S T A T E M E N T

I was born in Breslau, Germany, on April 16, 1874. I attended the Elisabeth-Gymnasium of that same city from 1886 to 1892. After that I was a student at the Art Academies of Breslau and Munich (1892 to 1897); I went to Italy for a study of the Old Masters (1897/98).

Since 1899 I lived, and worked as an independent painter, in the following cities : Breslau (1899-1903), Berlin (1904-06), Paris (1906-14), Berlin (1914-35), Paris (1935-40), Marseille (1940/41); since May 1941 in New York.

In recognition of my merits as a painter and as a propagandist for French art abroad, I was named Officier d'Académie des Beaux-Arts by the French Republic, in 1911. - In 1919, the Prussian State bestowed on me the title of Professor.

From 1916 to 1933 I acted, in Germany, as Chairman of the Berlin Secession and as President of the United Berlin Artists' Associations; in these capacities I was entrusted with the organization of many group exhibitions in a great number of European countries. Moreover, I was a member of the Official Purchasing Commission for the German Museums.

Since 1896, my paintings were exhibited in group and one man shows all over Europe; in 1929 I was invited to an exhibition at the Carnegie Institute in Pittsburgh, Pa.

Pictures of mine were purchased, before 1933, by practically all German museums. In 1934, Mr. E. Benes, President of Czechoslovakia, acquired personally one of my paintings for the Foreign Office in Prague; in 1936, the French State bought one of my portraits for the Musée du Jeu de Paume.

WARBURG, of the poets GERHART HAUPTMANN and THOMAS MANN, of the famous Zeppelin Commander ECKENER, of the musicians BRUNO WALTER, ERICH KLEIBER, ARTHUR NIKISCH, FRITZ STIEDRY, RICHARD STRAUSS, FRITZ KREISLER, JASCHA HEIFETZ, PIATIGORSKY, ARTHUR SCHNABEL, LILLI LEHMANN, and many others. Since Spiro came to this country a year ago, he has painted the portrait of ALBERT EINSTEIN, recently exhibited at the portrait exhibition of the Museum of Modern Art, of HENRY BELLAMAN (author of "King's Row"), of the conductor FRITZ BUSCH, and of the actress ANNE BROWN.

Plans for Work

It is my plan to prepare for publication a book which will, by way of a collection of portrait drawings with explanatory text, illustrate the present magnificent status of musical life in the U.S.A.

I published a similar book called "Im Konzert" ("At the Concert") (Julius Kard, publisher, Berlin 1920) about 20 years ago, which interpreted the then splendid achievement of music in Europe by means of portrait drawings which were made in concert-halls and opera-houses and so caught vividly the different individualities of the great creators and performers, such as composers, singers, conductors, instrumentalists etc.

During my long career as one of the best known portrait-painters of Germany and France I have portrayed a great number of men and women, eminent in the most varied walks of life. In the first line, however, I have always made a special study of musicians, whose likenesses I drew or painted while they were performing on the stage and, most of the time, unaware of being observed. Due to my own love and deep understanding of their art I felt at all times that I was better equipped than most of my fellow-artists to render with my pencil the spiritual tension and the strong emotion that animates the bodies, faces and hands of musicians absorbed by their own music.

It is my belief that the time has come now to do the same thing for music in the U.S.A., which so evidently is now destined to carry on and regenerate the great tradition. My book would be an impressive document of musical life in America in the decade of its striking rise toward a brilliant future, which, no doubt,

will assure to this country world Leadership in matters musical in our century.

In order to prepare such a work, it will be necessary for me to follow very closely during at least one whole year all kinds of musical activities and events, as they take place in New York and other great musical centers; moreover I shall have to call on many distinguished American musicians in person and I shall have to look for many opportunities to watch them in action and study their performances. I shall have to travel to a number of States and get in touch with concert-agents, managers of music-festivals and authorities that are responsible for the artistic events in their cities, etc. Although the many distinguished European musicians who are now working in this country would certainly assist me in every possible way, it is of the utmost importance for me to be able to study the AMERICAN music life in all its expressions.

I am confident that in view of the great interest in music which we are now experiencing in this country, it should not be very difficult to find a publisher for my project. However, it will hardly be possible for me to approach a publisher before my work has progressed sufficiently for him to get a more concrete idea of what I am planning to do. - The accompanying text will be the work of some eminent musicologist.



## First Encyclopaedia Judaica In 60 Years Is Half Completed

The first Encyclopaedia Judaica in English in more than 60 years—covering every phase of Jewish life, culture, history and religion — is half-way toward completion.

Details of the comprehensive 10-volume work were outlined yesterday by I. J. Karpman, executive vice president of the Encyclopaedia Judaica Press. The founders of the project are Joseph Meyerhoff, president of the PEC-Israel Economic Corporation, and Dr. Nahum Goldmann, chairman of the Judaica Foundation, devoted to Jewish cultural enterprises. Their groups and the Rassco Development Company of Israel are sponsoring the project.

Both Dr. Goldmann and Mr. Meyerhoff said that according to present estimates the 10 volumes would be completed in three to four years at a cost of \$1.5 million. Dr. Goldmann is serving as honorary president of the Encyclopaedia Judaica and Mr. Meyerhoff as president.

### 70 Scholars at Work

Mr. Karpman said that more than 70 scholars and professors in more than 20 universities in this country, Europe and Israel were compiling the new work, which will cover 5,000 pages with some six million words and 2,000 illustrations and maps.

The scholars and professors are being aided by more than 300 researchers and writers. Editor in chief of the Encyclopaedia is Dr. Bension Netanyahu, Professor of Medieval and Modern Hebrew Literature at Dropsie College, Philadelphia. Prof. William F. Albright of Johns Hopkins University is chairman of the editorial council.

Co-chairmen of the board of editors are Prof. Abraham Neuman, president of Dropsie College, and Benzion Dinur of

Hebrew University in Jerusalem, formerly Israel's Minister of Culture and Education. The two editorial centers involved in the work are in Philadelphia and in Jerusalem.

The staff consists of departmental editors working at their respective universities and colleges. These faculty members are associated with such institutions as All Souls College, Oxford; Brandeis University, University of California, Cambridge University, Columbia University, University of Copenhagen, Harvard, Jewish Theological Seminary, Madrid University, New York University, University of Pennsylvania, Yale University and Yeshiva University.

### Purpose of Project


Describing the purpose and scope of the project, Professor Netanyahu said its chief aim was to give a "full account not only of Jewish traditional-spiritual accomplishments, but also of our creativity and experience in other realms."

Dr. Martin Buber, the Jewish philosopher and theologian, hailed the project, saying:

"This work, encompassing the dialogue of Jewish history and culture from its early beginnings to the present, will be welcomed with enthusiasm by men of learning the world over."

Every subject in Jewish life and religion will be covered in the ten-volume work. These themes, covering the religious and secular areas, include such titles as post-Biblical Jewish Law, The Study of Judaism, Semitic Language, Jews in Philology and Judaeo-Arabic Literature.

There are articles devoted to Zionism, the history of Jews in countries the world over, rabbinic literature, Jewish sociology, Jews in public law and political science, Islam and Judaism and Jewish historiography.

### Plans for Work

It is my plan to prepare for publication a book which will, by way of a collection of portrait drawings with explanatory text, illustrate the present magnificent status of musical life in the U.S.A.

I published a similar book called "Im Konzert" ("In the Concert") (Julius Bard, publisher, Berlin 1920) about 20 years ago, which interpreted the then splendid achievement of music in Europe by means of portrait drawings which were made in concert-halls and opera-houses and so caught vividly the different individualities of the great creators and performers, such as composers, singers, conductors, instrumentalists etc.

During my long career as one of the best known portrait-painters of Germany and France I have portrayed a great number of men and women, eminent in the most varied walks of life. In the first line, however, I have always made a special study of musicians, whose likenesses I drew or painted while they were performing on the stage and, most of the time, unaware of being observed. Due to my own love and deep understanding of their art I felt at all times that I was better equipped than most of my fellow-artists to render with my pencil the spiritual tension and the strong emotion that animates the bodies, faces and hands of musicians absorbed by their own music.

It is my belief that the time has come now to do the same thing for music in the U.S.A., which so evidently is now destined to carry on and regenerate the great tradition. My book would be an impressive document of musical life in America in the decade of its striking rise toward a brilliant future, which, no doubt,





C U R R I C U L U M V I T A E

I was born in Breslau, Germany, on April 18, 1874.  
I attended the Elisabeth-Gymnasium of that same city.  
After that I was a student at the Art Academies of Breslau  
and Munich (1892 to 1897); I went to Italy for a study of  
the Old Masters.

Since 1899 I lived, and worked as an independent painter,  
in Breslau (1899-1903), Berlin (1904-06 and 1914-1935) and in  
Paris (1906-1914 and 1935-1940); since May 1941 in New York.

In recognition of my merits as a painter and as a  
propagandist for French art abroad, I was named Officier  
d'Académie des Beaux-Arts by the French Republic, in 1911. -  
In 1916, the Prussian State bestowed on me the title of  
professor.

From 1916 to 1933 I acted, in Germany, as Chairman of  
the Berlin Sezession and as President of the United Berlin  
Artists' Associations; in these capacities I was entrusted  
with the organization of many group exhibitions in a great  
number of European countries. Moreover, I was a member of  
the Official Purchasing Commission for the German Museums.

Since 1896, my paintings were exhibited in group and  
one man shows all over Europe; in 1929 I was invited to an  
exhibition at the Carnegie Institute in Pittsburgh, Pa.

Pictures of mine were purchased, before 1933, by practically all German museums. In 1934, Mr. E. Benes, President of Czechoslovakia, acquired personally one of my paintings for the Foreign Office in Prague; in 1936, the French State bought one of my portraits for the Musée du Jeu de Paume.

My pictures can be found in many private collections in all parts of the world, and I have painted portraits of innumerable personages in the field of international science, politics, and art.

In 1935, I left Germany for political and racial reasons, since I consider any creative artistic activity impossible in a country where all liberty is suppressed. At the moment of Hitler's access to power, I resigned from all my official posts. From 1935 to 1941 I lived in France, after whose collapse I was able to escape and come to this country thanks to an Emergency Visitor Visa granted me on the recommendation of the President's Advisory Committee.

Since 1941 I have lived in New York City. My portrait of Professor Einstein is included in the "20th Century Portrait Exhibition" of the Museum of Modern Art, New York City. - In February 1943, I had my first one man show in that city, critical reviews of which event I am enclosing herewith.

EUGENE SPIRO was born in Breslau, on April 18, 1874. He studied art first at the Breslau Academy, later at the Munich Academy of Art as master scholar of the famous German painter Franz von Stuck.

From 1906 to 1914 Spiro lived in Paris where he came in close personal contact with many of the French impressionist and neo-impressionist painters and those contemporary artists as Matisse, Rouault, Chagall, Picasso ....

But he never joined any of the abstract movements and his art, though originally strongly influenced by painters like Manet and Cezanne, is highly individual and has become more and more brilliant in later years.

Landscapes, compositions, stillifes have been of great interest to Spiro but his main challenge has always been the human face and he has become one of the most well-known German portrait painters. In this field the men of ~~politics~~ public life, ~~chemistry~~ science, literature and art attracted him foremost and among the celebrities he painted, we cite the portraits of ....

Spiro's artistic importance had received early recognition in Europe. As far back as 1911 he became "Officidr d'Academie".... At the outbreak of the First World War he had to leave France and settled again in his native Germany. In 1918, the Prussian State bestowed on him the title of professor h.c. In Berlin he played a leading part in the artistic life of the capital as President of the Berliner Secession (1916 to 1933) and many other artist organizations.

C U R R I C U L U M V I T A E

I was born in Breslau, Germany, on April 18, 1874. I attended the Elisabeth-Gymnasium of that same city. After that I was a student at the Art Academies of Breslau and Munich (1892 to 1897); I went to Italy for a study of the Old Masters.

Since 1899 I lived, and worked as an independent painter, in Breslau (1899-1903), Berlin (1904-06 and 1914-1935) and in Paris (1906-1914 and 1935-1940); since May 1941 in New York.

In recognition of my merits as a painter and as a propagandist for French art abroad, I was named Officier d'Académie des Beaux-Arts by the French Republic, in 1911. - In 1918, the Prussian State bestowed on me the title of professor.

From 1916 to 1933 I acted, in Germany, as Chairman of the Berlin Sezession and as President of the United Berlin Artists' Associations; in these capacities I was entrusted with the organization of many group exhibitions in a great number of European countries. Moreover, I was a member of the Official Purchasing Commission for the German Museums.

Since 1896, my paintings were exhibited in group and one man shows all over Europe; in 1929 I was invited to an exhibition at the Carnegie Institute in Pittsburgh, Pa.

Pictures of mine were purchased, before 1933, by practically all German museums. In 1934, Mr. E. Benes, President of Czecho-Slovakia, acquired personally one of my paintings for the Foreign Office in Prague; in 1936, the French State bought one of my portraits for the Musée du Jeu de Paume.

My pictures can be found in many private collections in all parts of the world, and I have painted portraits of innumerable personages in the field of international science, politics, and art.

In 1935, I left Germany for political and racial reasons, since I consider any creative artistic activity impossible in a country where all liberty is suppressed. At the moment of Hitler's access to power, I resigned from all my official posts. From 1935 to 1941 I lived in France, after whose collapse I was able to escape and come to this country thanks to an Emergency Visitor Visa granted me on the recommendation of the President's Advisory Committee.

Since 1941 I have lived in New York City. My portrait of Professor Einstein is included in the "20th Century Portrait Exhibition" of the Museum of Modern Art, New York City. - In February 1943, I had my first one man show in that city, critical reviews of which event I am enclosing herewith.

Meine Muenchner Studienzeit (1894-97) habe ich noch heute als beglueckende Jahre in Erinnerung. Wohl hatte ich gleich im Anfang, als ich Schueler der Akademie in der Lindenschmitt-Klasse wurde, einen peinlichen Schrecken: ueber unserem Atelier war die Dietz-Klasse, an deren Tuer ein Plakat hing: "Den Juden ist der Eintritt verboten". Das war 1894, ich kam aus Preßlau, wo ich in meiner Kindheit, im Gymnasium und in der Kunstschoole, den Begriff des Antisemitismus nicht kennen gelernt hatte. Im uebrigen aber hatte ich wahrend meiner Studienjahre in Muenchen persoenlich nie eine anti-juedische Gesinnung verspurt.

Nach dem Tode von Professor Lindenschmitt im Jahre 1895 wurde Franz von Stuck der damals mit seinen Bildern, wie "Die Suende" und "Der Krieg" eine ungeheure Beruehmtheit errungen hatte, Professor der Muenchner Akademie. Der Andrang zu seiner Klasse war gross; ich war einer seiner ersten zehn von ihm ausgewahlten Schueler. Stuck war ein ausgezeichneter Lehrer, der dem Schueler das Verstaendnis fuer die malerische Qualitaet der alten Meister beibrachte. Er schien mich auch sehr zu schaetzen und wachte mich 1897 zu seinem Meisterschueler.

Diese Muenchener Jahre waren ausserordentlich interessant und anregend. Ich kam sehr bald in den Kreis der jungen Literaten hinein, die sich in der Tuerkenstrasse in einer Bierkneipe trafen und an deren Spitze Joseph Ruederer stand. Er gab dem Kreise den Namen: die "Nebenregierung" und ich erlebte dort hochinteressante und froehliche Abende. Otto Erich Hartleben, Max Halbe, Schauenberger, Schaumburg, Michael Georg Conrad und der junge, noch unbekannte Frank Wedekind und viele andere spater beruehmte Namen, z.B. der sogenannte "Sittenfuchs" gehoerten dieser "Nebenregierung" an. Ich erinnere mich besonders an einen Abend, als Wedekind sein eben vollendetes "Sonnenpektrum" dem Kreis vorlas. In den Pausen gab es fast Pruegeleien zwischen den Ablehnenden und den Begeisterten. An einem anderen Abend wurde Dr. Oskar Panizza gefeiert, der ein halbes Jahr im Gefaengnis sitzen musste und gerade frei wurde. Er hatte diese Strafe fuer sein Drama "Das Liebeskonzil" wegen Gotteslaesterung absitzen muessen. Die grosse Bierzeitung, die fuer diesen Abend verfasst wurde und ausgezeichnete Beitraege dieses literarischen Kreises und auch Karrikaturen (zum Teil von mir selbst) enthielt, habe ich viele Jahre wie ein Kleinod bewahrt, bis sie mir in meinem bewegten Leben abhanden kam.

Fuer einen jungen angehenden Maler, der sich aus fuer Literatur und Musik heiss interessierte, waren diese Muenchener Zeiten von unschaetzbarem anregendem Werte. Ernst von Wolzogen spielte damals in Muenchen eine wesentliche Rolle.

Er führte die Regie in dem sehr ehrgeizigen akademisch-literarischen Verein, einer Studenten-Gruendung der Muenchener Universitaet. Diese jungen Leute führten die damals modernen Dramen auf, noch bevor sie in den grossen Theatern Berlins zu sehen waren, z.B., "Die Weber" von Gerhart Hauptmann, Ibsen's "Wildente" und die "Salome" von Oscar Wilde; letztere lernten die Berliner erst 6 Jahre später kennen.

In jener Zeit ist auch 1896 die Muenchener "Jugend" und der "Simplissimus" entstanden. Schon in diesen Jahren hat die "Jugend" viele Titelblaetter von mir gebracht.

Gesellschaftlich eroberte ich sehr viele vornehme juedische Kreise in der Brienerstrasse, die auch dem jungen Kunststudierenden, wie ich einer war, gelegentlich Auftraege gaben und so mein materielles Leben erleichterten. Ich kannte auch den damals sehr geschätzten Rabbiner Werner und den beruehmten Kantor und Gesangslehrer Kirchner, der der Lehrer des grossen Wagner-Saengers Knote war.

Ernst von Passart war der Intendant des Muenchener Hoftheaters und ich sah damals Theater-Auffuehrungen, die mich in meinen jungen Jahren sehr beeindruckten.

Schon in meiner Studienzeit hatte ich in Muenchen in der Seession ausgestellt und während meiner Jahre in Paris und Berlin war ich bis 1933 alljahrlich in den Ausstellungen der Muenchener Seession vertreten, bis Hitler mich aus dem Lande vertrieb.

Jetzt nach 25 Jahren zeigte ich meine Werke wieder in Deutschland und ich bekam mit Muenchen, wo ich bei Wolfgang Gurlitt eine Kollektion zur Ausstellung brachte. Ich kam von Amerika nach Muenchen und fand die Stadt durch neue Bauten und Anlagen außerordentlich verschöent. Ich hatte die Freude, von der dortigen Television zu einem Interview eingeladen zu werden, wo meine Bilder gezeigt wurden und ich ueber mein Leben in Amerika sprach.

Durch die Protektion der Baronin Goldschmidt-Rothschild hatte ich eine Wohnung  
und Atelier in der Rue de la Faisanderie 33, und als "Societaire du Salon  
d'Automne" konnte ich sofort ausstellen. Hatte bald Schueler und Auftraege.  
Damals wurde von den ausgewanderten Kuenstlern eine "Union des Artistes libres"  
gegruendet, die mich zu ihrer Präsidenten wählte. Mitbegründer war Paul  
Westheim, unter den Ausstellern waren Max Ernst, Gert Wölleheim und ver-  
schiedene andere Kuenstler mit Namen.

Mein letztes Portrait war das des Baron Edouard de Rothschild, was nicht ganz  
vollendet war, als 1940 der Auftraggeber und schliesslich ich selbst vor den  
herannahenden Nazis fliechten mussten. Das war im Juni 1940 und selbstver-  
staendlich musste ich alles Hab und Gut, inkl. Bildern in Paris zurück-  
lassen. Ein Teil meiner Bilder hat sich nach dem Krieg wieder gefunden,  
das war in dem beruehmten Zug der kleinen Ausweg mehr fand und der bei der  
Eroberung von Paris verschlissenen aufgefangen wurde.  
1940, durch Frankreich wandern, kamen wir endlich anfangs Juli in Marseille  
an. Dort unfreiwilliger Aufenthalt auf der Suche nach einem Visum, schliesslich  
mußte ich auch noch operiert werden und lag wochenlang im Hospital, konnte aber  
schliesslich im Maerz 1941 noch nicht ganz genesen, durch Spanien nach Portugal,  
Lissabon, gelangen. Dort die beruehnte Wartetei auf das Schiff nach Amerika.  
Inzwischen malte ich Kinderportraits, bis wir endlich abfahren konnten. Mai 1941  
landeten wir schliesslich in Baltimore und endlich in New York.

Schwerer Anfang, hatte aber bald Auftraege und Schueler. War 4 Sommer Lehrer  
in der von Wayman Adams gegründeten Sommer Mal-Schule "Old Mill" in Elizabeth-  
town, 8 Jahre eine eigene Klasse auf Long Island in Lawrence, ausserdem eine  
eigene Klasse in New York und bis vor ein paar Jahren Privatschueler.

Ich habe in diesen 20 Jahren hier sehr viele Portraits gemalt, die anliegende  
Liste der gleichzeitig uebersandten Photos erzaehlt ein paar Einzelheiten.

Meine erste One-man-show machte ich im Jahre 1943, seitdem habe ich beinahe  
alle zwei, drei Jahre eine Ausstellung hier in New York gehabt, die letzte  
im April 1964, und stets in der Galerie St. Etienne.

Da ich hier in New York im Alter von 67 Jahren neu beginnen musste, blieb mir

nicht mehr viel Kraft uebrig fuer öffentliche Aemter etc. Amerikanische Kollegen haben mich sehr gedraengt, eibigen Kuenstler-Klubs beizutreten und so wurde ich schliesslich Mitglied des Salmagundi-Clubs. Ich habe aber schon aus Gruenden der Entfernung - nicht allzu viel Gebrauch von dem Klub-Leben gemacht, ausserdem fand ich die Leitung der Ausstellungen dort so unmöglich und die Qualitaet der gezeigten Sachen zum Teil so unter dem Durchschnitt, dass ich meine Mitgliedschaft niederlegte.

Seitdem ich nicht mehr die koerperliche Kraft habe, Sommer-Klassen zu leiten und zu unterrichten, habe ich meine letzten zehn Sommer meistens in Europa verbracht, wo ich teils Portraits gemalt habe (z.B. 1954 Professor Heuss), teils Landschaften. Die meisten Sommer habe ich in Nord-Italien (Garda-See, Como-See, Orta) verbracht; die letzten 4 Sommer war ich in Ascona, wo wir sehr viele Freunde haben; zumeistens zieht uns beuestens in die Berge; teils aus gesundheitlichen Gruenden, teils hat die andere Landschaft plötzlich fuer mich einen Reiz.

Ich solle vielleicht noch erwähnen, dass mein Portrait von Rabbi Leo Baeck, gemalt in London in 1948, im Juedischen Museum von Cincinnati haengt.

Das Museum der Stadt New York (Museum of the City of New York) wie auch die Library of Congress in Washington haben Verschiedene meiner Musiker-Lithographien angekauft. Sonst haengen natuerlich Portraits von mir in verschiedenen öffentlichen Instituten hier im Lande.

Ich nehme an, dass Sie mit meinen "Musiker-Lithographien" Vertraut sind? Diese Zeichnungen sind alle im Konzert waehrend der Auffuehrung entstanden. Ich habe diese Arbeit das erste Mal in Deutschland waehrend des ersten Weltkriegs begonnen. Die ersten Zeichnungen erschienen ca. 1922 in Buchform, mit Text von Oscar Bie, im Julius Baud-Verlag "Im Konzert". Ich habe dann hier diese Arbeit viele Jahre lang forgtgesetzt, obwohl ich ueberall auf helle Begeisterung gestossen bin, hat sich kein Verlag entschliessen koennen, diese schwarz-weiss Blaetter herauszubringen. Es besteht im Moment ein kleiner Hoffnungsschimmer bei einem deutschen Verlag, aber ich moechte mich daruber noch nicht aussern, da die Sache noch ganz unreif ist. Es sind in den Jahren hier ca. 60 Musiker-Blaetter entstanden, teils sogar von Kuenstlern die ich schon in Jungen zeichnet hatte.

1952 erstes Mal wieder in Berlin. Besuchte Hofer. - Bei spaeteren Besuchen sah auch Ernst Fritsch, Ahlers-Hestermann, Graf Luckner.

E U G E N   S P I R O .

Eugen Spiro was born in Breslau, Germany, on April 18, 1874. He studied art, first at the Breslau Academy, later at the Munich Academy of Art as master scholar of the famous German painter Franz von Stuck. From 1906 to 1914 he lived in Paris, then in Berlin (until 1934), from 1935 to 1941 in France. In May 1941 the artist came to New York.

Spiro's artistic importance had received early recognition in Europe. As far back as 1911 he became "Officier d'Académie des Beaux-Arts Français". In Berlin he played a leading part in the artistic life of the capital as President of the Berliner Secession (1916 to 1933). When Hitler came to power, the artist was among those who received the famous letter forbidding them to paint, their art having been classified as "degenerate". Spiro left Berlin and returned to Paris, which had long since become his second home. In 1940 the rapid development of world events forced the artist to a hurried departure from Paris, where he had to leave behind all his possessions, especially all his works.

Spiro is one of the most wellknown German portrait painters. To name but a few of the celebrities painted by him, we cite the portraits of LORD READING, of the Nobel-Prize winners PROF. HABER, PROF. PLANCK and PROF. WARBURG, of the poets GERHART HAUPTMANN and THOMAS MANN, of the famous Zeppelin Commander ECENER, of the musicians BRUNO WALTER, ERICH KLEIBER, ARTHUR NIKISCH, FRITZ STIEDRY, RICHARD STRAUSS, FRITZ KREISLER, JASCHA HEIFETZ, PIATIGORSKY, ARTHUR SCHNABEL, LILLI LEHMANN, and many others. Since Spiro came to this country a year ago, he has painted the portrait of ALBERT EINSTEIN, recently exhibited at the portrait exhibition of the Museum of Modern Art, of HENRY BELLAMAN (author of "King's Row"), of the conductor FRITZ BUSCH, and of the actress ANNE BROWN.

The artistic work of Eugen Spiro is to be found in museums and private collections all over the world, many of them in the United States and Latin America.

The works created in America and included in the present exhibition, show Spiro's personality at the height of his creative strength. The big attention paid to his portrait of Albert Einstein at the Museum of Modern Art show, seems to indicate that his fame as a portrait painter will soon be reestablished in this country.

## mainly about musical manhattan

NEW YORK

**I**T WAS backstage after the concert, Schnabel had played a Mozart piano Concerto with more than even his usual elan, Fritz Stiedry doing practically the same with the New Friends of Music Orchestra. And I walked up to add my compliments to those of the crowd around them.

Only when I reached the inner circle, I found neither Schnabel nor Stiedry. Instead, there was a dark goateed gentleman holding two drawings in his hands, one a sketch of the pianist, the other, one of the conductor. And someone standing nearby introduced me to him, who it turned out was the celebrated artist Eugen Spiro.

Eugen Spiro, who has probably drawn and painted more contemporary musicians than any one person, has been in this country for just a few months. Yet, in Spiro tradition he has already sketched the best part of our concert season. For by now Spiro, who was himself trained to be a singer, and who is an ardent music lover, says he can't listen to music without holding a pencil in his hand.

Well over 60, Mr. Spiro's list of subjects includes many of the haloed names in the golden era which preceded our own. In 1906 he drew an unknown little man at the Trocadero in Paris, a little man and a booming voice that surrounded the artist on all sides in his gallery seat. It was Enrico Caruso.

Spiro drew the fabulous D'Albert not once but many times, with all of the portraits eventually landing in the newspapers as the musician's publicity. His drawings of Busoni were lifelike and numerous; so much so that in the recent Busoni exhibit at Carnegie Hall, where the composer was so variously represented, the Spiro portraits were the key pieces.

Just how Mr. Spiro went about making the portrait of the great Nikisch is a model of thoroughness. He says that he was not content to draw the conductor from the audience's viewpoint alone, that expressive though the back was, he knew there must be more. Consequently he received special permission from Nikisch to sit in his orchestra, and from there he drew a side view, and then a portrait en face.

There are many Spiros of Richard Strauss. The painter says that he himself prefers the one which he drew of Strauss at the premiere of his Alpine Symphony many years ago in Berlin. And speaking of preferences, he went on to tell me that of a long line of concerts only on one occasion was he too overwhelmed by what he heard and saw to draw.

It was an orchestra concert in a Brahms festival in Berlin over 20 years back. The conductor was Arthur Nikisch and as soloist there was a new violinist about 19 years of age. When Spiro listened to this "find" he was so fascinated that his sketchbook rested forgotten in his lap. The find was Adolph Busch. If this was the first and only impressive concert when he forgot to draw, I naturally wondered when had Mr. Spiro first remembered to do so. We had met for our interview over a cup of coffee and as our conversation progressed the lighter aspects of an odd profession began to appear.

He explained to me that the reason he had first started drawing while listening to music was to furnish a protection for his nerves in the first World War, shocked to learn that France, his adopted country was at war with his native Germany, Mr. Spiro left the Quartier Latin with conflicting emotions and with damaged nerves.

To repair the latter he went to concerts day and night back in Berlin. Only at first he found his nerves were too badly shot to take the treatment, and to lessen the impact he carried with him pencil and pad. Then it was not so long before he found he could concentrate on the music and do the drawing too.

"Anyway," he added, "an artist's eye observes the extraordinary differences in the movements of the various violinists, pianists or conductors. And it seems to me that one really must catch those differences which appear in actual performance if we are to portray the individual artist." The musicians were usually of his opinion.

"The only trouble I ever had about my drawings was with singers." He always caught the truth of their facial grimaces and depicted it, regardless, "for I have never flattered. Never."

It was always more interesting to catch the artist's expression than the beauty," he said. "But one woman singer complained, 'Oh, it's not beautiful' she reproached me. 'I am more beautiful than in your drawing.' It has not always been easy."

Mr. Spiro's realism served as parable occasionally. One celebrated singer always wore a freakish coiffure, which was subject of ridicule by all their friends. "Out of kindness to her, I drew her in concert with the coiffure exactly as absurd as it was in actuality." She took one look at the picture and discarded the hair-do forever.





## NEW WORK LISTS 40,000 BIOGRAPHIES

**2 Year Task Said to Have Cost  
\$250,000—Leaders of Many  
Nations Included**

A two-year task of compiling 40,000 biographies of artists, educators, scientists, jurists, and military, business and political leaders in sixty-five countries ends today with the publication of "World Biography," a two-volume book of 5,120 pages, by the Institute for Research in Biography.

The book, which weighs twenty pounds, was compiled at the cost of \$250,000, it was said, and with the aid of scientific and cultural groups, Government authorities, and United States embassies and legations throughout the world. The first printing of 6,000 has been sold almost entirely to libraries, colleges and universities, newspapers, magazines and radio stations.

The United States has 16,000 men and women listed; Great Britain, 4,000; the Scandinavian countries, 2,500; Canada, 1,400; France, 1,300, and the Soviet Union, 1,200.

"The Russian Embassy in Washington cooperated to the fullest ex-

tent," the institute said. "But, the listing of 1,200 Russians represents real digging, real getting behind the 'Iron Curtain.' It's as much as we could obtain. And we got those persons important in the Soviet satellite states as well."

Questionnaires, which were filled out by most of those listed, asked "full name, occupation, education, marital status, children, resumé of character, memberships in organizations, awards and honors, books published and office and home addresses."

George Bernard Shaw described himself as "Irish author and playwright, Nobel prize winner." Mr. Shaw said that he was a "descendant of Shaigh, third son of Macduff, Thane of Fife, Scotland, slayer of Macbeth."

U Tin Tut, the first Burmese Foreign Minister, submitted his biography shortly before he was assassinated in September. Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of Israel, and Shigeru Yoshida, the new Japanese Premier, also are included.

# THE GREATEST LIVING HONOR?
