Waterbury was also present by invitation.

Mr. Draper reported that the water
pipes in the Old Building had bursted ✓
and the building had been flooded in
consequence and that in the emergency
he had employed Mr. Harper to repair
the pipes and roof so far as to save
further damage to the property at an
estimated expense of \$50. On motion
of Dr. Ward this action was approved.

On motion the Superintendent and
Mr. Draper were appointed a Committee
to advertise and sell the old building.

Dr. Murray being confined to his ✓
house by illness which seemed likely
to incapacitate him from acting as
Treasurer for some time on motion
it was ordered that Mr. Draper be ✓
appointed as treasurer pending
the illness of Dr. Murray.

Dr. Waterbury presented the resign-
ation of Prof. John B. Marsh as ✓
Organist and director of Music which

On motion was accepted and the Secretary was directed to convey to Prof. Marsh the regrets of the Committee at his Removal from the City.

On motion it was ordered that Prof. Fredk P. Mills organist of St. Peter's Church be appointed professor of Music in the School for the period of three months.

On the recommendation of President Waterbury it was ordered that Miss Edith Bodley be appointed a supply teacher in place of Miss Ella Bishop for the period of half a term at the rate of six hundred dollars per annum.

It was ordered that the Sup't. and Mr. Draper be appointed a Committee to appear before the Legislation Committee and represent the necessity of an appropriation of \$7000 in the Supply Bill to cover deficiency in the maintenance account of the School.

On motion of Mr. Draper the salary of James McTeague Assistant janitor was increased to \$60 per month from Feb 10. 1886.
