SUBJECT: Campus Progress Report No. 101

This morning, we inspected and accepted the following fields:

- (1) Both baseball diamonds
- (2) The resurfacing and reseeding of the four Athletic fields south of the Dutch Quad
- (3) The balance of the Irrigation System, irrigating all regions south of the academic podium, inclusive of all athletic fields, baseball diamonds and the campus center mall
- (4) Both large flag poles at the Great Circle entrance off Washington Avenue.

These will now be available for us to fly the colors on all occasions when the University wishes to do so. Flags are also available and will be on hand for the Rockefeller Gallery Show opening.

All take overs were subject to punch lists, although the fields south of the Dutch Quad are rather sparsely grassed, but it was the belief of all concerned that grass is established, and under proper care, will now grow. A perfectly level field is now available, and we will have the use of it during the fall season, for womens' Health and Physical Education activities.

In the interest of allowing this grass a little more growing time, it would be well for the Health and Physical Education Department to rotate the people on these fields as much as possible. It is also advisable for the Plant Superintendent's Department to fertilize and reseed more of the barren spots this fall, in order to upgrade the entire area for subsequent use. A little attention on a few such areas will vastly improve the field.
