# State Holds **New Name**

The State University Board of Trustees has announced that the University's eleven Colleges of Education have a new name as of Friday, October 13. Albany State's official title is now the State University College at Albany.

The Trustees' action follows ap-VOL. XLVI NO. 21 proval last month by the Board of Regents of the University's plan to establish undergraduate curriculums in the liberal arts and sciences at the teacher education colleges. A program of gradual and orderly transition of these colleges to multi-purpose institutions will be initiated.

Since non-teacher education students eventually will be admitted to study general programs at the colleges over a varying schedule of dates, from 1962 to 1965, the Trustees determined their names should be changed to reflect this departure from their previously highly specialized nature.




