**Comments:** Attached are the final statistics for field hockey and women's soccer, which both finished their seasons last week.

**Men's soccer (6-7-3, NECC 3-4-2)** plays its season-finale this Saturday against Keene State. With a win against the Owls, the Great Danes would even their record and complete the program's tenth consecutive non-losing campaign. Saturday's contest will mark the final game for Albany seniors Jon Jacobs, Kieran Griffin, Chris Mogavero and Jay Auffarth. Mogavero, who is UA's top scorer in 1995 with eight goals, five assists and 21 points, owns career numbers of 29 goals, nine assists and 67 points. Jacobs and Griffin teamed with junior Jomo Forrester as tri-captains this season. All four seniors were starters on last season's NCAA Tournament team.

**Field Hockey:** In just their second season as a varsity program, Albany finished with an 11-3-1 record under first-year head coach Deborah Fiore. The Great Danes, which posted a 1-6 record last year, went unbeaten at 9-0-1 over their last 10 contests.

UA's defense, led by freshman goaltender Jessica Marucci, recorded 10 shutouts, and surrendered just 0.79 goals per seventy minutes. Senior forward Angela Soteriou led the Danes with five goals, two assists and 12 points, while freshman Nicole Berman scored five times.

**Women's Soccer:** Albany wrapped up its first season at the NCAA's Division II level last week. UA (6-10-1, NECC 1-6-1) tied Massachusetts-Lowell for seventh place in the New England Collegiate Conference.

Senior midfielder Amy Preece was the team's top scorer for the second straight season with six goals, five assists and 17 points. She was named to the New England Collegiate Conference Honor Roll last week for the second time this season. Over her final two campaigns, Preece totaled 11 goals, 7 assists and 29 points.

Locals on the team: Sophomore attack Christina Yang (Shaker H.S.) -- three goals in 15 games played -- both goals were game-winners in a pair of 1-0 victories over Merrimack and Elms. Junior attack Shannon Tanner (Stillwater H.S.) had one goal and one assists in 15 starts. Two freshmen who have seen action are defender Michelle Pabst (Saratoga H.S.) and midfielder Shannon Smith (Saratoga H.S.).

**Cross Country:** Tonya Dodge, a junior from Granville Central H.S., was second at the Collegiate Track Conference (CTC) championships in Allentown, Pennsylvania. Dodge covered the 5,000-meter distance in 20:29.9 to lead Albany to a second-place finish in the team standings. Junior Tiffany Will (Hoosic Valley H.S.) was 26th in 22:39.8.

Albany's men also finished second at CTC's. Dennis King, a senior from Notre Dame Bishop Gibbons H.S., was 12th in 28:12.8 over 8,000 meters. Sophomore John Druzba (Niskayuna H.S.) placed 27th in 29:04.5.

**Football:** Senior defensive tackle Chad Hotaling (Voorheesville H.S.) had a team-high nine tackles, including two for a loss, in Saturday's 38-20 victory over Pace. Free safety Ted Bearor (Greenwich Central H.S.) added seven tackles, while linebacker John Moskov (Niskayuna H.S.) had six stops. Bearor and Hotaling rank fourth and fifth among the team's leaders in tackles with 42 and 40, respectively, on the season.

**TIM WELDON NAMED ECAC DIVISION II ROOKIE OF THE WEEK**

**JEFF EMERSON SELECTED ECAC INTERCOLLEGIATE FOOTBALL  
CONFERENCE DIVISION II DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Centerville, Mass. -- University at Albany's Tim Weldon has been named the ECAC Division II Rookie of the Week for his performance in Saturday's 38-20 victory over Pace. Meanwhile, Jeff Emerson was chosen the ECAC-IFC Division II Defensive Player of the Week.

Weldon, a freshman split end, scored a pair of touchdowns, the first of his career, as the Great Danes snapped a four-game losing streak. A transfer from West Virginia, Weldon ran for one score on a 47-yard reverse in the first quarter, and then caught a 48-yard TD strike in the second period. He had three receptions for 76 yards on the afternoon.

Emerson, a senior defensive end, had eight tackles (4 solo) and two QB sacks for minus 13 yards. The 6'2", 220-pound defender added two tackles for a loss. A pre-season All-America selection, Emerson moved to fifth place at Albany in career tackles with 215.

\*\*\*\*\*

Sophomore quarterback Joe Savino was chosen to the ECAC Division II Honor Roll for the second time this season. Savino hit on 14 of 23 passes for 211 yards, which was his second straight 200-yard effort. He is responsible for seven of the eight 200-yard passing days in school history.

Albany, N.Y. -- Jomo Forrester, Chris Pulver and Brian Drew each scored in the second half as Albany defeated Massachusetts-Lowell, 3-0, in a New England Collegiate Conference match on Saturday afternoon at Varsity Field.

Forrester's fourth goal of the season came when he took a feed from Chris Mogavero, and fired a scoring strike from the right flat for a 1-0 UA lead at 50:55. Mogavero registered his second assist of the day with a crossing ball to Pulver, whose header beat UMass-Lowell goaltender Brian Scanlan with 4:23 remaining in the game.

Jon Jacobs stopped nine shots in the Great Dane net, while Scanlan made 14 saves for the River Hawks, who fall to 4-13-1, and 1-5-1 in conference play. Albany, which is now 4-1-2 in October, improves to 6-7-3, and 3-4-2 in the NECC.

New Haven, Conn. -- Emelio Williams scored midway through the second half, as Southern Connecticut State, ranked fifth in the latest NCAA Division II poll, rallied to defeat Albany, 2-1, in a New England Collegiate Conference match on Wednesday evening at Jess Dow Field.

Albany (5-7-3, NECC 2-4-2) took a 1-0 lead with 12 minutes and 50 seconds gone in the contest, when junior midfielder Gene Dove netted his sixth goal of the season from eight yards away.

Southern Connecticut State (14-1-1, NECC 6-1), unbeaten in its last six matches, drew even at 30:16 in the first half. Sherwin Mullin, who also had one assist, one-timed a headed ball from Shawn Boney past Albany goalkeeper Jon Jacobs at close range.

Williams tallied the game-winner at 62:33, when he broke down the right side on a lead pass from Mullin and fired a 20-yard shot into the net.

Jacobs had eight saves for the Great Danes, while SCSU's Rich Koczak turned aside two shots.

**Women's Field Hockey:** In just its second varsity season, Albany improved to 5-3 over the weekend with a pair of victories over Division II opponents C.W Post (1-0, OT) and Quinnipiac (2-0). Senior Angela Soteriou scored 10 minutes and 12 seconds into sudden-death overtime against C.W. Post and had both goals vs. Quinnipiac.

The Great Danes were 1-6 in their first varsity campaign, and were outscored 28-6 in those seven contests. In eight games to date, Albany has a 12-7 edge in goals scored.

Head coach Deborah Fiore, a native of Oneida, N.Y., is in her first season as head coach. She spent the previous six years at Oneonta State, where she guided the Red Dragons to a 64-54-3 overall record and two NCAA Division III tournament berths.

Other local athletes on the team: Shannon Tanner (Stillwater), Christina Yang (Shaker), Shannon Smith (Saratoga) and Michelle Pabst (Saratoga).

**Women's Cross Country:** Junior Tonya Dodge (Granville Central) was Albany's top finisher at the Cortland Invitational last Saturday. She finished 17th with a time of 18:54 over the 5,000-meter course. Lisa Nesta, Albany's No. 1 runner, who placed 14th at the 1994 NCAA Division III championships, will not compete this fall due to a back injury. She was the first woman in school history to earn all-America recognition in cross country.

The Great Danes posted an 18-8 overall record and made their fourth trip in the last six years to the NCAA Division III Men's Tournament last season. **Richard "Doc" Sauers**, whose 673 victories ranks 10th among the winningest coaches in the history of college basketball, is in his 40th season as head coach. Sauers, who has never had a losing campaign as the Albany mentor, will field a relatively inexperienced team with just six lettermen and two starters returning.

Sophomore guard **Bob Markel**, a first team all-East Region selection in 1995, averaged 11.5 points and 4.8 assists in his first collegiate season. However, Markel's status for this year is unclear as he recovers from off-season knee surgery. Sophomore **Rory Doyle** leads a group of three players, who in Markel's absence, would battle at point guard. **Darrin Jahnel**, a sophomore from Schalmont H.S., became a starter at two-guard last February, and averaged 3.8 points and 1.8 rebounds.

The Albany frontcourt, led by second team all-East choice Ted Hotaling, has graduated. **Rich Dormer**, a 6'4" junior, and **Andre Duncan**, a 6'6" sophomore, came off the bench on last year's NCAA club. Dormer scored at a 9.5 clip and shot nearly 40 percent from three-point range, while Duncan averaged 6.5 points and 4.8 rebounds, and blocked 51 shots. Sophomore **Ryan Brenner** (6-7, 190), St. Rose transfer **Tom McGoldrick** (6-5, 200), and four more newcomers will also vie for playing time.

In 1994-95, the Albany women finished with a 16-9 record in their final Division III campaign. **Mari Warner**, who has 219 victories in 13 seasons as head coach, guided the Great Danes to a winning record for the 12th time during her tenure.

Senior **Margaret Feerick** and junior **Samantha Ginsberg** both return in the UA backcourt. Ginsberg led her team in scoring with a 14.8 average, and set a sophomore scoring record with 371 points. A starter in all 25 games, the 5'8" guard canned 31-of-108 three-point field goal attempts. Feerick averaged 6.4 points, 4.5 assists and 3.3 steals, and led the squad in free throw percentage (.761). Her 112 assists was the fourth highest single-season total in school history.

**Erica Witham**, a 6'2" senior center from Guilderland H.S., is set to become Albany's all-time blocked shots leader. Witham, who has 103 career rejections, needs just two blocks to move into the top spot. She averaged 7.1 points and 4.7 rebounds last winter. Other locals on the roster include sophomore forward **Kerry Ochal** (Amsterdam) and freshman guard **Kelly Paolino** (Schalmont).

**Cross Country:** At the 29th annual Albany Invitational, junior Tonya Dodge (Granville Central H.S.) was 13th out of 180 women's runners, while teammate Erin Roach finished 11th. Dodge covered the 5,000-meter course in 19:58.

In the men's 8,000-meter race, co-captain Dennis King (Notre Dame Bishop Gibbons H.S.) placed 65th out of 213 contestants in a time of 28:59. Sophomore Ryan Osborn was the top Albany finisher in 28th position at 28:11.

The Great Danes were seventh in both the men's and women's team standings. Thirty teams competed in the men's division, while 23 women's squads were entered.

**October Unbeatens:** The men's soccer team (3-0-2) and the women's field hockey team (4-0-1) are both unbeaten in the month of October. Soccer had struggled to a 2-6-1 record in month of September.
