 13-7 deficit early in the second half by reeling off six unanswered goals in a span of five minutes and 21 seconds. **Alexis DiDomenico** started the string when she put in the first of her back-to-back goals off a pass from junior **Andrea Esposito** (Saratoga Springs). **Elizabeth Michalenko** and **Erin Pemrick** (Saratoga Springs) then scored 29 seconds apart before Esposito hit DiDomenico with a pass in front. **Maria Ferrucci** scored unassisted to cap the run with 10:18 left to play.

With the score deadlocked at 13-13, Lilyea fired in a long shot from the top of the circle to give the Bonnies the lead for good with 9:07 remaining. She cut down the middle of the crease to add an insurance goal just under five minutes later, and St. Bonaventure (2-4) held the Great Danes scoreless for more than ten minutes to end any comeback attempt.

UAlbany's Ferrucci had three goals and two assists, while Esposito finished with two goals and three assists. Freshman goalkeeper **Francine Beltempo** stopped 17 shots for the Great Danes.

#### SOFTBALL SELECTED SIXTH IN AMERICA EAST CONFERENCE POLL

Boston, Mass. – The America East Conference announced its preseason softball poll today and the University at Albany has been chosen to finish sixth in the seven-team conference. Boston University, who captured all seven first-place votes, was selected by the coaches to win the title.

Head coach **Chris Cannata** enters her eighth campaign at the school, while totaling a 173-96 mark. Albany returns ten letterwinners from a squad that finished 22-25 last season. Senior shortstop **Valerie Terry** (South Glens Falls) is a three-year starter, who hit a career-high .403 in 2001. She also ranked second nationally in stolen bases per game (1.09 pg, 49 total). Terry is the school's career and single-season record holder for runs, steals and triples.

Senior right-hander **Sarah Maida** will serve as the ace of the pitching staff. The Newburgh, N.Y. native posts a 25-19 record with a 2.33 earned run average over two seasons since transferring from the University of Bridgeport. Maida has started 42 career games and tossed over 285 innings.

Senior left fielder **Lynnette Bohannon** started all 47 games in 2001. She led the squad in home runs with six, the highest total by an Albany player in eight seasons. The Colby Community College (Kan.) transfer and Pueblo, Colo., native also had a team-high 28 RBI and .535 slugging percentage.

Sophomore infielder **Megan Craft** (South Glens Falls) is one of several newcomers expected to contribute immediately. She will see action at three of the four infield positions and bat in the middle of the lineup. Craft, a transfer from Adirondack Community College, led her squad to the National Junior College Athletic Association Region III Championship and a fourth-place showing at the national tournament.

#### **MEN'S LACROSSE**

Baltimore, Md. – **Adam Doneger** had three goals and one assist, as third-ranked Johns Hopkins pulled away in the second half for a 10-4 non-conference victory over Albany on Tuesday evening at Homewood Field.

Albany (2-5) trailed 3-1 in the second quarter, but then tied the contest on **Sean Donnellan's** fourth goal of the season and an extra-man goal by **Brendan Russell**. Johns Hopkins (4-1) regained the lead with 2:39 left in the period, as **Conor Ford** scored off **Kyle Barrie's** feed.

The Blue Jays, who were ranked first in last week's USILA national poll before losing to Virginia on Saturday, used a four-goal third quarter to break the game open. **Peter LeSueur**, who scored twice in the period, started the outburst when he found the net with his team on a man-advantage.

Doneger, a junior midfielder who also scored in that decisive third stanza, gave his team a commanding 9-3 lead with 10:49 left in the final period. **Kevin Boland** and LeSueur each finished with two goals and one assist. Senior goalkeeper **Nick Murtha** made 10 saves for Johns Hopkins, a program that has captured seven NCAA Division I championships in its history.

Albany's **Jon Smith** had one goal and assisted on another, while **Luke Daquino** added a season-high three assists. Freshman **Kevin Rae** turned aside 16 shots for the Great Danes. UAlbany head coach **Scott Marr** was returning to his alma mater, as he played on the Blue Jays' 1987 national title squad.

Newark, Del. – Shortstop **Kris Dufner** went 4-for-4 with four RBI and hit a three-run home run as Delaware posted a 12-7 non-conference victory over Albany on Sunday afternoon at Bob Hannah Stadium.

Albany (3-13), who has dropped six straight outings, trailed 6-2, but recaptured the lead with a five-run seventh inning. **Mike Grasso** (Bishop Maginn) singled in **Craig Farley**. **Fred Estes** belted a triple crossing two to cap the rally after a **Dan Schoonmaker** RBI sacrifice fly and **Pat Delaney's** run-scoring single. Delaney had three hits for the game, including a double in the sixth.

However, Delaware (11-9), winners of six consecutive games, benefited from a pair of three-run homers in the bottom half of the seventh. **Nick DeCarlo** blasted the first shot off reliever **Will Haskell** (Saratoga Springs). Dufner sealed the victory with a knock over the center field fence against **Nick Borgia** (Scotia-Glenville), who entered the game in a first and third, one-out jam. Chapel Hill, N.C. – **Rob Harrison** (Shaker) won the long jump and took second in the triple jump to lead Albany to a third-place finish at the UNC Classic at North Carolina's Fetzer Field. The Great Danes placed fifth in the women's team competition.

Harrison, a junior, posted a mark of 22-feet, 2.25-inches in the long jump to edge North Carolina's **John Hubbard**. He finished second to North Carolina State's **Jason Viera** in the triple jump with a leap of 46-01.50.

Freshman **Kristof Molnar** won the 800-meter run with a time of 1:52.68, and was 44-hundredths of a second better than **Douglas Smith**, of North Carolina. **Aggrey Morris** was second in the 400-meter dash (49.12), while **Paul Roche** (Niskayuna) was third in the 110-high hurdles (15.26).

In the women's meet, freshman **Kristen O'Brien** set a school record in the pole vault, when she cleared the bar at 10-feet even. **Ashley Kangas** narrowly missed another UAlbany mark in the javelin, as she finished sixth with a toss of 113-03. -agate-

In the opener, Delaware (10-9), winners of five straight and eight of its last nine, posted a five-run first inning. John Schneider hit a two-run double to left center field and Steve Harden later added a double down the left-field line crossing two more.



#### UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ANNOUNCES 2002 FOOTBALL SCHEDULE

ALBANY, N.Y. – University at Albany Director of Athletics and Recreation Lee McElroy announced today the school's football schedule for 2002. The Great Danes will play a seven-game Northeast Conference slate, and meet non-conference opponents, Montana, the defending Division I-AA national champion, Drake, Canisius and Florida International.

The Great Danes begin their 30th season on Saturday, September 7 with Montana, the I-AA national champion in 1995 and 2001. The Grizzlies, who are coming off a 15-1 campaign as a member of the Big Sky Conference, have made 11 NCAA post-season appearances.

Albany travels to Florida International, a first-year football program coached by former Miami Dolphins quarterback Don Strock, on Nov. 9, and to Drake on Oct. 12. The Bulldogs, who play in the 18,000-seat Drake Stadium, return first-team All-Pioneer League quarterback Ira Vandever, who accounted for 2,478 total yards and 20 touchdowns last season. The Great Danes are also on the road at Sacred Heart on Sept. 21. The Pioneers put together a perfect 11-0 record en route to the 2001 ECAC Bowl and Northeast Conference titles.

Albany's home schedule opens with conference-rival Central Connecticut State on Sept. 14. Canisius will be the opponent for Homecoming and Family Weekend on Oct. 19. Hall of Fame Day is set for Oct. 5 versus Wagner. All games at University Field start at 1:00 p.m.

The Great Danes finished 7-3 last year, and tied for third in the NEC standings. Head coach Bob Ford will return 14 starters, including eight on defense and six on offense. Josh Bazan, the 2001 *Football Gazette* I-AA Mid-Major Linebacker of the Year, and Sports Network I-AA All-American, led the defense with 103 tackles, three fumbles recovered and four fumbles forced.

#### UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY NAMES WILL BROWN HEAD BASKETBALL COACH

ALBANY, N.Y. – University at Albany Director of Athletics and Recreation Lee McElroy announced today the hiring of Will Brown as head men's basketball coach. Brown, who has worked on the collegiate level since 1995, becomes the 15th head coach in the UAlbany program's history.

Brown was appointed as Albany's interim head coach last Dec. 20, and guided the Great Danes to a 7-13 record over the last 20 games. Albany was among the conference leaders in scoring defense at 65.0 points per game. Brown, who joined the UAlbany staff as an assistant in September 2001, coached the team to several impressive victories, including a win over Vermont, the America East Conference's regular-season champion. At age 30, Brown becomes the third youngest Division I head coach in the nation.

"Will Brown has proven over the last three months that he has the leadership skills and coaching expertise to manage a Division I program," McElroy said. "He has high energy, commitment and integrity, plus values the student-athlete. I have been impressed with his professionalism and his ability to handle challenging circumstances."

Brown previously served as the head coach at Sullivan County Community College in Loch Sheldrake, New York from 1998-2001. He led the Generals to a 90-10 record over a three-year period with two regional and two district titles. Sullivan County C.C. posted a 30-2 record and reached the National Junior Collegiate Athletic Association (NJCAA) championship in 2000-01. Brown's first SCCC squad appeared in the NJCAA "Final Four" and finished 32-3 overall. The Generals were ranked second nationally in scoring at 92.9 points per game, and ninth in team defense with a 67.1 average.

Brown was chosen the New York State Coaches Association junior college coach of the year in 1999. He also earned Mid-Hudson Conference coach of the year honors three times, and was District V's top coach twice. In addition, he worked at Sullivan County C.C. as an associate athletic director and as an adjunct professor of sports management.



## UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ANNOUNCES HEAD BASKETBALL COACH MARI WARNER'S CONTRACT WILL NOT BE RENEWED

ALBANY, N.Y. – University at Albany Director of Athletics and Recreation Lee McElroy announced today that the contract of head women's basketball coach Mari Warner will not be renewed for the 2002-03 season.

Warner, the school's all-time leader in coaching victories, recently completed her 20th season. She compiled a 299-213 career record. However, the Great Danes have registered four straight losing records, including a 21-60 mark since moving to the Division I level in 1999-2000. Albany finished its inaugural America East Conference campaign with a 4-23 record, and ended the season with 16 consecutive losses in conference play.

Warner, 43, was one of the nation's youngest head coaches when she was appointed to the position in 1982-83. Under her direction, UAlbany posted winning records in 12 of 13 seasons as a Division III program. Her clubs reached the NCAA tournament twice. In Division II, Warner's best team was the 1996-97 squad that finished 19-9 overall and advanced to the New England Collegiate Conference championship.

McElroy indicated that a national search for a new coach would commence shortly. "A screening committee will be organized that will be comprised of student-athletes, coaches and administrators," he said.

Boston, Mass. -- Junior Amos had 14 points and 10 rebounds to pace four players in double figures, as Hartford posted a 65-49 victory over Albany on Saturday afternoon in the quarterfinal round of the America East Conference Tournament at Northeastern University's Matthews Arena.

Hartford (14-17), the No. 3 seed, led 24-23 at halftime, but then pulled away with 10 unanswered points to begin the final period. Pierre Johnson, who had 14 points and eight rebounds, tallied five markers to begin that run, before Ryan Stys nailed a three-point field goal. Josh Odugbela, a 6-foot-8 junior, hit a jumper inside the foul line for a 34-23 lead with 17:08 remaining.

The Hawks, who made 65.2 percent of their field goal attempts in the second half on 15-of-23 shooting, would later push out to a 48-33 advantage. Albany, the sixth seed who finished the season with an 8-20 record, went scoreless for more than five minutes at one point in the stanza.

"We gave up a lot of easy baskets," said Albany coach Will Brown, who took over on an interim basis in late December. "There was a three- to four-minute period where we just exchanged baskets with them. However, I am proud of this group because we stuck together during the year and had some good wins down the stretch."

Hartford, who split the regular-season series as each team won on its home floor, jumped out to a 14-7 lead. But the Great Danes rallied with seven straight to draw even on a jumper by Will Brand, who finished with nine points and five rebounds in his final game as a collegian. Albany would pull ahead, 23-22, just before the intermission on Alex Barnhill's follow shot in the lane. The Hawks' Charles Ford made two free throws to give his club the lead at the break.

"We dug ourselves too big a hole in the second half," said Brand, who ended his career ranked eighth on the all-time scoring list with 1,405 points. "It's hard for the other team to come back when you give up too many jumpers and second-chance baskets."

Hartford's **Deon Saunders** had 11 points and six rebounds off the bench, while Stys was the fourth Hartford player in double figures with 11. Rhasheed Peterson led the Great Danes with 12 points.

#### WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Albany, N.Y. – Sophomore guard **Melissa Kowalski** tallied 18 points to lead five players in double figures as Northeastern shot 51 percent and upended Albany, 81-69, in the America East Conference regular-season finales for both teams on Saturday at the Recreation and Convocation Center.

Northeastern (6-21, AE 4-12), who snapped a five-game losing streak, led 39-37 at the intermission and exploded with 20 of the opening 25 points in the final period. **Joi Jefferson**, who finished with 12 points and 11 rebounds, scored six markers in the spurt. The Huskies shot 50 percent in the stanza and extended to a 59-42 advantage on a **Francesca Vanin** layup with 11:11 remaining. Vanin had 10 points and nine boards off the bench.

Albany (4-23, AE 0-16) dug themselves in a hole early in the second half as they totaled two field goals over the opening 12 minutes. The Great Danes used a pair of back-to-back **Becky Ayers'** three-pointers to cut the deficit to 63-55 with six minutes left. Ayers posted a career-high 22 points, including five 3-pointers, and ended with a program single-season three-point shooting record (46.9 percent). She made 46-of-98 attempts from behind the arc. However, the Huskies would later total six straight points to increase the margin to 14.

"These past few games we have given up too many points down the stretch," said Albany coach **Mari Warner**, whose team ended the year with 16 consecutive losses. "We plan on making the necessary improvements in the off-season. The future is bright for this program as we have a lot of young, developing talent."

The first half saw eight ties and 11 lead changes. Albany built a 24-19 lead on a three-pointer by **Marie Connors**, who was one of three Great Dane seniors playing in their final home game. Northeastern later responded with an 11-2 spurt for a 34-29 advantage at the 2:44 mark. **Lori Newsome** had four of her 13 points in the stretch.

Jess McGinlay reached twin figures with 18 points, including four 3-pointers, for Albany, who canned a season-high 11 long-range shots on 22 attempts. The total was one shy of a school record. Genny Caruso added 15 for Northeastern. The Huskies, as the eighth seed, open the America East Conference Tournament on Thursday against top-seeded Vermont.

Boston, Mass. – University at Albany's **Will Brand** was voted to the 2002 America East Conference all-conference men's basketball squad as announced on Friday evening at the championship award's banquet. Brand was chosen to the third-team by the league's head coaches.
