





#### Strike Continues in London

LONDON (AP) Strikes and slowdowns by 1.5 million public service workers demanding hefty pay hikes entered their fourth week yesterday with no sign of an end to the nationwide disruptions. The National Union of Public Employees, one of the four labor unions waging the campaign, said it would escalate its actions to retaliate Some cities have not had refuse collections since Christmas hazards The disruptions began Jan. 22 but were preceeded nearly 1,300 schools and officials estimate more than a halfnillion children will not be able to attend classes this week.

#### Defense Secretary in Israel

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP) When U.S. Defense Secretary Harold Brown arrives in Israel today, he will find strategic planners here preoccupied with two new threats to Israel's security — the upheaval in Iran and the reconciliation between Iraq and Syria. Brown's swing through Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Israel and Egypt is aimed at demonstrating America's commitment to those countries in the aftermath of the overthrow of Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi by a mass vement seeking to rid Iran of Western influences. The Shah had nurtured important ties with Israel over the years, and these links were yet another target of the Moslem opposition in Iran, For one thing, Israel had imported an estimated 60 percent of its oil from Iran, oil that now will be cut off permanently. Israeli officials contend they will be able to make up for the loss of Iranian petroleum, but the subject is likely to be raised in meetings with Brown. A long-standing

ALBANY, N.Y. State police said an autopsy yesterday showed Chad Springett died of a ruptured intestine. Denese Ann Northup, the boy's mother, and Wayne C. Utter were arrested Sunday after authorities found the boy dead in the women's Otsego mobile home. Problems in the Peace Corps

WASHINGTON (AP) The Peace Corps fails to adequately teers, with some candidates being interviewed by telephone and others not at all, according to a new study by the General Accounting Office. The GAO, an investigative arm of Congress, also said the overseas volunteer service fails to give adequate information to volunteers about the conditions under which they are expected to live. One costly result has been that "many volunteers are terminating service before scheduled completion — frequently within the first months of service," said the report. And the Peace Corps' personnel turnover rate was three times as high as that of other federal agencies, the study noted, in part because the corps limits the time its staff members can serve. The study was conducted of the Peace Corps office in Washington and its operations in Colombia, Honduras, Malaysia, nistan and Kenya.

### Soviets Win Challenge Cup

NEW YORK (AP) The Soviet National team's triumph in the first-ever Challenge Cup series left the National Hockey League in a ponderous position. The 17 governors agreed to shu! down the league for a full week — thereby losing seven playing dates and compressing more than 50 games per team into the first 4½ months of the season. They underwrote the expense of the three-game series, picking up the tab for the 36-man Soviet delegation which flew here first class, stayed at a posh downtown hotel, and ate three hearty meals a day. They took a risk that the attractiveness of the matchup, the NHL all-stars against a Soviet team bolstered by high-calibe players from other club teams, would help toward the acquisition of a network television contract in the United States. Included in this risk was an agreement a Soviet club team could make a four-city tour against NHL teams at NHL expense; that a Soviet referee, Victor Dombrovski, could work a game in the Challenge Cup; and that the NHL would send a team of "Future Stars" to the Izvestia Cup tournament in Moscow. This was all well and good in the planning stages. ## Singer Redbone Bruised In Passenger Plane Crash

CLARKSBURG, W. Va. (AP) Singer Leon Redbone, one of 25 people on an Allegheny Airlines passenger plane that crashed Monday in Bridgeport, says he was fortunate to escape with only bruises.

"I ache all over and my hip hurts. But nothing is broken as far as I know," Redbone said from his hospital bed a few hours after the crash. "At the moment, I feel like I'm 93," said Redbone, who is in his 30s.

Two people were killed and 23 others were injured when the propjet nipped and crashed snortly after taking off in a snowstorm Redbone, a blues singer from New Hope, Pa., said there was little

"All of a sudden I was hanging upside down in the plane. It was a metter of moments before the plane came down," he said. "Everybody

was disoriented, but no more than could be expected." Redbone was accompanied on the ill-fated flight by his road

## Two Die In Fiery West Va. Plane Crash

twin-engine Allegheny Airlines propjet with 25 persons aboard flipped over and crashed while taking off from an airport in a snowstorm Monday. Two persons were killed and at least four were njured, authorities said.

engaged in some political maneuvering in trying to force a tuition increase on SUNY students. He is attempting to pressure the Legislature and Trustees to increase tuition without taking the responsibility. The end result, however, would be the same: less money for SUNY, a cut in programs, and a heavier financial burden for students and parents. This is all part of Carey's attack on public higher education.

What we are faced with now is a slight change of tactics by the Governor. Originally, Carey had planned to include a proposal for a \$100 tuition increase in his executive budget. This proposal was met with fierce opposit from students. Students, organized by SASU and the campus student unions held press conferences, picketed the Legislature, organized mass letter writing campaigns, and formed anti-tuition coalitions. Because of this pressure, Carey decided to take the tuition ncrease proposal out of the budget. Instead, SUNY to \$35 million. The budget is now in the hands of the legislature, where they can amend it. According to the Chancellor, only \$10 million is needed to avoid a tuition hike (Carey gave one and one half times that much to Syracuse University for a domed stadium).

Unfortunately, both Chancellor Wharton and the Board of Trustees are going along with the Governor's budget, and are considering how tuition should be raised, rather than

During the last few weeks the Governor has 1 forming a strategy on how to get an increase in the budget from the Legislature to avoid an increase. At the Trustee meeting in New York on February 9, the Trustees basically decided to accept the budget as inevitable and formulate a method of raising tuition.

It is clear, then, that we can not expect much help from either the Chancellor or the Trustees. Both refuse to challenge the Governor or the Legislature. Therefore, we as ourselves. There are plans for a massive statewide demonstration at the Capitol in March and many other direct actions. We have been gaining support in the legislature and with many groups throughout the state. SCATH (the Statewide Coalition Against the Tuition Hike) is rapidly gaining support from Labor unions, professors, community organizations, parents, Civil Service

The focus is in the Legislature, since it is there that the budget will be voted on. Therefore, our actions will be directed there. We will continue to try to gain the support of the Chancellor and Trustees, but the campaign to defeat the hike will continue regardless of their THE BUDGET THE SUNY BOARD OF involvement. Already some of the Legislative leadership has expressed support of our

passing the buck, while still cutting back on the active involvement and support of all students. There will be a number of actions within the next few weeks, ultimately leading up to the March demonstration. These actions will be publicized.

We can not be fooled by the Governor's deception, nor intimidated by the Legislature. If the Trustees will not recognize their own interests, we must fight without them. United, we can defeat the increase and win the fight to defend public higher education. STUDENTS UNITE, FIGHT THE HIKE!



SUNY Chancellor Clifton Wharton said Tuesday that a lower
