ALBANY'S ANDY SHEIN NAMED TO ECAC FOOTBALL HONOR ROLL Men's Soccer Ranked Eighth in Northeast Region

ALBANY, N.Y. -- University at Albany flanker **Andy Shein** has been named to the ECAC Upstate New York Honor Roll for the second consecutive week after his record-setting performance last Saturday against Brockport, a 25-13 loss for the Great Danes.

Shein, a 5'8", 185-pound senior, became the first receiver in Albany history to record back-to-back 100-yard receiving games, when he shattered single-game standards for receptions (13) and receiving yardage (146). He caught five passes for 141 yards against St. Lawrence in his previous start on Sept. 17.

Shein's 13 receptions toppled a mark held by Glenn Carlin, who eight catches versus Western Connecticut on Sept. 18, 1987. Bob Brien had owned the record for receiving yardage, as he accounted 143 yards against Alfred (Oct. 29, 1983).

Shein, who has 19 receptions for 334 yards and two touchdowns this season, moved to fifth place on Albany's career charts in both receptions (59) and yardage (895).

The latest ISAA Northeast Region Division III Men's Soccer Poll was released today, and Albany is ranked eighth with a 5-2 record. The Great Danes host Skidmore on Tuesday at 4:00 p.m.

ALBANY'S JOE SAVINO NAMED ECAC UPSTATE NEW YORK ROOKIE OF THE WEEK Andy Shein Selected to ECAC Honor Roll

ALBANY, N.Y. -- University at Albany quarterback **Joe Savino** has been selected as the ECAC/Budget Division III Upstate New York Rookie of the Week for his performance against St. Lawrence last Saturday in a 39-12 victory for the Great Danes.

Savino, a 5'9", 165-pound freshman, had the second-best passing day in school history by connecting on 10-of-17 attempts for 272 yards and two touchdowns. Savino, who threw for 182 yards in his debut against Ithaca (Sept. 10), is just the second player at Albany to pass for more than 200 yards in a game. His TD passes included a 61-yard strike to Ed Richard in the first quarter, and a 70-yard scoring pass to Andy Shein in the third period.

Savino's efforts helped Albany establish a school single-game record with 313 yards passing, as the Great Danes recorded 554 yards in total offense.

Senior flanker **Andy Shein** was named to the ECAC's weekly honor roll, as he narrowly missed the school's single-game record for receiving yards with five receptions for 141 yards and one touchdown. Bob Brien accounted for 143 yards on six catches against Alfred (Oct. 29, 1983).

Shein, who had the first 100-yard receiving game at Albany since Joe Valerio in 1992, moved to sixth on UA's career lists in both receptions (46) and yardage (749).

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY SELECTS JOHN JANECEK AS STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING COACH AND DEBBIE DONOVAN AS INTERIM FIELD HOCKEY COACH

ALBANY, N.Y. -- **John Janecek** has been named as Strength and Conditioning Coach and **Debbie Donovan** has been chosen as Interim Women's Field Hockey Head Coach at the University at Albany, as Director of Athletics Dr. Milton E. Richards announced today.

Janecek comes to Albany from Tennessee State University in Nashville, where he was the head strength and conditioning coach for a 14-sport, Division I athletics program since January 1993. He also served as an assistant strength coach on the Division I level at Vanderbilt University in 1991 and at the University of Nebraska in 1990. In addition, Janecek, who is ceritified in CPR and first aid, worked as a personal trainer at The Club, a health resort in Kona, Hawaii.

A native of Lincoln, Neb., Janecek earned his bachelor of science degree in fitness and leisure management from the University of Nebraska at Kearney, where he was a standout wrestler. A two-time national qualifier in the heavyweight division, he finished tenth at the 1988 NAIA national championship tournament. As a student, he developed strength and conditioning programs for Nebraska-Kearney's football and wrestling teams.

Janecek, 29, was a walk-on football athlete for head coach Tom Osborne at the University of Nebraska in 1984 before transferring to Nebraska-Kearney. He received all-state recognition in football as an offensive guard, and in the 185-pound classification as a wrestler at Lincoln Southeast High School.

Donovan, an advisor to the University's field hockey club team last spring, will serve as interim head coach for the 1994 season, as the program begins its first campaign as a intercollegiate varsity sport.

A three-year letterwinner in softball at Albany, Donovan led the Great Danes to the New York State championship in 1989. She received an undergraduate degree in a dual major of sociology and psychology, and is presently pursuing her doctorate. Donovan has a teaching fellowship within the sociology department and works as a part-line instructor.

Donovan, 25, was an all-Suffolk County field hockey athlete at Rocky Point High School on Long Island, where she was also a member of the basketball and softball teams. For the past four years, she has worked part-time as a childcare worker at St. Anne Institute, and supervised teenage adolescents in a residential care facility.



MUHLENBERG, ALBANY 3-1 WINNERS IN SOCCER TOURNAMENT

Allentown, Pa. — Freshman ERIC HOHMAN, playing in the first game of his collegiate career, blasted a rebound into the upper left corner of the net in the 100th minute to send the Muhlenberg College men's soccer team on its way to a 3-1 overtime win over Bloomsburg in the first round of the Kwik Goal Classic.

Muhlenberg, on the strength of a goal by senior captain ERIC ERVIN (Emmaus) in the 22nd minute, led for most of the game. With only 1:24 on the clock, Bloomsburg's Craig Davidson fired a deflection past Mule keeper RON MOSER (Souderton) to tie the game at one.

The game remained tied until Hohman beat Huskie goalie Matthew Haney in the first overtime period. The Mules added an insurance score with nine seconds left in the first extra session when junior JOE GULOTTA converted a TIM AVERELL pass.

Muhlenberg outshot Bloomsburg, 22-15. Moser made five saves.

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY NAMES SHANA WILLIAMS AS ACADEMIC ADVISOR FOR ATHLETICS AND CAROLE SELNER AS DIRECTOR OF ATHLETIC FACILITIES

ALBANY, N.Y. -- Shana Williams has been chosen as Academic Advisor for Athletics and Carole Selner has been elevated to Director of Athletic Facilities at the University at Albany, as Director of Athletics Dr. Milton E. Richards announced today.

Williams, a world-class track athiete at Seton Hall University in New Jersey, was recently an academic counselor at her alma mater, where she worked with Educational Opportunities Program (EOP) students, the Student Athletics for Education (SAFE) program, which promoted the benefits of a college education to local high schools, and assisted inner-city youths with problem-solving skills.

A native of Bridgeton, N.J., Williams was also an athletic trainer for three years at Seton Hall, where she earned an undergraduate degree in health and physical education. As a track athlete, she was a seven-time All-American in the long jump, heptathlon, and 1,600-meter relay. Williams competed in the heptathlon at the 1993 World University Games, 1992 Olympic Trials in New Orleans, and at two U.S. Olympic Festivals. She continues to be a school-record holder in several events, which include the heptathlon (5,641 points) and the long jump (21' 9"), an event in which she was ranked fourth among all U.S. competitors in 1993.

Selected as the NCAA's New Jersey Athlete of the Year in 1993, Williams served as captain on both the cross country and track & field teams at Seton Hall. Last spring, she was USA Track & Field's east regional champion in the long jump and 100-meter high hurdles.

Selner, who recently was the head softball coach and a physical education instructor at Albany, moves into her new role as Director of Athletic Facilities. In that position, she will schedule and coordinate all activities held in the University's Recreation and Convocation Center (RACC), Physical Education Building, and outdoor athletic fields.

Prior to arriving at Albany in 1993, Selner worked for more than three years at Hudson Valley Community College in Troy, New York, where she was a head coach in women's soccer, women's tennis, and softball, and served as a women's basketball assistant.

Selner, 29, received a B.S. in physical education from the State University of New York at Cortland, and was a letterwinner on the Red Dragons' soccer and softball teams. She went on to earn a master's degree in sport management from the University of Richmond in 1990.

A standout athlete at nearby Cairo-Durham High School, Selner was an all-Section II choice in soccer and softball. In addition, she was selected as the 1984 Female Athlete of the Year at Hudson Valley Community College. She received an associate's degree from the College in physical education.
