I instantly telephoned his ex-wife with whom he is on excellent terms and she told me that she had obtained for him the promise of quite an important Chilean to get him a visa for Chile and to have this visa cabled to the Chilean consul in Marseille. I think this news has been cabled to Peret. When I was in your office I should have asked you from whom you had received a recommendation in Peret's favor. It might be that he would need a transit visa through the States if he cannot go directly to Chile?

Peret's well-wishers all think that he would be better off in Chile and even better in Mexico.


