ALICE FISCHER CALLED.

This morning she received the information that her application for a U.S. immigration visa has been rejected.

She had been in Washington on Dec. 15, 1943 for the hearing before the IVRC. She had a very bad impression of that hearing. She was asked some questions like : "Do you have a son in Canada?" She had no opportunity to say something in her favor. At the end one gentleman told her that she once received the visitor's visa probably by mistake. It probably was given for somebody else.

There seems to be a mix-up with another case. Miss F., therefore, wants to have some advice what to do. She especially fears now that the immigration visa for her mother who is in England will also be rejected. The hearing in this case was earlier than in her own case and the hearing board in this case was very nice to her. But there is no decision yet in this case.

Dear Naomi:

I hope you are having a wonderful time and getting plenty of rest.

Alice Fischer was in to see Irma. She received from Philadelphia, the revocation of her pre-examination on October 18. She comes under the Austrian quota. On October 22, she called from Woodstock to say that she just received the 8th order for deportation for January 18, 1946. Since Irma thought that you did not have her name on your list, she felt that it should be given to you right away, just in case you might be able to look into Alice Fischer's case, too.

Mr. Lee Borochowicz just came in. He, too, received a revocation of pre-examination, dated October 22, from Philadelphia. He comes under the Polish quota. However, his wife, Mrs. Elly Brucker Borochowicz, who comes under the German quota, received a letter dated October 7, 1946, from Philadelphia, stating that the Philly office authorized their New York office to pre-examine her.

It appears that the revocation orders are now a general rule---something new.

Victor Chernov and his wife received a letter dated October 7 from Philadelphia stating that their New York Office has been authorized to pre-examine them. On October 18, they received a letter from the New York Office which stated that they would receive their appointment for pre-examination as soon as they were "invited" by the Consul in Montreal. In the meantime, we received a form letter from the Consul in Montreal this morning, stating that their papers were found satisfactory, with some exceptions which they were to have in their possession when appearing in Canada (general procedure, as in the past). There is a passage at the end of the letter which states that their quota is oversubscribed and a long waiting list has resulted.

The same type of letters have been received today from the Consul in Montreal for the Ellenbogens, and Sonia Blond. However, neither revocation nor authorization for pre-examination in New York, have been received for the Ellenbogens or Sonia Blond as yet. At least, they have not been in to tell us about it.

We are forced again to call on you in another of our Change of Status cases where difficulties have arisen.

This is the case of Miss Alice Fischer, who was born in Vienna, Austria on September 27, 1907. She came to the United States in August 1941 on a Special Emergency Visa as guest of the American Federation of Labor.

Miss Fischer is a professional designer of ceramics. She has established a very prosperous business in her field in Woodstock, New York. She is also the owner of her home and land in Woodstock. In her business, she works in partnership with a friend who is soon to become an American citizen, and also employs an American girl. Since she is the designer and professional in the business, the other two women would lose their means of livelihood if she were forced to leave this country.

She is very well known in the field of ceramics and was invited to exhibit her works at the "American Crafts" in Baltimore, Maryland two and one-half years ago. As a result of this exhibition, she has received much acclaim from American authorities and experts in the field of ceramics. Her work is mentioned in the book on American crafts by Dan Cooper.

Miss Fischer has no relatives or friends in her native country, and therefore, no one to whom to return. She took all the necessary steps to manifest her desire to stay in this country and become an American citizen.

BC Forms were filed with the Department of State in April, 1945, and Advisory Approval was granted on July 6, 1945. Your office authorized pre-examination on September 17, 1945. On May 31, 1946, Miss Fischer was notified by the United States Consul in Montreal, Canada, that her visa application had been examined and found satisfactory. Just recently, on October 17, 1946, your office again wrote to her--this time to tell her that her pre-examination had been revoked; and the following day, on October 18, she was denied an extension of temporary stay and was advised to leave this country on or before January 18, 1947.

Alice Fischer is a political refugee. She fled from her home in Austria after the Anschluss. She has no family or professional ties left in her native country. To force her to return there would not only mean a terrible hardship in the loss of her business and property, but would also mean the additional hardship of becoming another displaced person in Austria.

We have been notified that priority is given on the quota waiting lists for those persons for whom BC forms were filed with the State Department. In Miss Fischer's case, this would mean that she has officially been registered under the Austrian quota for almost two years.

We would be grateful, therefore, if you would reconsider your decision in her case and reauthorize pre-examination for her.

We are writing to you on behalf of Miss Alice Fischer, who has been trying for sometime to change her status from that of a visitor to a legal immigrant in the United States.

Miss Fischer filed an application for immigration visa with your department under the BC procedure in April, 1945. Advisory Approval was granted in July, 1945. Because of the change in policy, according to which the State Department no longer accepted visa applications directly, Miss Fischer made a new application to the United States Consul in Montreal for her immigration visa on July 25th, 1945. She was notified on May 31st, 1946, by the Montreal Consul, that her application was found satisfactory, but that she would have to wait because the quota to which she was chargeable (Austrian quota) was oversubscribed.

We would be grateful if you would notify the Consul in Montreal of Miss Fischer's date of registration under the BC procedures in order to shorten the waiting period for her quota number.

Your name has now been reached on the priority waiting list under the Austrian quota. A nonpreference quota number has been allocated by the quota control office for issuance to you during the first fifteen days of January 1947, provided, of course, that upon examination you are found admissible to the United States as an immigrant under the immigration laws.

You may call at this office any weekday morning at nine o'clock (Saturdays and legal holidays excepted) during the above-mentioned period to file your application for visa.

No further letter of invitation to call at the Consulate General is required. This letter may be shown to the United States immigration authorities in connection with pre-examination to facilitate entry into Canada.
