STUDENT COUNCIL DISCUSSES INCREASE IN MEMBERSEIP AT LAST NEETING

The merbers of the student council have decided to enlarge the present membership or the counфil. At the presont wine there is only one representative fror each home-room. This makes a nembership of nine students on the council at this time. It was decided that one other person should be elected fron each home-roon. If a boy, was elected in the first part of the year, a girl will be elected for this new representative, and vice-versa. The new council representatives will be ushered into office on February 8.

At this meeting it was also decided to give out conduct tickets, as was done last year, for those students who refuse to obey the very few and simple rules that Milne High school has in effect. It seems some of the boys and girls are very unruly both in the homerooms, in the halls passing betveen classes, and also in the cafeteria
"We find the only way to make them behave is to give these tickets", Sara Kessler, a menber of the student council, said today. Those who receive tickets will be punished severely. This may seem a very childish method to some of our students, but we find it is the only solution to our problem.
