








Fiscal Year 2012-13
Total Expenditures by Program Class (NACUBO)








Binghamton F&A Rate of Return 25.1%











Stony Brook F&A Rate of Return 29.4%




Campus Assessment Distribution



Calculating Method for Return to Units

The total Return to Units for the upcoming fiscal year are calculated from the <u>Projected Indirect Expenditures</u> for that year. From the Projected Indirect Expenditures, the RF Central Assessment for that fiscal year are deducted. The remaining funds are then allocated to the campus, as the Annual ICR Allocation for the UAlbany Campus. 10% of the ICR Allocation to the Campus is the amount returned to units.

The ICR Allocation for each academic unit is calculated by dividing its indirect expenditures minus the RF assessment from the previous fiscal year by the Total Indirect Expenditures from the same year. The resulting percentage is multiplied by the Total UAlbany ICR Unit Allocations to determine the allocation amount.

The calculated allocation amount is then split 80% to the Unit and 20% to the Dean.





Percent Change in Total Expenditures by School/College


Total Expenditures - Fiscal Year Comparison




College of Arts and Sciences Total Expenditures - Fiscal Year Comparison






School of Business
Total Expenditures - Fiscal Year Comparison





Total Expenditures - Fiscal Year Comparison



Total Expenditures - Fiscal Year Comparison




Total Expenditures - Fiscal Year Comparison




Criminal Justice Total Expenditures - Fiscal Year Comparison




Computing and Information Total Expenditures - Fiscal Year Comparison









University-Wide Centers Reporting to the VP for Research Total Expenditures - Fiscal Year Comparison





