**FRANKLIN PIERCE'S DONNELLY AND MIETTINEN
AWARDED NECC PLAYERS OF THE YEAR**

West Haven, Conn. - - On Tuesday, the New England Collegiate Conference announced the 1996 All-Conference Soccer selections.

The 1996 Men's Player of the Year is senior forward Seamus Donnelly of Franklin Pierce College. The 1995 Player of the Year from Dublin, Ireland lead's the NECC in scoring with 27 goals and nine assists for 63 points.

The 1996 Women's Player of the Year is sophomore forward Pauliina Miettinen of Franklin Pierce College. The 1995 Second Team All-NECC member from Helsinki, Finland currently leads the NECC in scoring with 27 goals and 17 points for 71 points.

The 1996 Men's Rookie of the Year is freshman forward Kenneth Pedersen from the University of New Haven. The Odense, Denmark resident led the Chargers to their first post-season appearance since 1984, scored 12 goals and nine assists for 33 points.

The 1996 Women's Rookie of the Year is sophomore forward Anne Parnila of Franklin Pierce College. The Helsinki, Finland resident currently is second in scoring in the NECC with 26 goals and 15 assists for 67 points.

The 1996 Men's Coach of the Year is New Haven's Tom Poitras. Poitras guided the Chargers to a 13-5-1 overall record as well as a 6-2-1 record in the NECC and a berth in the ECAC Tournament, the first time any UNH soccer team has reached the post season since 1984.

The 1996 Women's Coach of the Year is Denise Lyons of Keene State College. Lyons led the Owls, in their last season in the NECC and Division II to a 16-4-2 overall record as well as a 6-1-1 record in the NECC and runner-ups in the ECAC Tournament.
