

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ACCEPTS INVITATION TO JOIN AMERICA EAST CONFERENCE School Will Become Full Member in 2001-02 Academic Year

ALBANY, N.Y. – The University at Albany has accepted an invitation to become a full member of America East Conference, effective with the 2001-02 academic year, as President Dr. Karen R. Hitchcock announced today. Seventeen of the school's nineteen intercollegiate varsity teams will be immediately eligible for conference championships and NCAA post-season competition.

"We are most pleased the University's search for conference affiliation has reached a successful conclusion," President Hitchcock said. "The America East Conference membership and the University at Albany have similar missions. These institutions have high academic standards, operate their athletic departments with integrity and demonstrated quality, and value the student-athlete as a whole person. We look forward to a long and productive partnership."

America East is in its 13th year of all-sports championship competition with a reputation as a comprehensive conference that is committed to broad-based Division I athletics. America East sponsors 21 conference championships for men and women. Admission to NCAA championships can be earned in baseball, men's and women's basketball, field hockey, men's golf, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and volleyball. In addition, student-athletes compete as individuals for NCAA events in cross country, swimming and diving, and track and field.

The current America East membership includes, Boston University, University of Delaware, Drexel University, University of Hartford, Hofstra University, University of Maine, University of New Hampshire, Northeastern University, Towson University, and University of Vermont. The University at Stony Brook was also accepted as a conference member today.

"Conference affiliation for our entire athletics program will enhance the institution's Division I growth," said Director of Athletics and Recreation Dr. Lee McElroy, who has spearheaded the University's conference search process since his appointment in July 2000. "With America East Conference membership, the University's goals and aspirations for intercollegiate athletics are now clearly defined. Our student-athletes and coaches will have an opportunity to compete for both conference and NCAA championships. America East will also provide increased visibility for athletics and strengthen our identity with the University's students, alumni, faculty and friends."

WOMEN - Harvard 68, Albany 55

Albany, N.Y. – Freshman **Hana Pelito** had 21 points and eight rebounds to lead Harvard past Albany, 68-55, in a non-conference game on Monday evening at the Recreation and Convocation Center.

Harvard (5-11) led 32-27 early in the second half, but then tallied eight straight points to take control. Peljto, a 6-foot-2 forward, converted a three-point play when she was fouled on a short drive in the lane to start the run. She later gave her club a 40-27 cushion on a 3-pointer field goal with 12:18 remaining. The Crimson, who canned 22 of 25 free throws, led by double figures the rest of the way.

In the first half, Albany (5-16) leaped to an 11-4 advantage, before Harvard regrouped with 13 of the game's next 17 points. Peljto had five markers in that outburst, before **Jennifer Monti**, who had 10 points, put her team on top for good at 17-15. Meanwhile, Harvard's defense held the Great Danes to a season-low 17 first-half points and forced 13 turnovers in the opening stanza.

"Their post players had a tremendous size advantage, and as a result we got into foul trouble," said Albany coach Mari Warner. "We were taking shots after one pass, and you can't play undisciplined."

Sarah Johnson, a 6-foot-4 center, came off the bench to score 13 points for Harvard, who has won four of its last five starts. Sophomore guard **Chris Gray** led Albany with 11 points. **Liz Tucker**, who scored 10, moved into third place on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,097 points.

Boston, Mass. – **Jessica Walton** (Fonda-Fultonville H.S.) led the women's 4x800-meter relay to a school record and **Jamie Rodriguez** (Christian Brothers Academy) qualified for the IC4A championships in the 5,000-meter run to highlight the University at Albany's performances at the 20th annual Terrier Classic. The two-day event was held at the Boston University Armory.

The Great Danes, who were second in the 4x800 behind Duke, shattered an Albany standard by nearly 26 seconds with an ECAC-qualifying time of 9:21.67. The relay of Walton, **Dinnah Decatus**, **Diane Matthews** and **Jessica Burger** (Granville Central) broke a mark set in 1997. Walton ran 2:17.6 in the leadoff leg, while Burger went 2:21.3 as the anchor.

Rodriguez, a junior who was UAlbany's top cross-country runner in the fall, ran a personal-best 14:39.75 to finish 10th overall. His effort was the third-best time in school history.

In other Terrier Classic action, the Great Danes were third in the men's 4x800 relay. **Noel Campbell**, **Ike Cherry**, **Ed Fotiades** and **Adam Rice** ran a time of 7:52.12. **Naron Stewart** and **John Morris** tied for third in the high jump with a leap of 6-feet, 6 inches. **Ronald Edmundson** was fourth in the triple jump (46-11.50) and **Fred Frese** (Scotia-Glenville) took fifth in the pole vault (13-11.25). **Cherice' Vanderhall** threw 39-4.50 to place sixth in the women's shot put, while **Laura Kearns** (Saratoga Springs) was ninth in the 3,000 (10:46.13).

Stony Brook 67, Albany 64

Albany, N.Y. – **Leon Brisport** had 21 points and 17 rebounds, as Stony Brook held off Albany, 67-64, on Saturday at the Recreation and Convocation Center.

Albany (4-17) wiped out a 17-12 deficit midway through the first half with 16 of the game's next 19 points. **Sam Hopes**, who totaled six rebounds and six steals, netted six of his 16 points in that span. **E.J. Gallup**, who also scored 16, put his team on top at 21-19 with a three-point shot, before **Will Brand** sank a pair of free throws for a 28-20 advantage.

Stony Brook (11-9) still trailed 37-30 early in the second half, but then went on a 12-3 spurt to go in front. Brisport, who scored 14 in the final stanza, gave his team the lead for good at 42-41 with a turnaround in the lane.

The Seawolves, who have won five of their last seven contests, pushed out to a nine-point lead on three occasions in the stretch. Brisport, a 6-foot-8 senior, scored in the paint for a 66-57 cushion with 4:05 remaining.

Albany's Brand, who had 19 of his season-high 24 points after halftime, fueled a string of seven consecutive points with a three-pointer. Gallup then hit a driving layup to cut the margin to 66-64.

Freshman guard **David Munir**, who had 12 points, split a pair of free throws with 23.8 seconds to play. Gallup misfired on two 3-point attempts in the waning seconds in an effort to force overtime.

"We knew they would take Gallup off the double, and Will (Brand) was the second option on a step out," said Albany coach Scott Beeten about his team's final possession. "Brisport is just too strong inside. I have to be pleased with our effort against a pretty good team."

Stony Brook's **Jairus McCollum** and **Mike Konopka** had 11 and 10 points, respectively.

Dartmouth 61, Albany 56

Albany, N.Y. -- Katie Shelly scored 19 points, as Dartmouth won its fourth straight with a 61-56 non-conference victory over Albany on Saturday evening at the Recreation and Convocation Center.

Dartmouth (5-11) reversed an early 10-3 deficit with a 22-4 run. Shelly, a 6-foot-1 sophomore, and **Katharine Hanks** each had six points in that stretch. **Samantha Burnham** scored in the lane to hand the Big Green a 25-14 advantage with 6:22 left in the period.

The Big Green still led 42-31 early in the second half, before Albany (5-15) slowly worked their way back into the contest. **Chris Gray**, who had a season-high 12 points off the bench, buried a three-point field goal to slice the gap to 52-47.

The Great Danes would later pull within a basket, at 56-54, on freshman **Katherine Hemlock's** three-pointer with 3:14 to play. However, **Samantha Berdinka** answered with a 3-point shot on her team's next possession to keep the lead safe.

"We were not able to hit some shots and started to question what we were doing on offense," said Albany coach **Mari Warner**, whose team was held to 35.8 percent from the field. "We didn't have good ball movement. Our team will have regroup real quick with Harvard here on Monday."

Dartmouth's **Keri Downs** had 14 points, while Hanks added 13 points and eight rebounds. Albany's **Marie Connors** scored a career-high 20 on 7-of-10 shooting, and grabbed nine rebounds.

Dartmouth 72, Albany 58

Albany, N.Y. – Senior guard **Greg Buth** scored 25 points, as Dartmouth won its third straight with a 72-58 victory over Albany on Wednesday evening at the Recreation and Convocation Center.

Dartmouth (5-11) led 14-12 early in the opening period, but then went on a 13-3 run. Buth buried consecutive three-point baskets for a 27-15 advantage with 7:17 remaining.

The Big Green, who upended Albany, 88-76, just four days ago on their home floor, led 31-22 at halftime. **Vedad Osmanovic**, who had 12 of his 17 points in the final stanza, scored nine markers in a 14-3 outburst after the intermission. Osmanovic sank a baseline shot, before hitting a slam dunk after a steal to hand Dartmouth a commanding 45-25 lead.

Albany (4-16) sliced that deficit in a half on two occasions in the final five minutes, but could never get any closer. **Will Brand**, a 6-foot-5 junior, had 18 points and 11 rebounds, and became the 24th player in Albany history to reach the 1,000-point mark.

"I thought we played much better defensively, but we didn't make any open shots," said Albany coach **Scott Beeten**, whose bench was shortened with center Joe Vukovic sidelined with a severe ankle sprain. "They (Dartmouth) are a pretty good team. They make plays and hit three-point shots in key situations."

lan McGinnis had 15 points and 16 rebounds for the Big Green, who held Albany to 33.8-percent shooting. The Great Danes had four players in double figures, including an 11-point, 14-rebound effort by Alex Barnhill.

Columbia 78, Albany 66

New York, N.Y. – **Craig Austin** scored a career-high 35 points to lead Columbia to a 78-66 non-conference win over Albany on Monday evening at Levien Gymnasium.

Columbia (5-11) led 13-11, but then scored 14 of the game's next 18 points to go in front for good. **Michael Merley** tallied six points in that stretch, before Austin buried a baseline jumper in transition for a 27-15 advantage with 6:51 remaining in the period. The Lions, who shot 54.3 percent from the field, including 10 of 17 from three-point range, led 41-29 at halftime.

Albany (4-15) closed within 41-35 on consecutive three-point baskets by freshman **E.J. Gallup**, who had 18 of his 28 points in the final period. Columbia responded with 11 unanswered points to take firm control. Austin nailed back-to-back long-range jumpers to begin that decisive spurt.

"We can't seem to find a stop defensively," said Albany coach **Scott Beeten**, whose team lost for the fifth straight time. "We used more man-to-man tonight and contested shots. But we are very road weary and looked tired on the floor. We just don't have enough players to run in and out of the game."

Mike McBrien and **Joe Case** added 16 and 11, respectively, for the Lions. **Will Brand** posted 15 points and eight rebounds for the Great Danes, who are home on Wednesday against Dartmouth.

West Point, N.Y. – **Tammy Freeman** was a double-winner in the 55- and 200-meter dashes, as Albany won the USMA Invitational at Army's Gillis Field House. The Great Danes edged Lafayette, 119-117, for the women's title. The UAlbany men were second behind the host school.

Freeman, one of four UA women to win an individual event, sprinted 55 meters in 7.34 seconds, and went 26.44 in the 200. **Onieka Randall** (400**), Jessica Burger** (500) and **Nierra Jones** (triple jump) also posted first-place finishes. The Great Danes were also first in the 4x400 relay.

In the men's competition, **Jamie Rodriguez** (Christian Brothers Academy) won the mile run by nearly four seconds with a time of 4:17.29. **Alix Rodriques** was first across the tape in the 200-meter dash (22.70), and took second at 55 meters. **Ronald Edmundson**, the school's record-holder in the triple jump, posted a winning mark of 46-feet, 11-inches. **John Morris** (high jump) and **Aggrey Morris** (400) also claimed individual events.

Army totaled 209 points to lead the men's standings. The Great Danes, who scored 153, are at Boston University's Terrier Classic on Jan. 26-27.

Hanover, N.H.—Greg Buth scored a season-high 33 points and Dartmouth set a school record with 18 three-point field goals en route to an 88-76 non-conference victory over Albany on Saturday evening at Leede Arena.

Dartmouth (4-11) snapped a 25-25 tie late in the first half with eight of the game's next 10 points. Buth, who canned 9-of-13 three-point attempts, hit a long-range jumper to put his team on top for good. The Big Green, who made 50 percent of their field goal attempts, led 37-31 at halftime.

In the second half Buth hit a three-pointer and **lan McGinnis** sank two foul shots to extend Dartmouth's lead to double figures. Albany (4-14) closed within 59-52 on a three-pointer by **Antione Johnson**, who netted 21 of his career-high 27 points in the final period. However, the Big Green wiped out the threat when Buth buried three consecutive three-point shots for a 71-54 advantage with 8:30 remaining.

"They shot the ball extremely well and we could not cover them," Albany coach **Scott Beeten** said. "We changed defenses and tried to deny Buth the ball. But every time another guy stepped out to hit another three. We tried every defense and every combination."

Vedad Osmanovic had 12 points to pace four other Darmouth players in double figures. Albany's **Will Brand** had 21 points and 13 rebounds, and scored 20 or more for the fourth straight game.

These same two teams will meet again in Albany on Wednesday (Jan. 24).

Hamilton, N.Y. – Freshman guard **Kathryn Hemlock** scored a career-high 21 points and **Jess McGinlay** added 21 off the bench, as Albany ended an eight-game road losing streak with an 83-70 victory over Colgate on Thursday evening at Cotterell Court.

Albany (5-14) led 67-58 with 6:36 remaining, but Colgate (3-12) tallied seven unanswered points to close within one basket on a jumper by **Colleen McCaffrey**, who had 18 points and 11 rebounds.

The Great Danes responded with an 11-0 run to erase the threat, and took a 78-65 advantage with 2:32 left. McGinlay, who had 12 second-half points helped her team pull away with a three-point play when she was fouled on a follow shot in the lane. Sophomore guard **Chris Gray** followed with a fastbreak layup.

In the opening stanza, Albany pushed out to a 31-14 lead on the strength of 54-percent shooting. Hemlock, who made 9-of-15 from the floor, and added five assists, totaled 11 first-half points.

"Several people contributed and we got into a rhythm early in the game," said McGinlay, who scored 20-plus points for the third straight contest, and grabbed 10 rebounds. When Colgate cut the score to two points, we told ourselves to pick up the defense. This was the first time this season we had to protect a big lead on the road."

The Great Danes, who shot 51.6 percent from the field on the night, led 45-30 at halftime. However, Colgate would slice the deficit to two points on three occasions in the final period. **Laura Rohrbacher's** layup got the Red Raiders within 52-50 with 12:21 to play.

Albany's Liz Tucker and Dawn DiMicco each scored in double figures with 10 points. Colgate's Sarah Parks had 15 points, while Melissa Burke added 12.

Ali, a transfer from Otero Junior College in LaJunta, Colo., suffered the injury in Albany's 60-46 loss to Cornell on Jan. 16. The 6-foot-1 junior forward will have surgery on Monday, Jan. 22. Ali was averaging 3.4 points and 4.4 rebounds in 17 games. The Colorado Springs, Colo., native made six starts this season and totaled a season-high 11 points at Hartford on Dec. 13.

Albany, N.Y. – **Deborah Stevens** scored 13 points to pace four players in double figures, as Cornell posted a 60-46 non-conference victory over Albany on Tuesday evening at the Recreation and Convocation Center.

Cornell (8-7) used a 16-2 run to begin the second half to break open a tight contest. **Jennifer Linker**, a 6-foot-1 senior, tallied six of her 11 points in that run, while Stevens added a pair of baskets. **Karen Force** converted back-to-back layups for a 39-22 lead with 13:36 remaining.

Albany (4-14) got as close as 39-31 on a pair of free throws by **Jess McGinlay**, who had 17 of her 23 points in the final period. The Big Red pushed their lead back to double digits, as Linker made a three-point play when she was fouled on a driving bank shot.

The Great Danes, who were coming off a 24-point win over Stony Brook on Saturday, held an early 17-10 advantage. But Cornell, who had dropped five of its previous six contests, used a stingy zone defense to get back into the contest. Stevens gave her team its first lead, at 21-20, when she converted a three-point play after being fouled on a back-door layup.

"I thought we pressed a bit and took some bad shots in the first half," said Albany coach **Mari Warner**, whose team was held to 31.6-percent shooting from the field. "It came down to what we did or didn't do offensively, and we just did not put the ball in the hole."

Cornell's **Tanya Karcic** and **Katie Romey** added 12 and 10 points, respectively. **Liz Tucker** had 12 points, nine rebounds and five assists for the Great Danes.

Edinburg, Texas – **Brian Merriweather** had 19 of his 24 points in the second half and Texas-Pan American shot 70 percent from the field in the final period for a 84-69 victory over Albany on Saturday evening at UTPA Fieldhouse.

Texas-Pan American (7-10) broke a 49-49 tie midway through final stanza with 14 consecutive points. **Mire Chatman** tallied 11 of his 23 points during that stretch. The 6-foot-2 junior college transfer broke the tie on a slam dunk off a lob pass, and followed with a three-point field goal. The Broncs, who made 21 of 30 shots after halftime, completed that outburst when Chatman hit a jumper for a 63-49 advantage with 8:05 remaining.

Texas-Pan American jumped out to an early 15-8 lead midway through the opening period. Albany (4-12) would regroup, and went on a 14-2 run to grab a 34-24 advantage. Freshman **E.J. "We played a perfect first half, except for the turnovers," Albany coach **Scott Beeten** said. "We did a good job with changing defenses, but they started to find the holes in the second half. They have more weapons and a much deeper bench than we do. They just had too many playmakers."

John Braxton and Kyle Sanders had 14 and 10 points, respectively, for the Broncs, who have won eight of their last nine home games dating back to last season. Will Brand led the Great Danes with 21 points and seven rebounds, while Alex Barnhill posted season-highs with 13 points and nine rebounds.

Albany (4-13) jumped out to an 11-0 lead over the opening five minutes and would never trail in the ballgame. Dawn DiMicco, who tallied a season-high 16 points, recorded five markers during the outburst. Stony Brook (10-7) clawed into the deficit and made the score 18-13 on a Sherry Jordan three-point field goal with 9:48 remaining in the stanza. Jordan finished with 23 points and six rebounds.

The Great Danes, who shot a season-high 56.1 percent from the field, posted an 18-6 spurt over the final five minutes of the half and took a 43-23 advantage into the intermission. McGinlay recorded 14 of her 18 first-half points during that stretch, including two three-pointers in the final minute. She converted 11 of 14 shots on the game, while knocking down a careerhigh five three-point field goals.

"We played a full 40 minutes," said Albany coach Mari Warner, whose club has won 11 of its last 12 in the series against its archrival. "This team came out strong and maintained its intensity throughout the contest. Everyone played their role perfectly."

"I don't think I could have shot the ball any better than I did tonight," said McGinlay. "This is a great win and confidence booster for the team."

The Seawolves, who shot 52 percent in the second half, were only able to come within 14 points on two occasions. Albany committed a season-best 11 turnovers. Liz Tucker was the third Great Dane in double figures with 12 points, eight rebounds and eight assists. Jill George scored 14 points and grabbed seven rebounds for Stony Brook.

J.T. HERFURTH NAMED FOOTBALL GAZETTE LINEMAN OF THE YEAR Albany, N.Y. – University at Albany's J.T. Herfurth has been named the 2000 Football Gazette NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major Offensive Lineman of the Year. Herfurth, a senior offensive tackle, was selected to the publication's Mid-Major I-AA All-America first team.

Herfurth, a 6-foot-6, 300-pound lineman, earned Associated Press and AFCA first-team recognition in December, and will play in the Hula Bowl on January 20 in Maui, Hawaii.

Sophomore **Josh Bazan** was voted Football Gazette's Mid-Major Linebacker of the Year. Bazan, who also received first-team All-America honors, led the Great Danes in tackles (109), hits for a loss (18), sacks (6.0), fumbles forced (4) and fumbles recovered (8).

Junior tailback **Brian Manigault**, who rushed for a school-record 1,041 yards and 15 touchdowns, offensive guard **Alex Argulewicz**, defensive tackle **Jason Martin** and free safety **Samson Brown** were picked in the honorable mention category.
