The commissioner shall have the power and it shall be his duty to take all appropriate action including but not limited to the promulgation of orders, rules and regulations to provide for the maximum coordination and most efficacious utilization of the functions, employees, and facilities of the department and the Adirondack park agency now or hereafter available with respect to the Adirondack park as defined in this chapter, notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of any law.

§ 3. The opening paragraph of section eight hundred three of the executive law, as amended by chapter three hundred forty-eight of the laws of nineteen hundred seventy-three, is hereby amended to read as follows:

There is hereby created in the executive department, the Adirondack park agency, which shall be within the department of environmental conservation and which shall consist of the following members: the commissioner of environmental conservation, who shall be the chairman, the director of the office of planning services, the commissioner of commerce and eight members to be appointed by the governor by and with the advice and consent of the senate.

The governor shall designate a chairman from among the members
