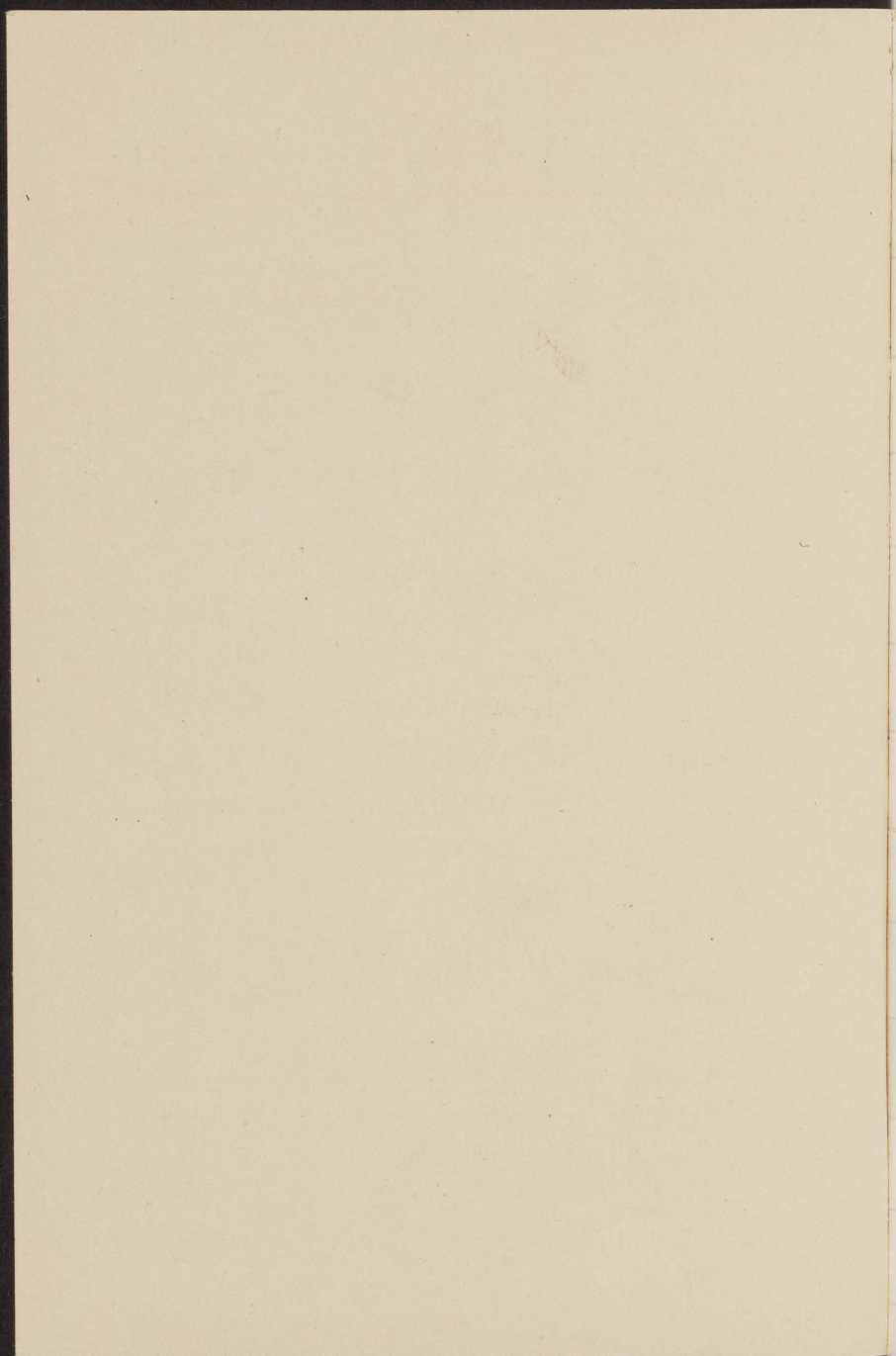

building used for the primary department was found last winter to be utterly inadequate. On motion the Com. on Repairs (Messrs. Pruyn and Van Rensselaer) were empowered to do whatever in their judgment was cheapest and best to remedy the defect. The matter of providing necessary fire-escapes and making necessary repairs to the building was referred to the same committee, with power.

Commissioner Hooper formally announced that the sum of thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000.) from the amount appropriated by the last legislature for repairs and improvements of the Normal Schools of the State had been set aside for this college. Pres. Milne stated that the house and lot known as no. 455 Madison Ave., which adjoins the rear of the property now owned by the college, was in the market for sale.

On motion of Mr. Layswell the Treasurer of this Committee was empowered and instructed to take the steps necessary to consummate the purchase of the house and lot known as no. 455 Madison Ave., for a sum not exceeding five thousand two hundred dollars (\$5,200.) and any necessary incidental expenses.

On motion the meeting adjourned.
