

Monday, June 14, 1897. - 5:00 P. M.

The committee met, pursuant to call, in Pres. Milne's office, at the Normal College building, all the members present and Supt. Skinner in the chair.

After the committee had looked over the building to gain some idea of what changes might be necessary, Mr. Sten moved that Supt. Skinner and Mr. Milne should see Mr. Ryder, and that Mr. Ward should see Mr. Fuller or Mr. Wheeler, explaining in each case what we needed - to get safe exits in case of fire and improve the entrance to the building, and get two of these gentlemen to submit sketches of the best method of accomplishing the object at a cost not exceeding fifty dollars in each instance. Carried.

Mr. Ward reported that Mr. Rankin had commenced the investigation of the title of no. 98 Willett St., and Mr. Milne reported that Mrs. Lobin declined to sell any portion of her lot no. 455 Madison Ave. -

Mr. Sten moved that when the title to no. 98 Willett St. was approved by Mr. Rankin, Supt. Skinner be requested to draw a warrant on the Comptroller for nine thousand dollars (\$9,000.) in payment for the same. Carried.  
The motion adjourned.
